#### SAINT JEROME

PRIEST AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH



Saint Vincent devoted his whole life to the service of the poor, like a Mother Teresa of the 17th century. He founded a congregation of priests for missionary work, groups of laymen to help paupers and galley-slaves, and, with St Louise de Marillac, the Sisters of Charity. He inspired the later foundation of the lay-run St Vincent de Paul Society. A man of deep faith, keen intellect, and enormous creativity, he has become known as the "The Apostle of Charity". Feast day: September 27th.

Saint Jerome (ca. 347 – 420) is best known as the translator of the Bible from Greek and Hebrew into Latin. Jerome's edition, the Vulgate, is still an important biblical text of the Roman Catholic Church. He, as a scripture scholar, is represented as a cardinal, dressed in red.

According to legend, a lion limped into St. Jerome's monastery in Bethlehem one day. The other monks ran away in fear, but Jerome calmly looked at the lion's paw and removed a large thorn. Thereafter the lion became his companion.

# Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels

are the only ones named in the Bible. In the Book of Daniel, Michael is called "the great prince"; in the Letter of Jude, he argues with the devil over Moses' body; and in the Book of Revelation, he leads the battle against Satan. He is patron of the sick, radiologists and mariners. Gabriel explains Daniel's visions to him in the Book of Daniel, and in the Gospel of Luke announces to Zechariah and Mary the births of their respective sons. He is the patron of messengers and telecommunications and postal workers. Raphael guides Tobiah in the Book of Tobit; he is patron of the blind, physicians and travelers. The church created their joint feast after the Second Vatican Council.




