



## to walk as one

A little boy in the First Communion class proved that kids might listen more than parents think. He was one of the more difficult—or rather, interesting—students and he had proven himself a challenge to teach. When asked why we receive Jesus in Holy Communion, he told the class that his mom said that his receiving Communion was her last hope. The only way to get the devil out of him was to get Jesus into him!

Celebrating and receiving the Eucharist is central to our faith. But also important is what we do afterwards. If we simply go through the motions and receive Communion because it's that time of the Mass, then we miss the point. Joining

ourselves to the Lord means that we accept His command to love



one another and carry on His mission of teaching, healing and forgiving.

Receiving Communion is never a passive thing, but always one that moves us to act with greater virtue and faith. It brings us to a deeper union with Jesus and with His Body, the Church.

Today we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ with special prayers and processions. Recall those special times in your life when receiving Communion was so special: your First Communion, your wedding, an anniversary or special celebration. As you offer your thanks, resolve to let your public acts of faith inspire you to grow in the image of Jesus. Give the devil reason to flee! Become more like the One who you receive.






