

FROM FR. AMAL-

"Go out to the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature."

With the great Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, we conclude the completion of the paschal mystery through which we have been redeemed. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us: "Christ's Ascension into heaven signifies His participation, in His humanity, in God's power and authority. Jesus Christ is Lord: he possesses all power in heaven and on earth. He is 'far above all rule and authority and power and dominion,' for the Father 'has put all things under his feet.' Christ is Lord of the cosmos and of history." (CCC 668)

Some people, critical of Christianity, critical of the idea of religion, or afterlife doctrines in religion, criticize the Church for being too other-worldly in focus. Partially, the criticism is just; for we Christians sometimes too quickly treat this world and its troubles as insignificant. Only when we see everything in our lives in and through the complete Paschal Mystery, not segmenting it by placing the Passion in one box, the Resurrection in another, the Ascension in yet another and so on, will our lives make sense. Ultimately, it is the gift of the Spirit, he who will lead us to all truth, he who is coming at Pentecost, who will grant us the grace to bear what it is we cannot hear and understand right now.

Here on the Ascension, we are given the opportunity to cherish one of our faith's deepest truths: the Return of Christ, the Fulfillment of his promise, the coming of all good things. Indeed: He who has been taken up into heaven will return in the same way he was seen going into heaven.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives his mission to all believers: "Go out to the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." This mission is not given to a select few but to all believers. To be a Christian is to be a proclaimer and an evangelizer. There is a difference between preaching and proclaiming. "We preach with words but we proclaim with our lives." As we celebrate the Lord's Ascension, we are being commissioned to go forth and proclaim the Gospel of life, love, hope, and peace, by the witness of our lives.

When the trials of life feel too heavy to bear, we must remember that Christ will come again in glory, the same glory in which He arose from the tomb, the same glory in which He ascended, and the same glory in which He currently abides. In this way it is possible for each of us to be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit into agents or instruments of Christ. We are enlivened, and our actions become animated in a new way by Holy Spirit as we serve the God we love.

Where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope.



Eucharistic Adoration with Confessions

THE JUBILEE YEAR 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration

From the Sunday of Pentecost to the day of the Corpus Christi Procession in Lansing on June 21st, each parish of the Diocese of Lansing, will turn host 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration for the intention of bringing the Gospel of Hope to the world.

Q. What is the 40 Hours Devotion?

It is 40 Hours of uninterrupted adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. This devotion originated in Milan in the 1500s and is associated with many graces and miracles. Rooted in deep Eucharistic reverence, this devotion provides a powerful opportunity for spiritual renewal, prayer, and evangelization.

Q. Why is it 40 hours long?

The number 40 is very important Biblically: Christ spend 40 hours in the tomb before rising on Easter Morning; the Israelites wandered for 40 years in the desert; in the time of Noah, it rained for 40 days and nights; Moses fasted for 40 days before he received the law on Mt. Sinai; and, there are 40 days between Jesus' Resurrection and his Ascension.

Q. Why are we doing this?

The 40 Hours devotion has long been associated with deep spiritual renewal, conversion, and even miracles. The extended period of Eucharistic Adoration foster intense prayer, repentance, and intercession, creating an environment where God's grace can work powerfully in individuals and communities.




DIOCESAN CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION:

The Diocese of Lansing is planning a diocesan-wide observance of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, on **Saturday June 21**st with an outdoor **Mass at 10:30am in Lansing's Jackson Field** where the Lugnuts play. Following Mass, there will be a Eucharistic procession from the ballpark to the Cathedral, followed by food trucks and an outdoor party. There will be limited seating on Lumen Christi buses for those who would rather ride than drive. Queens will pay for the buses. We ask you to tip your driver.

If you would like to reserve a spot on the bus, seats are first come, first serve. Call the Queens Parish Office (517.783.2748) and leave your name and number. The buses will depart the west lot of St. Johns Church at 8:30am. You will be dropped off at the ballpark for Mass. Pick up will be near the Cathedral at the end of the procession. The procession is just over a half mile in length. Keep that in mind if you have mobility issues. Learn more about the Mass and Procession at www.eucharisticjourney.org.
