

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Father Steven Pautler

"Rust Happens, Faith Endures"

How many of you remember your first car? Maybe it was a faded Chevy Nova with more rust than paint. Maybe a hand-me-down Ford that rattled like a coffee can full of marbles. Or, if you were one of the lucky ones, maybe Mom and Dad surprised you with something shiny and new, still smelling of that famous "new car" scent that can only be described as a mix of heaven and plastic.

No matter how we got it, that first car was our ticket to freedom. Suddenly, we weren't waiting for rides or begging for permission. We were off—windows down, radio up, wind in our hair, and maybe a milkshake in the cupholder (that we were absolutely not supposed to spill). We washed it every weekend, vacuumed it, waxed it, and parked it far away from anyone who might even think about opening a door too wide.

That car meant everything. It was our pride and joy. But it didn't take long before the shine faded. The first dent showed up—usually "not our fault." The air conditioner stopped blowing cold air. And that little rattle in the engine started to sound like an angry bee. Before long, we found ourselves looking at that once-beloved car and realizing it wasn't as perfect as we once thought.

That's a bit like what's happening in today's Gospel. Jesus and His disciples are standing before the grand Temple in Jerusalem, a structure so magnificent that it took decades to build. People were pointing out its beauty, the stones, the decorations, the craftsmanship. It was their pride and joy, the very center of their faith and national identity. Then Jesus hits them with this: "All that you see here, the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another." Talk about a conversation killer.

The disciples are stunned. The Temple was like their first car, something they cherished, something they thought would last forever. Yet Jesus reminds them that even the most beautiful, secure, and seemingly permanent things in life fade away. Not because they're bad, but because they aren't meant to last forever.

We can relate. Life is full of things that look solid: our homes, our jobs, our health, our routines. We put so much trust in them that when something shakes, an illness, a financial setback, or simply the passing of time, it feels like our world is falling apart. Jesus isn't trying to scare us. He's trying to re-center us.

He says, in essence, "Don't build your life around things that rust, break down, or lose value. Build your life on me." Think of it this way: Our faith is the real engine that keeps us going, not the shiny car that everyone sees. The Gospel is our GPS, keeping us on the road when the world tries to send us on detours. Prayer is our fuel. And every time we love, forgive, or show mercy, we're giving our faith a tune-up.

Now, Jesus doesn't sugarcoat what the road of faith looks like. He says there will be wars, earthquakes, persecution, even betrayal. He doesn't promise smooth highways. But He does promise this: "Not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

So maybe this week, as you drive around town, whether it's in a car that sparkles or one held together by duct tape, remember the lesson of that first set of wheels. It wasn't about the car. It was about the journey. And our journey with Christ is the same. else falls apart. So buckle up, keep your eyes on the road, and don't forget who's driving. After all, faith isn't about having a perfect car, it's about trusting the One who knows where we're going.


