FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S DESK

Reverend Benny George

You are called to listen:

Month of January in the year has so much to offer. It leads us to new ventures and helps us to find something new for the future. For us Christians it started with the visit of the Wise men. They visited Jesus, Mary and Joseph at Bethlehem. They offered everything to Jesus and returned to their home. We find from the Scripture this week about Jesus as a grown up Man, the Son of God inviting people to follow him. Jesus is making a community for the future. They are called to walk with Him, learn from Him and even to do as He does.

Very often people ask, "How did you discern your call to be a Priest?" My response is that the call did not come on one day. When some people think of God's call, one of the ideas they have is like the story of Samuel or the disciples' encounter with God. So when they ask they expect to hear me talking about Samuel, Jonah or Peter like experience. My experience is such that I see God always working in my life and the lives of others in mysterious ways. He is not confined to any particular style of acting, but acts in different ways at different times in people's lives. Many of us can look back at our lives and see how the invisible hand of God took us through a certain direction to a destination that we are unsure of. When we listen He takes us to places where we will find fulfillment.

The entire Christmas season speaks about the art of listening and discerning. We read through the Scriptures about this great truth. Angeles coming to the Shepherds, Wise Men seeing the star and meeting Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Their returning home through another direction. Joseph going to Egypt to save Jesus. Simeon making the prophecy about Jesus in the temple. All these clearly express God's direction. So also when the disciples are selected by Jesus, we hear the invitation to listen. "I will make you fishers of men". The disciples understood their call and they left everything with a purpose and with a new decision in their life. We also can make a big difference in life by listening.

The Church is calling us today to celebrate the Word of God Sunday. On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis announced that the third Sunday in ordinary time be celebrated as "the Sunday of the Word of God". In hearing God's word the Church is built up and grows and in celebration God's Name is glorified among nations. May the Sunday of the Word of God help us to grow in religious and in intimate familiarity with the Sacred Scripture. Let us find time to read and reflect the Word of God and learn the direction God is giving to each of us. Let us make the Sacred Scripture sacred in our life.

MESSAGE FROM OUR BISHOP

Recently while flying on a plane, I was struck by the sight of numerous passengers trying to cram their bags into the overhead bins on the plane. The scene made me reflect about how often we try to take too much with us when we travel. My own preference is to "travel light." What does it look like for us to "travel light" in 2024? I suggest that we begin by letting go of some of the baggage we carry with us through life.

First, let's drop the grudges we hold against people. Many of us can hold a grudge for a long time. In some cases we might even forget the source of the grudge, yet we still cling to it. How much lighter we will feel if we let go of the grudge and allow ourselves to move on from the original upset.

Second, let's drop our feelings of envy toward others. Too frequently we can fixate on what we don't have rather than be grateful for what we do have. Instead we may concentrate on the blessings other people seem to have and lose sight of the blessings God has given us. Let's let go of envy and be more mindful of the presence and action of God in our lives.



 **Are you being called to be a Permanent Deacon?**

The Diocese of Belleville is hosting an informational meeting for men and their spouses interested in becoming Permanent Deacons. This meeting will take place on Saturday, February 3, 2024, at 10:00 AM in the Undercroft of the Cathedral of St. Peter, 200 W. Harrison Street, Belleville, IL 62220.

The Office of Permanent Deacon is considering starting a new class of aspirants in fall 2025. Eligibility is extended to men aged thirty-three to fifty-six by September 2025. Men older than fifty-six may still apply but require special approval from the Deacon Formation Office and the Bishop.

The formation process is a five-year commitment, including academic studies conducted by St. Meinrad School of Theology, spiritual direction, and learning about the deacon's role. Participants are required to attend a three-day meeting once per month over the course of the five year program. Interested individuals should first discuss their interest with their pastor. For those unable to attend the initial meeting, another session will be scheduled later. This meeting is an opportunity to learn about the process and requirements for becoming a Permanent Deacon in the Diocese.






