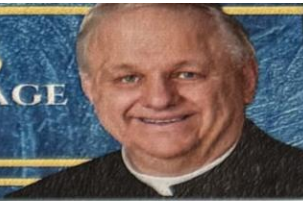

# FATHER STEVE'S WEEKLY REFLECTION & MESSAGE

*Watching the Road. Guarding the Flock.  
Living the Shepherd's Heart!*



Every one of us carries a bit of the Good Shepherd in our bones. You see it on a Monday morning when that school bus stops and traffic slows. Some folks stop a little farther back than needed, almost like they are guarding the moment. No one taught them that in driver's ed. That comes from somewhere deeper. It is the instinct to protect, to notice, to care.

Parents and grandparents take it to another level. Somewhere along the way they develop eyesight that would impress an eagle. They can spot trouble from across the yard, behind a tree, or three houses down. At recess at St. Mary School, I try to walk that same line. One minute I am laughing with the kids, the next I am scanning the playground like a sentry. A good shepherd knows his flock. He knows the ones who drift. He knows the ones who stir things up. He knows the ones who stay steady. It is not about control. It is about care.

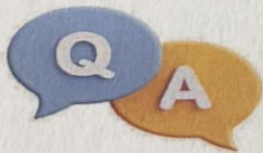
Jesus says in John's Gospel that the shepherd knows his sheep and calls them by name. That line matters. This is not crowd management. This is personal. The shepherd is not guessing. He is not distant. He is close enough to notice.

Then life turns, as it always does. The ones who watched over us begin to lean on us. I saw it with my mom. After retirement she lived in a duplex. On the other side was her lifelong friend LaVerne. Both had buried their husbands. Each morning began the same way. A call or a knock. You up. You okay. It was simple. It was faithful. It was shepherding.

That is how this Gospel lands. Jesus is not talking about a job. He is revealing a way of living. The Good Shepherd does not clock out. He stays near. He protects. He calls. He leads. He gives peace, steady guidance, and a quiet strength when fear tries to take hold.

And here is the quiet truth. We are all in both places. At times we are the sheep who need to hear our name. At other times we are the ones watching the road, scanning the playground, making the call next door.

So pay attention to those small moments. Stopping the car. Watching the yard. Making the call. Those are not small at all. That is the voice of the Good Shepherd echoing through an ordinary day, shaping hearts, forming habits, and quietly drawing us closer to him.



## **Will the Pope come for the bishop's ordination. And why is he being ordained again?**

*Answered by Father Steven Pautler*

The Pope makes the call, but he does not usually make the trip. The ordination happens locally with other bishops. And yes, he is already a priest, so no one is starting over. Holy Orders has three levels, and becoming a bishop is the next step. It is like moving from one responsibility to a much bigger one overnight. On that day, hands are laid on him, prayers are said, and he receives the signs of his office. And yes, that chair we talked about will finally have someone sitting in it again. It will be a full church and a big day!

## **Fourth Week of Easter**

On the Fourth Sunday of Easter we reflect on the Paschal Mystery more deeply. Psalm 118 says, "The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." Peter quotes this psalm in preaching that the crippled man was healed, "in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead." In John's Gospel, Jesus tells us, "A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep."

The first readings this week continue the story of the growth of the community, through the Acts of the Apostles.

For the gospels this week, we read from John's Gospel, chapters 10, 12, 13 and 14 - all emphasizing who Jesus is - from the Father and one with the Father. He has come to bring us light and life. He promises us that he is the gate, the way to life. And, he assures us that if we make our home in him, he will be in us, and we will thereby be one with Jesus and the Father. He says, "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved." "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." "Whoever believes in me believes not only in me but also in the one who sent me, and whoever sees me sees the one who sent me." "From now on I am telling you before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe that I AM." "Do not let your hearts be troubled." "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." "If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."

All of this leads us to the Fifth Sunday of Easter where in the gospel, we hear Jesus console us, asking us to not let our hearts be troubled because he goes only to prepare a place for us and that "No one comes to the Father except through me."

## **Daily Prayer This Week**

This is potentially a powerful week for entering into how available Jesus is for us. He promises to be with us, to make us one with him, even to make his home in us. He promises to keep us safe and to bring us to our true home to be with him forever. The opportunity we have this week is to accept this offer of deepening our relationship with our Lord. We accept it if we let his availability to us soak more and more deeply into our consciousness each day. We do this by beginning each day focusing our first thoughts of the day in a simple recognition that we are not alone: "Thank you for this day, Lord. I know you want to stay close to me, to guide me and support me today. I need some real strength and courage to face some of the challenges of this day. Help me to keep connecting with you throughout this day, to remember your presence and love." This 20 second prayer will open our day to a Lord who invites us surrender our troubles to him.

At various times of the day - especially when we approach a particularly challenging responsibility, or an occasion or situation in which we habitually lose our peace or give in to temptation - we can be renewed by another 20 second prayer. Each time we turn to the Lord, our "moment of connection" can become more specific, more intimate, and more confident.

If we find ourselves sidetracked and distracted all day, or for several days, it is easy to get right back on track by pausing, while doing almost anything, and asking our Lord to remind us of his constant presence. We will quickly return to a sense that Jesus knows us, understands us, and wants to be with us in whatever troubles our hearts. And, each night, when we give thanks to our Lord for his fidelity to us throughout the day, we will be given the grace to know, again, that we are never alone.

We are rejoicing in this Easter season and asking God to shower us with the light of salvation that John's Gospel refers to so often. Even now, weeks after Easter, we rejoice!

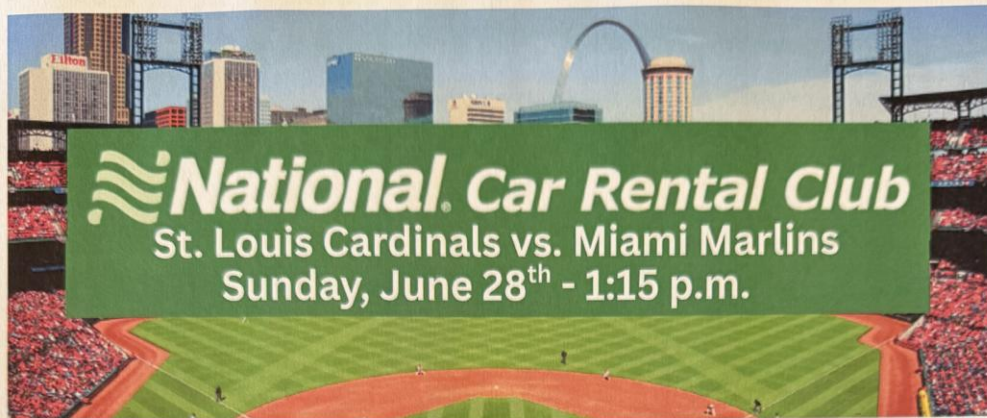

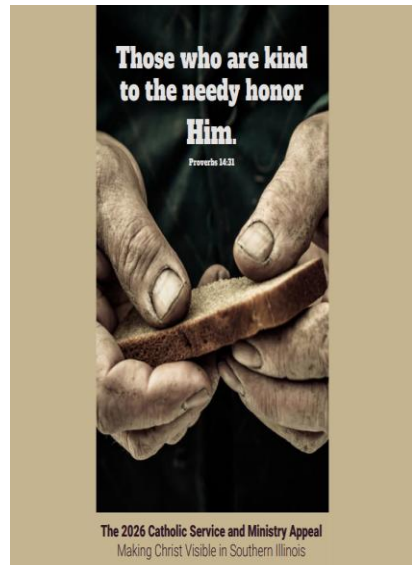
