

"Are We There Yet?"

A Reflection for the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul John 21:15–19

How many of you, and be honest, have been on a

long trip and heard that immortal question: "Are we there yet?" Maybe it came from the back seat, or maybe, let's admit it, you asked it yourself. And if it's our kids or grandkids, the question slowly turns into a whine that could peel paint off the dashboard! We respond the same way every time: "We're getting there... it won't be long... just be quiet." Translation: "If I hear that one more time, we're turning around."

Now picture Peter in today's Gospel (John 21). He had walked with Jesus, seen miracles, denied Him three times, and wept bitterly. Now, face to face with the Risen Lord, Jesus asks him a familiar question, not once, but three times: "Do you love me?" And Peter, a little worn out, says again and again, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you." I can't help but think Peter was feeling a bit of that same frustration: "Lord, are we there vet?"

But Jesus wasn't just repeating Himself for no reason. Each time Peter answered, Jesus responded with a mission: "Feed my lambs. Tend my sheep. Feed my sheep." No map. No instructions. No finish line. Just a call. Peter didn't realize it yet, but in those three short commands, Jesus was giving him the greatest responsibility ever entrusted to a human being—to lead the Church after Jesus returned to the Father.

Peter's journey wasn't a short ride to Holiday World. His journey was long, hard, and full of sacrifice. "Are we there yet?" would take on a whole new meaning—because "there" wasn't comfort or ease. "There" was salvation.

And then there's Paul. *The firebrand!* The former persecutor turned preacher. The man who once dragged Christians into chains now preaching Christ to the ends of the earth. He and Peter were wildly different, Paul was bold and brilliant, Peter was pastoral and often a bit slow to catch on. They even argued! Paul called Peter out publicly when he thought he was being inconsistent. And yet, they remained united in the same mission. Paul would later call Peter one of the "pillars" of the Church.

They both died in Rome. Peter, crucified upside down. Paul, beheaded. They gave their lives for the same Lord, in the same city, and are remembered together on the same feast day. The early Church didn't see them as rivals. They were brothers, very different, but united in love for Jesus Christ.

So maybe this feast is a chance for us to ask a better question than, "Are we there yet?" Maybe we ask: "Am I on the road Jesus is calling me to?" "Am I feeding His sheep?" "Do I love Him enough to keep going, even when the road gets long?"

The journey isn't easy. But Peter and Paul didn't ask for easy, they asked to follow Jesus. And that's what made all the difference.






