

#### 21st. Sunday of Ordinary Time August 27, 2023

"Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" With this question, Jesus invites his disciples into a deeper reflection not just about popular opinion, but more profoundly about their personal experiences and understanding. The world had its views on Jesus, some thought of Him as John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or one of the prophets. But in the all of these voices, it's Peter who proclaims the truth, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

Peter's proclamation wasn't just based on hearsay. It was a revelation from our Father in heaven. It was the fruit of a faith journey, an intimate relationship with the Lord, and divine grace. His answer was not academic but deeply personal.

Jesus' response to Peter is a testament to the significance of this revelation. He bestows upon him a name, 'Peter' meaning 'Rock,' signifying strength, foundation, and steadiness. Upon this rock, Jesus builds His Church. The 'keys of the kingdom of heaven' are entrusted to him. The image of the keys has deep biblical significance. It denotes authority, stewardship, and a role of guidance.

As a Priest, this Scripture reminds me of the weight and importance of the role of the Church in the world. It is a call for the Church to stand firm, rooted in Christ, against the gates of the underworld. It's a promise that, despite challenges and adversities, the Church will prevail. That was so evident to me last weekend during my installation at pastor of St. Mary, Mt. Vernon. As Bishop shared during his homily, "bishops, priests and deacons, can't do it alone."

It's a sober reminder of our human weaknesses. Peter, the very rock, would later deny Jesus. The story of Peter encourages all of us to reflect upon our fragility and the constant need for God's grace. It is only through a deep relationship with Christ, an openness to divine revelation, and humility that we can carry the keys entrusted to us and discern rightly.

In a world filled with countless voices and opinions about Christ, may we, like Peter, have the courage and grace to proclaim, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God," not just with our lips but with our lives. And may our faith be the rock upon which others can find a foundation in Christ.

#### **Dear Friends in Christ:**

I recently invited all the priests serving in the Belleville Diocese between the ages of 50 and 59 to meet together. There are, in fact, 16 of us (myself included at the age of 59) in that age group. In the end, twelve of us met at a rectory for a two-hour conversation. We represented different nations: four priests born in Nigeria, one from Uganda, one from Kenya, one born in Poland, and five from the United States. Two priests are members of religious communities, while ten belong to the diocese. We have been priests anywhere from three to thirty years.

We spoke comfortably, and at length about the challenges in our ministry, the sources of hope in our lives, and what we think might help promote vocations to the Catholic priesthood. After our conversation, we prayed Evening Prayer together.

All in all, it was one of the best sharing sessions with brother priests I have had. During the conversation, I mentioned that I had discovered fresh hope in ordaining a priest a year ago, ordaining 14 permanent deacons this past June, and presiding on two occasions of religious professions at the Poor Clare Monastery this year. But as I reflect on the "50-something" priest's meeting, I would add that afternoon to my list of sources of hope. When such a diverse group of priests can speak with trust and honesty about our lives and ministry, it gives me hope for our Presbyterate and our diocese.

That afternoon also gave me hope for the Synod of Bishops that our Holy Father Pope Francis will convene in Rome in October. What our group of "50-something" priests did in conversing is a model, I believe, for synodality. Listening to one another, reflecting openly and honestly, and praying together; these are all hallmarks of a synod.

My sincere intention is to convene other gatherings of our priests for such conversations, possibly during our Convocation of Priests the first week of October. In the meantime, pray for me and our priests, that the Lord may continue to introduce in our lives reasons for our hope.





All SMS parents are asked to work a shift at Autumn Fest as many volunteers are needed to make this fun event a success! Shift sign-ups will be coming out soon!


