





### MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

**Reverend Steve Pautler** 

#### Smartest Bet You'll Ever Make!

How many of you like a good wager? We bet on sports, we bet on card games, some of us even bet on whether the Cardinals will ever make the playoffs again. Blaise Pascal, a French philosopher, made one of the boldest bets of all time. He said, "If you believe

in God and He exists, you win everything. If He doesn't exist, you lose almost nothing. If you don't believe and He does exist, well, you've lost it all." Now that's high-stakes poker, eternal style!

The Gospel today lays that wager out in living color. Jesus tells the story of the rich man and poor Lazarus. One lived in luxury, the other longed-for scraps. One was clothed in purple robes, the other in sores. And in the end? Their fortunes were flipped. Eternal life wasn't about fine dining or sharp outfits; it was about mercy. I think about that every time I pass someone sitting on a park bench, riding a bike with everything they own in a backpack, or sleeping on the steps of a church. When I was assigned at the Cathedral of St. Peter, it wasn't unusual to find five or six folks sleeping under the east portico before the 6:45 a.m. Mass. At first, I wasn't sure what to do. Do I step over them like the rich man walked past Lazarus? Or do I at least stop, smile, hand over a granola bar, and maybe even a bottle of water? My theology books didn't cover that one.

Let's be honest, it's uncomfortable. Sometimes it feels risky. Sometimes it even feels a little crazy. Mental illness, addiction, or just plain awkwardness make us hesitate. But today Jesus reminds us that heaven's doors aren't measured by comfort. They're measured by mercy.

Sometimes the smallest acts feel like they hardly matter. One smile, one "good morning," one granola bar. Yet in God's economy those little moments add up to eternity. The rich man wasn't condemned for wearing purple robes. He was condemned for ignoring the man on his doorstep. Mercy doesn't ask for grand gestures. It asks for open eyes and a willing heart.

And mercy doesn't always mean solving every problem. Sometimes it's as simple as noticing, smiling, handing over a snack, or offering a kind word. Sometimes it's daring to treat the Lazarus in our path not as an inconvenience, but as a brother or sister. Pascal would say that's a smart bet. You give up a granola bar and maybe a minute of your time. But you gain the joy of knowing you've stepped into God's mercy. And who knows? Maybe you'll find yourself someday in heaven, welcomed by the very person you once greeted with a smile. *That's a wager I'm willing to take*.

#### This week's question:

The other day at work, someone asked me if I was saved. How do I answer?

#### **Answer:**

Smile and say, "I am being saved." Catholics see salvation not as a one -time "I checked the box" event, but as a lifelong adventure with Jesus. He saved us on the Cross, He claimed us at Baptism, and He keeps drawing us closer through faith, the sacraments, and daily choices. Salvation isn't a single moment, it's a journey with Christ, and He walks every step with us.
