

#### 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time October 15, 2023 Deacon Dan Laquet

We have heard a repeated cycle of parables from the Gospel of Matthew recently that all pertain to the salvation history of the world. Today is no exception, except that it compares the kingdom of God to a wedding feast instead of a vineyard. In today's parable, God is the king, and Jesus is the bridegroom, and the feast is the rewards of salvation and eternal life that Isaiah promises in our first reading. As we have talked about in the past few weeks, the Israelites are God's chosen people, the first to receive His covenant promises. They also represent the first to be invited to the wedding feast. God's prophets are the servants mentioned in the parable that go out and invite the Israelites to partake in God's promises. Many refuse God's invitation, and even go so far as to kill some of the prophets God sent. Due to their unfaithfulness, treatments of the prophets, and unwillingness to serve God in the way He desires, the Israelites are punished by having their city destroyed and conquered by foreign armies.

God is sending new servants now, Jesus' apostles, to all the nations of the world, making it clear that all are welcome to the feast. In God's great love and compassion, the apostles are to invite everyone, whether they are good or bad, Gentile or Jew, sinner or saint. The promise of salvation and eternal life is not just for the Israelites anymore. Everyone has been called to this great feast of the Church, and as Isaiah foretold, the wall that once divided Israel from all of the other nations will be brought down by the blood of Christ. God invites all of us to His kingdom. How we respond to His invitation is entirely up to us. God has given us free will to either accept or reject His call. The parable of the wedding feast reminds us that God desires us to wholeheartedly accept His invitation to salvation.

In today's responsorial Psalm, we sing of the Lord who led us to this feast. He has refreshed our souls in the waters of Baptism and spread the table before us in the Eucharist. In the rich bread of His body, and the choice wine of His blood, we are given a taste of the eternal banquet in the heavenly Jerusalem, where God has destroyed death forever. St. Paul tells us that in the glorious riches of Christ we will find that all of our needs are supplied. We will be able to do all things in Christ who strengthens us.

Lastly, we must ask ourselves, are we dressed for the feast? Are we clothed in the garment of righteousness that John speaks about in Revelation 19:8? Not all who have been called will be chosen for eternal life, as Jesus warns. We must be sure that we are living in a manner that glorifies God and deems us worthy of the invitation that we have received.






