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PRACTICING CATHOLIC

Wonder, Don’t Wander

My daughter recently asked me if it’s okay to “wonder if all the Jesus stuff is true.”

I wasn’t surprised by her question. I’ve expected it, in fact. If you’re raising a child to be a critical thinker, you don’t want them to accept everything you tell them simply because it comes from your lips. I have promised my children that I will always give them the truth about God. But that’s all I can do — give it to them. Whether or not they accept it, ultimately, is their own choice.

“I know it’s true,” she told me. “But sometimes it just all sounds so...unbelievable.”

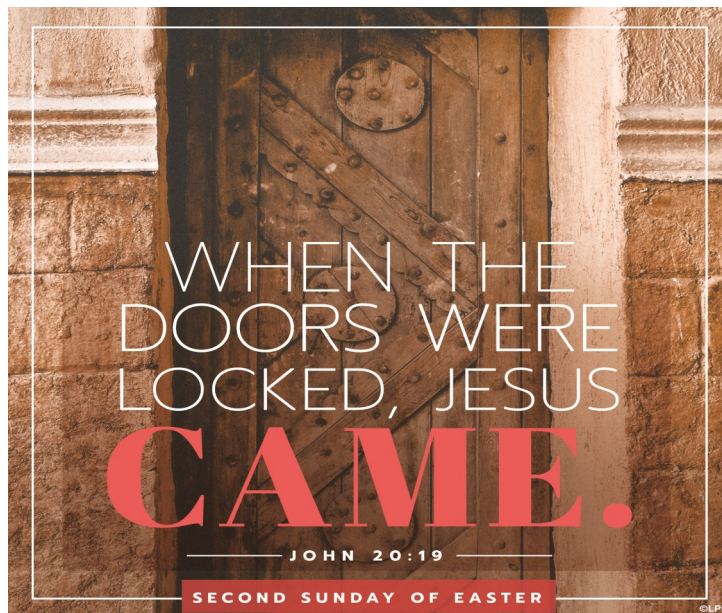
She’s not wrong. It *does* sound unbelievable that an all-powerful God could create us for no reason other than sheer love, that He could be generous enough to give us free will to accept that love, that he could be merciful enough not to destroy us when we reject that love, and finally that he could be faithful enough in that love to become flesh and die in order to save us from the consequences of our own poor choices.

But lots of things are unbelievable. That doesn’t mean they’re not true.

When Jesus says, “Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed,” he isn’t calling Thomas a fool for questioning something that sounds a little outrageous. He’s just highlighting the fact that Thomas is afforded a luxury that none of the Christians born after him, my daughter included, will have: he gets to see proof with his own eyes.

I told my daughter it’s fine to wonder — just don’t wander. Take Thomas’ example. Stay close to the people you trust. Return to the warmth of the upper room. Be willing to recognize Jesus when he’s in front of you. Never be afraid to believe.

Inspiration for the week

Thomas needed proof to believe the amazing things that had happened. God, in His mercy, gave him that proof — but it was up to Thomas to accept it. Do we accept the proof we see of God’s love every day?

In the aftermath of Jesus’ resurrection, the Apostles performed “many signs and wonders,” healing the sick and exorcising unclean spirits. Is there something in your life that needs healing?

2nd Reading Question:

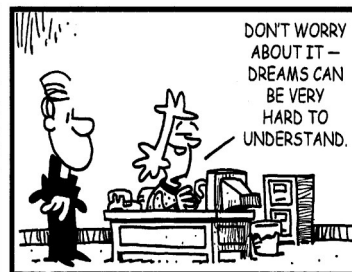
John is initially frightened at the strange vision of Jesus, but Jesus reassures him, “Do not be afraid.” How does Jesus calm your fears?

Gospel:

The resurrected Jesus’ first words to his disciples are “Peace be with you.” How could you be a peacemaker this week with a family member or neighbor?

DID YOU KNOW? Gardens of Healing for survivor-victims in all five of the Archdiocese's pastoral regions

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles has created gardens of healing in each of the Archdiocese's pastoral regions, dedicated to those harmed by sexual abuse, in their family, church or community. Located at St. Camillus Pastoral Center in Boyle Heights (San Gabriel Pastoral Region), Our Lady of the Assumption Parish in Ventura (Santa Barbara Pastoral Region), St. Francis de Sales Parish in Sherman Oaks (San Fernando Pastoral Region), St. Bernadette Parish in Los Angeles (Our Lady of the Angels Pastoral Region), and Our Lady of Refuge in Long Beach (San Pedro Pastoral Region) these gardens offer a sacred space for all those impacted by abuse to seek comfort and solace. In each garden there is a weeping wall and a plaque with a reflection by Archbishop Gomez, which starts with: "Dedicated to all those impacted by sexual abuse in the Church, their communities, their families – may all who visit find some measure of renewal, peace and comfort in doing so." Pregunta, pero no te desvíes

Mi hija me preguntó recientemente si está bien “preguntarse si todo el asunto sobre Jesús es cierto”.

