



Embracing Uncertainty Dear Friends in Christ,


Over the course of our lives, many of us experience uncertainty. We may feel uncertain about how we fit into our families, our school community or the workplace. We may experience anxiety because we are uncertain about our future, our health or our relationships. As we begin a new civil year, while we do not know what the future holds, we know WHO holds the future: our loving God. May I suggest that when we are trying to cope with uncertainty, that we let our faith see us through. Here are some suggestions about how we can embrace uncertainty and step into our future with confidence.

First, we must accept the fact that we do not have complete control over what happens in our lives. A Jesuit spiritual director told me years ago that people should focus on what they do have, rather than fixate on what they don't have. Similarly, I think we need to assess what we can control and let go of our worries about what we cannot control. Everyone experiences uncertainty at various points in life. The important thing is to avoid thinking of the worst scenarios and be led by the hope of what may turn out well. Second, we need healthy ways to deal with the feelings that uncertainty can stir up inside of us. Healthy ways of coping include praying, exercising, taking a walk, talking with a friend, sleeping, eating a healthy diet or listening to music. Prayer is definitely a good way to respond because communion with God reminds me that I do not face my uncertainties alone. It is important to avoid unhealthy ways of coping, and instead develop good habits that build up our sense of confidence and hope. Third, we need to accept support as we face our uncertainties. God did not create human beings for isolation but for community. Through all the seasons of life, we need social support. Recently, when I attended a funeral, the woman who was widowed commented on the number of friends and neighbors who attended the visitation. The woman described how during that evening she experienced "the comfort of old friends." That is a good way to describe the support she received. Our formative years are fast paced, but it is important to take the time to build bonds with people. Take the time to support others in their moments of difficulty and don't hesitate to let others know if we are needing support. The words of scripture remind us over and over again that God has God and share with him the uncertainties that weight us down. Let us ask the Lord for the experience of his closeness that we may move forward in hope. May God who has begun such a great work in us, bring it to completion.

Many of us have chosen to use cell phones and email to communicate. Over the past five years the number of landlines continue to decline. The days of the household phone are gone, replaced by individual phones that fit into our pockets.

St. Mary and St. Lawrence Parishes have joined an exciting service that is endorsed by the Belleville Diocese called, flocknote. This texting and email service will pro-vide a direct link when important information that needs to be announced. You can join different groups. For exam-ple, join the "Prayer Warriors, and receive a text when someone requests special prayers. You can join the Monday Bible Study Group, and receive updates about gatherings and cancelations. Join the Altar Society, Quilting Ladies, PTO, Knights of Columbus, Finance Council or Pasto-ral Council groups and you will be notified of upcoming events, meetings and cancelations. By signing up you will automatically be placed into the general group for St. Mary or St. Lawrence Parishes. In the event that Mass is canceled due to weather or illness there would be no need to leave your home, you will receive a text message.

There is no cost to you to sign-up. You may sign-up for both parishes, and non-parishioners who wish to receive updates are welcomed to join. It's so easy to join! Using your cell phone just send a text to 84576. In the message line type: ORPHANS for St. Mary and BLACKHAWKS for St. Lawrence and follow the directions. (has nothing to do with the sports teams it just easy to remember) How easy is that? Hope you sign-up for this important communication tool. 
2ND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME Sunday, January 15, 2023

In a 3rd Serving of Chicken Soup for the Soul, there is a story about a student who was unlike most students. One day in the 11th grade he went into a classroom to wait for a friend. The teacher appeared and asked him to go to the blackboard. He re-plied, "I'm not one of your students." The teacher said, "Doesn't matter. Go to the board anyhow." The student told him he couldn't do that and when the teacher asked "why not?" the student told him he had a learning disability. The teacher came over to the student and said, "Don't ever say that again. Someone's opinion of you does not have to be become your reality." It became a liberating moment for the student, a time of great learning. The teacher, Mr. Washington, became the student's mentor. Later that school year Mr. Washington addressed the graduating seniors. And in his speech he said, "You have great-ness within you You can touch millions of people's lives." After the speech the student went up to Mr. Washington and asked him if he had greatness within him. The teacher replied, "Yes, Mr. Brown, you do." The student thanked him and told him that one day he would make the teacher proud. In his senior year it happened that Brown was placed in Mr. Washington's speech and drama class. Although Brown was a special education student, the principal realized that this would be a good match up. Mr. Washington gave Brown a larger vision of himself. While other teachers passed Brown from class to class, Mr. Washington made more demands of him. He made him accountable. He enabled him to believe in himself. Years later the famous, Les Brown, produced five specials on public television. Mr. Washington saw the program and called Les Brown to tell him how proud he was of his achievement.

When others believe in us we gain confidence in ourselves and are able to do great things. Naturally, we still have to apply ourselves. Les Brown had to work hard to finish high school. But, he was now motivated to learn. Our children need to hear from us that we believe in them. Our students, who could be friends, relatives, or co-workers will be motivated to aspire to greater things when we believe






