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PRACTICING CATHOLIC

What Did You Expect?

Moms have a lot of jobs, and it’s usually the case that none of them pay very well.

My work as a chef? Zero compensation, and my clientele are very rarely pleased with my efforts. My role as a teacher, a maid, a chauffeur, a therapist — same deal. Ironically, these jobs consume so much of my time that I am constricted in my work as a writer — the only sphere where I do actually garner any earnings.

It is so easy to grumble about all of this, and I do it all the time. Because despite the fact that I know better, I expect repayment for my good deeds. Deep in my soul, I expect it.

That’s a huge problem.

In my defense, I don’t think this is a very uncommon thing. I think, if we’re being really honest, we all expect “payment” for being a good person. We want God to give us what we ask. We want people to treat us a certain way. We want our day to go smoothly. We expect these things as a matter of course; we feel entitled to them, and we become grumpy when we are denied them. *I worked so hard. I gave so much. What was it all even for?*

But what if we expected absolutely nothing?

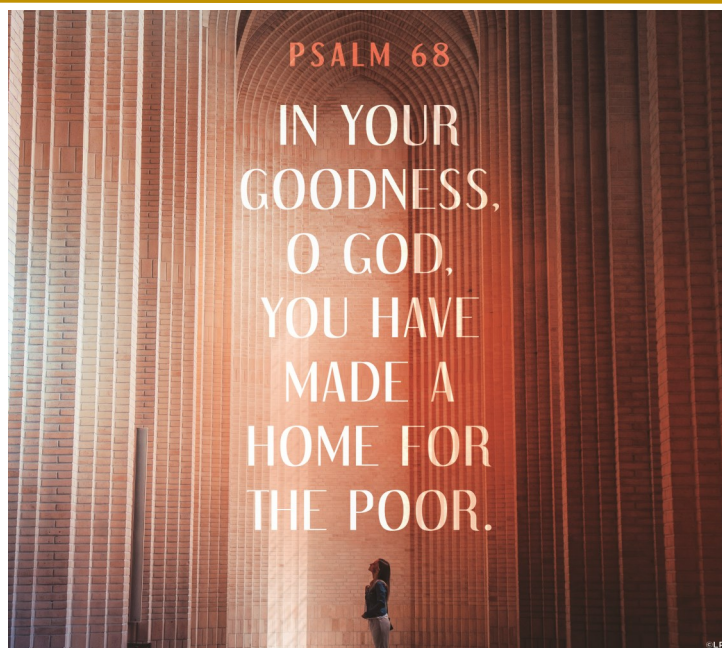
When you hold a banquet, Jesus said, invite those who cannot return the favor. Give not just without the expectation of repayment, but without the possibility of it.

Think about that for a minute. What does that even *look* like — no possibility of payment?

I know what that looks like in my own life. It’s giving more to the literal poor, yes, but it’s also giving more — and more happily, more lovingly — when I cook and clean and drive and write and console. It’s not lamenting that no one appreciates me — it’s actually hoping no one does.

It’s learning to love the lowest place at the table. Because in the lowest place, we are closest to God.

2nd Reading Question:

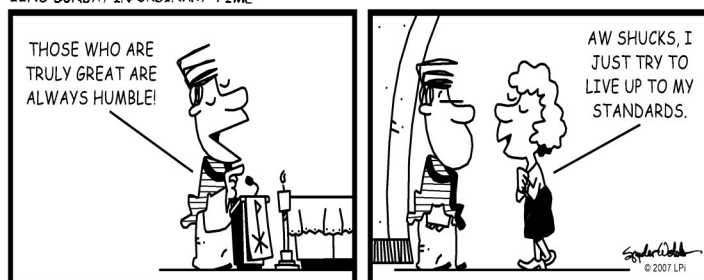
The author of Hebrews speaks of our direct access to God through the new covenant established by Jesus. How might we take advantage of such a gift?

What having a "healthy caution" toward adults can mean, part 2



Having a healthy caution towards adults means requiring all adults to follow safety rules, outlined in policies or codes of conduct, no matter what position they hold in an organization. Adults must also be willing to look at their own behavior and ensure that it is aligned with safety policies and practices. Monitoring the behavior of all adults and speaking up if something is uncomfortable or unsettling — no matter what the relationship between the adults is — it's critical to keeping children safe. ELEMENTARY (1ST-5TH)

First Communion Year 1 (\$125/child) and Year 2 (\$150/child)

2 year process to prepare young children to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion.