No me sorprendió su pregunta; de hecho, la esperaba. Si estás criando a un niño de manera que sea un libre pensador, no quieres que acepte todo lo que dices sencillamente porque eres tú quien se lo dices. Le he prometido a mis hijos que siempre les daré la verdad acerca de Dios. Pero esto es todo lo que puedo hacer – darles la verdad a ellos. Al final, si la aceptan o no, es su propia decisión.

“Yo sé que es verdad”, me dijo ella, “pero es que a veces todo suena tan...increíble”.

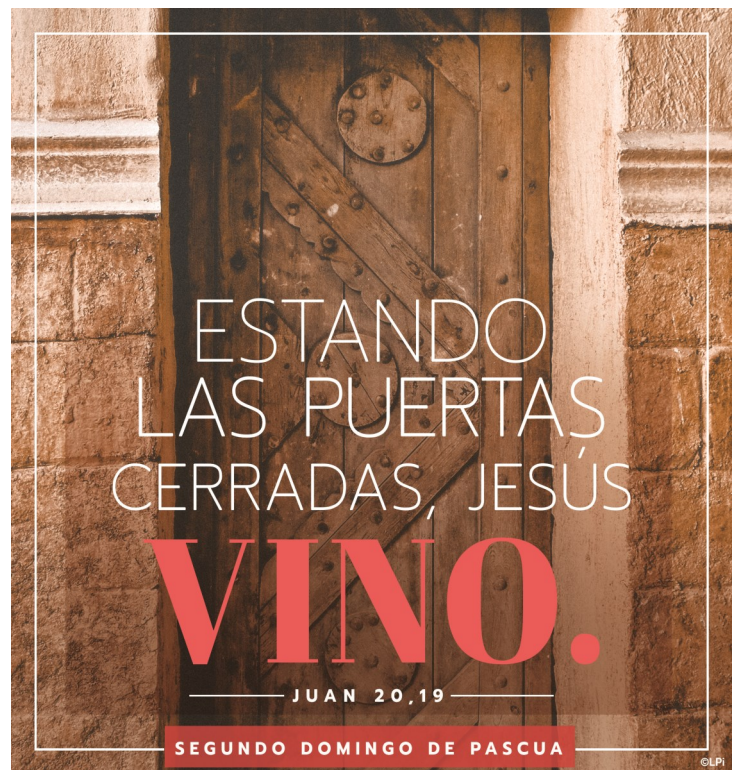
Ella no está equivocada; *sí* suena increíble que un Dios todopoderoso nos haya podido crear sin otro motivo que, por puro amor, que pudo ser tan generoso en darnos el libre albedrío para aceptar ese amor, que pudo ser tan misericordioso para no destruirnos cuando rechazamos su amor y, finalmente, que pudo ser tan fiel en ese amor para encarnarse y morir para salvarnos de las consecuencias de nuestras decisiones erróneas.

Pero son muchas las cosas increíbles y eso no significa que no sean ciertas.

Cuando Jesús dice: “Bienaventurados los que no han visto y han creído”, no está diciendo que Tomás es un tonto por cuestionar algo que parece un poco inaudito. Jesús está simplemente resaltando el hecho de que Tomás se dio el lujo que ninguno de los cristianos nacidos después de él, incluyendo a mi hija, tendrá: pudo ver la prueba con sus propios ojos.

Le dije a mi hija que está bien preguntarse, pero que no se desvíe. Le dije que siguiera el ejemplo de Tomás: mantenerse cerca de las personas en quienes confías, regresar a la calidez del cuarto superior, estar dispuesto a reconocer a Jesús cuando esté frente a ti. Y nunca tener miedo de creer.

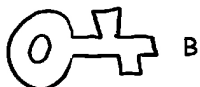

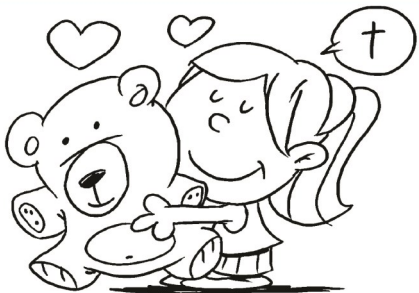
