The doors were locked. Fear filled the room. The apostles had seen the crucifixion. They had watched hope nailed to a cross. Even after hearing whispers of the resurrection, they still hid in uncertainty. Then suddenly, in the midst of their fear, Jesus stood among them and said, “Peace be with you.” In today’s Gospel from John 20:19-23, the risen Lord breathes upon them and gives them the Holy Spirit. In that moment, frightened men became courageous witnesses. Pentecost changed everything.

Over these past weeks since Easter, we have celebrated the risen Lord. We have watched the world around us come alive again. Winter slowly faded away. Trees turned green. Flowers opened their petals toward the sun. Fields of winter wheat began turning golden across our countryside. There is something peaceful and reassuring about this season of the year. Creation itself seems to proclaim resurrection.

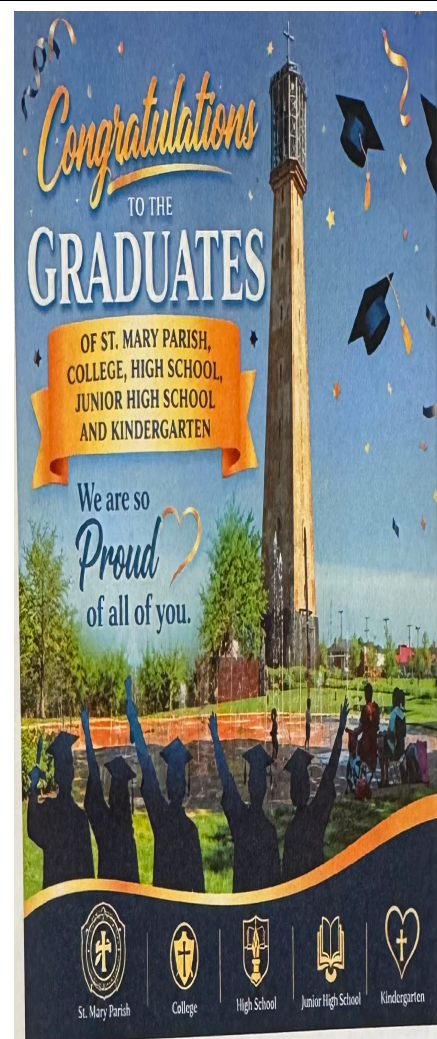
At the same time, life becomes busy. Graduations fill our calendars. Confirmations and First Holy Communion celebrations bring joy to our parishes and families. Ballgames, summer activities, vacations, cookouts, and long evenings begin to crowd the schedule. Children look forward to sleeping in a little longer and enjoying the freedom of summer days. Parents and grandparents do their best to keep everything balanced. Priests try to keep pace too. Some days it feels like life moves faster than we would prefer.

Yet Pentecost arrives right in the middle of all that movement and noise. The Holy Spirit enters not into perfect silence, but into ordinary human life. The apostles were not sitting peacefully beside a lake with nothing to do. They were worried, uncertain, and overwhelmed. That is exactly where the Holy Spirit found them. The same Spirit finds us today.

Pentecost reminds us that faith is not simply about surviving life. It is about living with courage and purpose. The Holy Spirit gives strength when we are tired. The Holy Spirit gives patience when life becomes demanding. The Holy Spirit gives wisdom when decisions weigh heavily upon us. The Holy Spirit gives courage to speak kindly, forgive freely, and continue forward when life feels difficult. God never asks us to carry life alone. Christ still stands among us saying, **“Peace be with you.”**

Father, with all the responsibilities and demands that come with parish life, how do you personally handle the everyday stress of being a pastor?

People often think parish life is peaceful and quiet. Some days it is. Other days it feels like juggling flaming casseroles at a church picnic. The stress is real because people come with grief, joy, problems, weddings, funerals, school concerns, finances, and everything in between. Priests are only human. We get tired, worried, and overwhelmed like everyone else. I handle it by trying to keep prayer first, laughter close by, and perspective grounded. I remind myself that this is Christ’s Church, not mine. A quiet church at the end of the day, or hearing children laugh after Mass, has a way of calming the soul.

Pentecost Sunday

Sunday is Pentecost Sunday, as the readings and the whole Church celebrate the coming and ongoing presence of the Holy Spirit among us. Jesus breathes on his jittery followers and tells them, "Peace be with you" and fills them with courage.

Monday is the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church. Tuesday is the Memorial of St. Philip Neri, priest.

During the week, Mark's Gospel offers us stories about sacrificing part of ourselves. We hear of the Rich Young Man: "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement, his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions. Peter tells Jesus, "We have given up everything and followed you." Jesus responds, "there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the Gospel who will not receive a hundred times more." When the disciples squabble over who will sit in glory with Jesus, he tells them, "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Bartimaeus, a blind man recognizes Jesus as "Son of David" and is healed. Bartimaeus follows Jesus.

This week ends with the feast of the Most Holy Trinity.

Daily Prayer This Week

Pentecost, and our being renewed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, comes at the end of the Easter Season, but as the birthday of the Church, it is a fitting beginning to our return to Ordinary Time. We can continue to ask that the Holy Spirit come into our hearts, to enkindle within us the fire of the Spirit's Love. We can continue to ask that we be able to join the Spirit in our taking up our role in renewing the face of the earth. It is so appropriate that this takes us to remembering that Mary is the Mother of the Church, our mother in this Spirit-filled process of being Church together. We can ask Mary to place us with her Son this week.

We might find ourselves struggling with something or someone, here or there this week. We can turn to Jesus, in those little conversations, and feel the gift of his Spirit freeing us - as the Spirit always does - and enkindling a fire within us, which is always purifying and which always stirs love in our heart. These exercises of trust and renewal will refresh us in the times that tempt us to give in to what is cold and hard and dark. We can acknowledge the presence of the Spirit, the moment I turn for help and light and direction. And, in those moments, we can give thanks and embrace the gift.

Finally, we can let ourselves look for people in our lives, on our paths, who need comforting and the warmth of the Spirit to heal them and offer them peace. I can express my desire, "Lord, I so desire to be an instrument of your Spirit's peace and a channel for reconciliation and healing." The Spirit will respond when we pray with that openness and desire.