Elementary Ministry (\$75/family)

A family ministry designed to help foster faith through fun at home activities and seasonal parish gatherings

Christian Initiation Adapted for Children (no fee)

Process to prepare unbaptized school aged children, 1st-12th, to follow Christ and become a fully initiated Catholic through the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).



JR. HIGH (6TH-8TH)

Middle School Ministry (\$75/child)

Weekly gatherings that provide youth a fun place to find a Catholic community and to experience Jesus in a profound and personal way.

Christian Initiation Adapted for Children (no fee)

Process to prepare unbaptized school aged children, 1st-12th, to follow Christ and become a fully initiated Catholic through the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).



HIGH SCHOOL (9TH-12TH)

Confirmation Year 1 (\$250/teen) and Year 2 (\$250/teen)

2 year process to prepare teens to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation

Youth Ministry (no fee)

Gatherings where teens support each other and grow in faith and friendship while learning how to apply Catholic values and beliefs into their daily lives.

Christian Initiation Adapted for Children (no fee)

Process to help teens follow Christ and become a fully initiated Catholic through the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). It is designed for any unbaptized person, anyone baptized through another Christian community seeking to be Catholic, or any Baptized Catholic who is in need of First Communion and Confirmation.



ADULTS (AGES 18 & OLDER)

Christian Initiation (no fee)

Process to help an adult follow Christ and become a fully initiated Catholic through the reception of the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). It is designed for any unbaptized person, anyone baptized through another Christian community seeking to be Catholic, or any Baptized Catholic who is in need of First Communion and Confirmation.



Adult Confirmation (\$100/person)

Process that prepares adults who have been Baptized and received First Holy Communion to become fully initiated Catholics through the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

¿Qué Esperabas?

Las mamás tienen muchos trabajos, y por lo general se da el caso de que ninguno de ellos paga muy bien.

¿Mi trabajo como chef? Cero compensación, y mi clientela rara vez está satisfecha con mis esfuerzos. Mi papel como maestra, sirvienta, chofer, terapeuta, es lo mismo. Irónicamente, estos trabajos consumen tanto de mi tiempo que estoy limitada en mi trabajo como escritora, la única esfera en la que realmente obtengo ganancias.

Es muy fácil quejarse de todo esto, y lo hago todo el tiempo. Porque a pesar de que sé que no es así, espero que me paguen mis buenas acciones. En el fondo de mi alma, lo espero.

Ese es un gran problema.

En mi defensa, no creo que esto sea algo poco común. Creo que, si somos realmente honestos, todos esperamos un "pago" por ser una buena persona. Queremos que Dios nos dé lo que pedimos. Queremos que la gente nos trate de cierta manera. Queremos que nuestro día transcurra sin problemas. Esperamos que estas cosas sean algo natural; Nos sentimos con derecho a ello, y nos volvemos gruñones cuando se nos niega. *Trabajé muy duro. Di tanto. ¿Y todo para qué?*

Pero ¿y si no esperaríamos absolutamente nada?

Cuando celebres un banquete, dijo Jesús, invita a aquellos que no pueden devolver el favor. Dar no solo sin la expectativa de reembolso, sino sin la posibilidad de ello.

Piensa en eso por un minuto. ¿Cómo se ve eso, sin posibilidad de pago?

Sé cómo se ve eso en mi propia vida. Es dar más a los literalmente pobres, sí, pero también es dar más, y más felizmente, más amorosamente, cuando cocino y limpio y conduzco y escribo y consuelo. No es lamentar que nadie me aprecie, sino esperar que nadie lo haga.

Es aprender a amar el lugar más bajo de la mesa. Porque en el lugar más bajo, estamos más cerca de Dios.

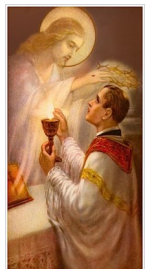

Supervisar el comportamiento de todos los adultos y alzar la voz si algo resulta incómodo o inquietante – independientemente de cuál sea la relación entre los adultos – es fundamental para mantener la seguridad de los niños.
