MOTHER'S DAY – MAY 10, 2026 – FATHER'S DAY – JUNE 21, 2026



There has been a real energy in the air these past few days. If you did not feel it, you might want to check your pulse. The talk around town has been the installation of our new bishop, Most Reverend Godfrey Mullen, OSB. Father Deva and I had the privilege of being there for Vespers the night before and for the ordination itself. It was something to see. Nearly thirty bishops and cardinals, close to two hundred priests, deacons, and religious, and about fifteen hundred faithful gathered together. That is a lot of collars and a lot of prayers in one place.

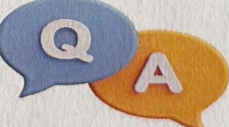
One moment always stands out at an ordination. The man about to be ordained lies flat on the floor. Face down. No spotlight. No applause. Just silence and surrender. Then the *Litany of the Saints* begins, and the whole Church calls on heaven. If you ever wonder what trust in God looks like, there it is. A grown man on the floor, saying without words, "Lord, I am yours." It is humbling. It is powerful. It keeps a priest honest.

Now we hear Jesus say in **John 14:15-21**, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." He does not say, "If you love me, you will have warm feelings once in a while." He is talking about action. Real life. Daily choices. And then He promises something even better. He will not leave us orphans. He sends the Advocate. The Holy Spirit.

We are getting a preview of that gift. Pentecost is right around the corner, but the Spirit is already moving. Look around. Confirmations, First Communions, ordinations, graduations. April and May have turned into a full sprint. I feel like I need a calendar just to keep track of my calendar. Somewhere in there I think I am supposed to eat and sleep.

But here is the point. All of this activity means nothing if we miss the Spirit behind it. The same Spirit who strengthened a man lying on the cathedral floor is given to each of us. Not for show. Not for one day. For everyday life.

So open your mind. Open your heart. Let the Holy Spirit do His work. And if you are wondering what that looks like, start simple. Be patient with someone who tests you. Say a prayer when you would rather complain. Choose what is right when no one is watching. Love Christ. Keep His commandments. And trust me, the Holy Spirit will take care of the rest.



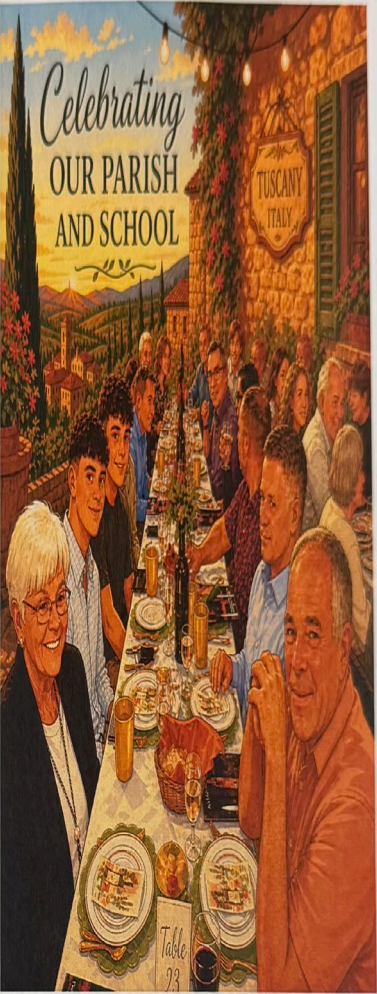
I attended Vespers the evening before Bishop Mullen's ordination. It was my first time. What is Vespers, and is this something new??

Answered by Father Steven Pautler

Vespers is not new. It is ancient. Older than your parish hall and still going strong. It comes from the Liturgy of the Hours, the daily prayer of the Church prayed all over the world.

It is the Church's evening prayer. Psalms are sung, Scripture is proclaimed, and Mary's Magnificat closes the night. She always gets the last word, and no one argues with that. It feels new since most parishes do not pull it out very often. So when you walk into Vespers, it feels like you found a hidden room in the Church. Same house. Just a door most people forget to open.

