

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Father Steven Pautler

"When the Night Gets Loud, Stay Awake for Christ."

Night can turn the bravest soul into a jumpy rookie. You wake from a dead sleep because something went bump in the dark. You lie there in heroic silence while your mind is already writing your obituary. Then your Ring chimes and your heart jumps, only for you to discover a skunk wandering across the porch like it owns the place. We tell ourselves we are calm. We know better.

Truth is, nighttime pokes our defenses. A few weeks ago someone threw a rock through the windows at St. Mary in Centralia. The first thing we said was more cameras. More locks. More lights. That instinct sits in every one of us. We know all about the things that slip in without warning. The scammer who swears the IRS is sending a patrol car. The ridiculous virus that shows up on a computer that has never touched the internet. The family member who borrows your drill and returns something that looks like it survived a tornado. These little ambushes wear us down.

Night has a way of making everything louder. A creak turns into a crisis. A thump turns into a full investigation. Even the cat sneezing can send us into a prayer that ends with Lord take me now. We laugh about it in the morning, but in the moment we feel exposed. Vulnerable. A little too aware of the things we do not control.

Matthew gives us the real version of this on the First Sunday of Advent. Jesus points back to the days of Noah. People carried on with normal life. They ate. They married. They planned. They lived as if tomorrow was guaranteed. Then the flood came. It was sudden, not dramatic. Not loud. Sudden. Jesus says His return will be the same. Not announced with a Ring notification. Not telegraphed by the sound of a raccoon knocking over the trash can at midnight. He arrives at an hour we do not expect.

Advent steps into that space. Jesus knows how easily fear pushes us into frantic living. He gives us a steadier path. He tells us to be awake, not worried. Ready, not rattled. The world keeps throwing its little surprises. The broken window. The scam call. The friend who borrows your jumper cables and returns a tangled mess you swear is a modern art project. All of it reminds us how fragile life feels.

Christ answers with a promise. He steps toward us every day. He draws near through the sacraments. He strengthens us in quiet prayer. He meets us in the ordinary tasks that fill our hours. Advent teaches us to look for Him with clear eyes and a steady spirit. One honest step at a time.

Answer:

*You're in good company. The Church's
liturgical calendar says Advent is a time
of waiting, and Christmas begins on
December 25 and lasts until the Bap-
tism of the Lord. But there's no sin in a
little early sparkle. If your tree helps
you reflect on hope and joy, go for it.
Maybe keep one thing, like the Baby
Jesus from your Nativity, off display
until Christmas Eve. That way your
heart keeps the waiting even if your
living room looks ready for Bethlehem. .*




