MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Reverend Steven Pautler

"Midnight Texts and Holy Persistence..."

Let's be real. If a friend knocked on your door at midnight—scratch that, texted you at midnight, saying, "Hey, I ran out of bread, can you help me out?" most of us wouldn't even reply. Or we'd respond with something like, "There's a 24-hour gas station three blocks away... Godspeed." The idea of someone disturbing our sacred

sleep for sourdough sounds absurd today. We're more likely to ignore the message, turn our phone over, and say a prayer for their carb situation in the morning.

But back in Jesus' day? No QuickTrip. No DoorDash. No Walmart pickup. No "tap to reorder." If you were out of bread, you were really out of luck, unless you had a friend stubborn (or desperate) enough to knock until you got up, slippers and all

In Luke 11:1–13, Jesus shares a parable that fits this exact scenario. A man wakes up his neighbor in the middle of the night to ask for bread—not for himself, but for a guest. The poor guy inside groans (like any sane person would), muttering, "I'm in bed, the kids are asleep, I've got my comfy pants on, go away!" But eventually, he gets up—not out of neighborly love, but because of the man's persistence. He just won't stop knocking.

And that's the punchline. Jesus isn't just telling a quirky story, He's showing us what prayer should look like. Persistent. Bold. A little shameless. Like someone who won't take "no" (or "go away, I'm sleeping") for an answer.

God isn't annoyed by our repeated prayers. He doesn't roll His eyes and say, "What does she want now?" even if that's what we say when certain cousins text us after 11 PM. Instead, He welcomes it. He wants us to ask. To seek. To knock. And to keep knocking—not because He's hard of hearing, but because prayer changes us. It strengthens our trust, stretches our patience, and softens our hearts.

The Father isn't asleep. He's not bothered. He's not overwhelmed with requests. He's waiting—lovingly, patiently, and joyfully—for us to reach out. So the next time life hits you with a spiritual midnight emergency, don't hesitate. Go ahead and text Heaven. Knock loud and often. God always answers—even when the world is silent and the bread's all gone.

This week's question: Why do Catholics go to

Confession instead of just talking to God directly like my non-Catholic friends do?

Answer: This is one of the most common, and honest, questions Catholics get. Many of our non-Catholic friends say, "Why go to a priest? I confess directly to God." And yes, we should all speak directly to God and ask for forgiveness. But here's the Catholic kicker: Reconciliation isn't just about a private apology, it's about healing a relationship with God and the Church. In John 20:21-23, Jesus gave His apostles the authority to forgive sins. He didn't say, "Just keep it between you and Me." He breathed the Holy Spirit on them and said, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven." That's the foundation of the Sacrament. Confession isn't a man-made rule, it's a gift from Christ.

Saying our sins out loud takes humility. It's easy to gloss over sin in our minds, but when we name it aloud in the presence of a priest, we experience accountability and the grace of starting fresh. The priest, acting in the person of Christ, offers real absolution, and that's not just symbolic. It's sacramental. It's powerful. It's freeing. So yes, we talk to God directly, but in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God speaks back, with mercy we can actually hear.