At an ordination, it sets the tone. Before the big moment, the Church slows down, lowers the volume, and prays. You did not attend something new. You stepped into something time tested, simple, and steady. And now you know a little secret of the Church.

Sixth Week of Easter

On the Sixth Sunday of Easter, we hear the incredibly comforting news from Jesus in John’s Gospel: “I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you” as he promised to send the Advocate, the Spirit of Truth to us.

Thursday is the Feast of St. Mathias, Apostle.

During the weekday readings, we learn of the work of the early disciples, emboldened by all they have seen, who preach and baptize and spread the good news. Paul has a vision of the Lord saying “Do not be afraid. Go on speaking and do not be silenced for I am with you.” In the Gospels we are with Jesus, bidding us his farewell, in the Fourth Gospel. The reason we can be assured, after he leaves us, is that he and the Father are one. So, we can ask for anything, and the Father will give it to us. The Psalm responses all week are joyful in this Easter season:

The Lord takes delight in his people.

Your right hand saves me.

Heaven & earth are full of your glory.

At the end of the week, the Seventh Sunday of Easter sets the tone for the following Sunday’s Pentecost as we read in Acts of the Apostles of Mary, the Apostles and other followers waiting in the upper room after the Ascension. In John’s Gospel, Jesus prays to the Father, claiming us as his own: “I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me.” In many countries, The Feast of the Ascension is celebrated on this Sunday.

Daily Prayer This Week

This is a great week to try to live in the promise of Jesus that we don’t need to let our hearts be troubled. We can trust. He will not leave us on our own. We can prepare for the coming feast of Pentecost by letting the Holy Spirit console us and gather us.

But, what if I do have some troubles and worries? We can talk with our Lord about our desires regarding those anxieties and difficulties in the background moments of our life each day. For example, when I wake up, I can take a moment, while still at my bedside, letting myself name the struggles I will face that day, and simply asking the Lord to give me the graces I need today. That can take less than a minute, or 30 seconds, as the week goes on. In the shower, and while getting dressed, I can flesh out that desire.

O Lord, you know this is just tying me up in knots. I haven’t slept well for a while and I feel so bad for snapping at my family last night. The specific grace I ask for today is to be calmed by your Spirit, and to place my trust in you. Give me the grace I need to not surrender my peace so easily.

O Lord, my spouse is really so angry and tight, and it seems we are just driving our teenager farther and farther from us, in rebellion. I don’t know what to do. I’m responding to both of them badly. Today, let me focus on your love for me, so that I can be peaceful and calm in trying once more to calm the angry seas with simple love, with gentle affirmation, and patience that is a gift of your Spirit.

And, throughout the day, we can find moments -walking from one place to another, reaching for the phone, opening a jar of something, walking down a shopping aisle at the store, filling the car with gas - when all of this will come back and we can renew our trust in the Lord’s promise. Especially, when we go to bed each night, we can give thanks, that we were not alone this day.

The Sprehe Scholarship Trust is pleased to announce the selection of one active member of St. Mary Catholic Church, Centralia, Illinois to receive a scholarship.

Devin Meier, the recipient of a Ralph Sprehe Memorial Scholarship, was awarded a 4-year comprehensive scholarship. Two years to first be completed at Kaskaskia College and the second two years at a university of choice. This scholarship will cover tuition, books, fees, etc. The value of the scholarship will be evaluated each year.



Manuela Maco and Logan Meier will begin their 3rd year of their Comprehensive Sprehe Scholarship during the Fall 2026 semester.



The Sprehe Scholarship Trust was established by a generous gift from Ralph and Bernice Sprehe in 1998 to assist parishioners of St. Mary Catholic Church in obtaining a college education at Kaskaskia College. The gift was placed in trust and is managed by the Springfield Branch of the US Bank Wealth Management. The purpose of the Trust is to serve as a perpetual endowment to assist current and future generations of St. Mary Catholic Church parishioners in attending Kaskaskia College by full payment of their tuition for four consecutive semesters.



