FROM THE SEMINARIAN'S DESK Seminarian Luke Fitzgerald

As I was leaving the Navy and about to start my journey as a Seminarian, I had the pleasure of meeting Father Leo Patalinghug. If you have never heard of Father Leo, he a Catholic Priest who started his ministry in parishes in Maryland, eventually becoming a member of the Voluntas Dei (The Will of God). However, he is best known as the cooking priest because of his show "Plating Grace".

While Fr Leo is not the first person that I learned "Eucharist" means Thanksgiving, he was the one who made it stick. Now, because of Father Leo, every time I gather with my family for Thanksgiving, I find a way to mention to them that Eucharist means Thanksgiving and point the correlations between our dinner table and Jesus' dinner altar.

Over the years, it was the dinner table on Sunday night that really built the bonds that kept the family together, and how Sunday we gather as a Church to share in the One Bread and One Cup that joins us together as the One Church of Christ.

In my family, Dad was the chef and always had my sister by his side to help in cooking our feast while I would wash the dishes after dinner and my mom would dry and put them away. On Sunday the priest assists Jesus at the Altar as the bread and wine that are presented by a family become the Body Blood Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Then once everyone has experienced the presence of the Eucharist, I and the other servers assist in cleaning the altar. Through active participation, we are all brought together in a unique way where we are not merely ministered to but ministered with. Together as one, we present ourselves to the altar, where Jesus picks up or gift of self and returns it back as his whole self to feed and nourishes us.

There is something powerful and mysterious in sharing a meal with others, which is probably why God in all his Goodness has found it fitting to feed us not just any normal intimate meal but to take it a step further in the Eucharist. Where our eyes fail to understand, faith guides us in receiving the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is one of the greatest mysteries that we could hope to grasp. Currently, in that regard, the 5th and 6th grade class is learning about the Eucharist, and while the lessons that I have done or plan to teach are fine, the best teacher was taking them to Adoration in the chapel and letting Jesus teach the mystery that my words would fail to explain.

The lesson for me that day was to remember that the real teacher is Jesus, but for the students, they found a new peace and joy that words could not explain. That is the power of the Eucharist that we all can experience if we stop all the different distractions and put ourselves out there for God to do as He wills. So, this Thanksgiving, I challenge each of us to put ourselves out there, dive into the joy of the family, see just what God can do when we turn of the distractions for 30 minutes. And see if you can make it to a Thanksgiving Mass and thank God for the time and people that are in your life.

MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOP

Dear Friends in Christ:

In this month of November, we are mindful of the many opportunities we have to serve our brothers and sisters in their need. With the weather changing, we think of the homeless and people who lack the basic necessities to lead a decent, human life. What are the opportunities we have to make a difference in the lives of people living on the margins of society?

For instance, many Catholic parishes organize food pantries to assist those who may not have enough money to purchase food for an entire month. I think also of places like the Newman Center for Catholic students at Southern Illinois University at Carbondale. Last Thanksgiving, the Newman Center served 1,000 meals to people looking for help. I encourage our readers to find a way you can assist the hungry by providing food for the poor.

If you hear of a coat drive, take a few moments to look in your closet. Is there a coat that you can donate to help a person this winter? What about hats, scarves and gloves? Many of us may have surplus winter clothes; is there a simple way to donate items so that the poor have warm clothes to wear this winter?

Our Lord Jesus teaches us in the 25th Chapter of the Gospel of Matthew that what we do to assist the poor is tantamount to assisting Christ. But the Lord also teache's us that neglecting the poor will be judged as the equivalent of neglecting Christ. I've always found Matthew 25 to be a good reminder that to live as a disciple of Jesus, service to the poor is a daily commitment. In a particular way as your bishop, I find myself wanting to take the time to work more directly with the poor. I hope all of us reading this article will "take the time" to assist the poor this Thanksgiving and throughout the year.

Please know that you are in my daily prayers; please keep

me in yours.