Mr. Sprehe expanded the scope of Trust in 2002 by amending the Trust Agreement to include an additional category of baccalaureate scholarships. 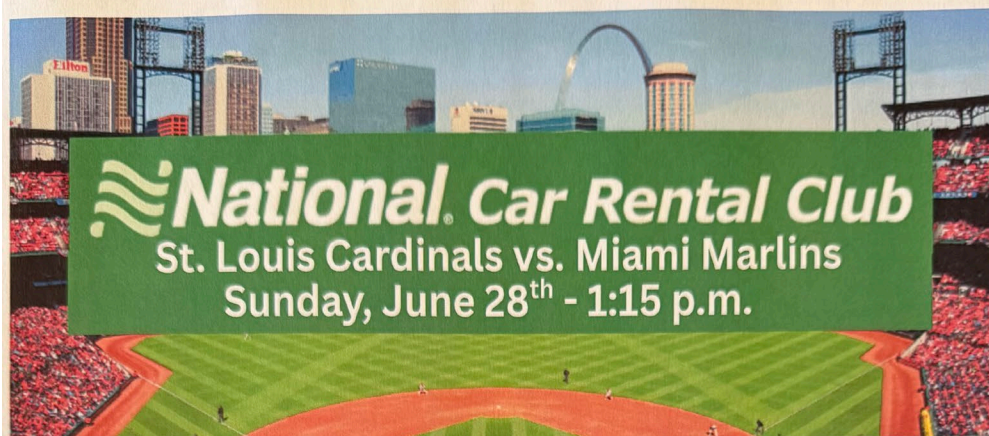

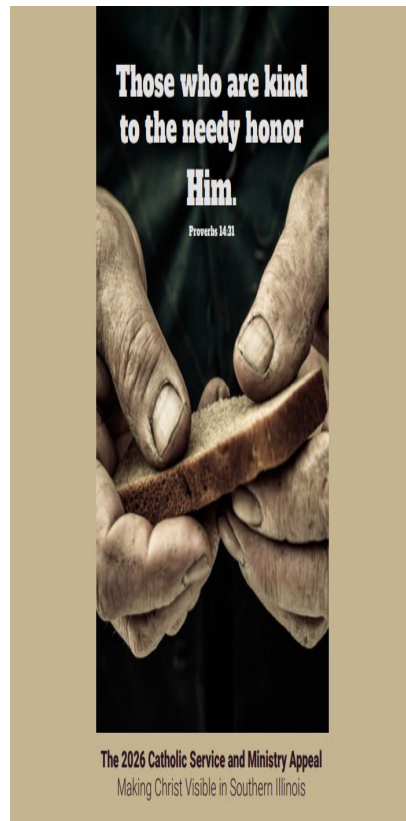

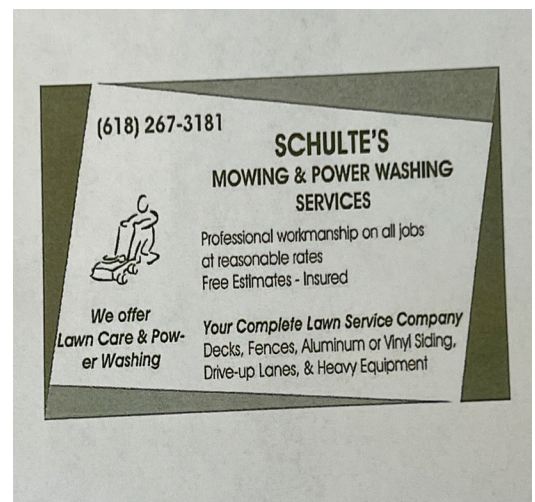
