

FROM FR. AMAL-

"Come Holy Spirit
Make our ears to hear
Make our eyes to see
Make our mouths to speak
Make our hearts to seek
Make our hands to reach out
And touch the world with your love."

Both the Jews and the Christians now celebrate Pentecost. The word Pentecost is Greek for *pentecostes* which means "fiftieth." The feast received this name because it was celebrated fifty days after the Feast of the Passover. It was originally a day of thanksgiving for the completion of the harvest. Later, the Jews added to the Feast of Pentecost the element of Yahweh's Covenant with Noah, which took place fifty days after the great deluge. Still later, they made this feast an occasion to thank God for His Sinaitic Covenant with Moses, which occurred fifty days after the beginning of the Exodus from Egypt.

Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. For Christians, it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church through the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church.

Today's Scripture readings remind us that Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. The main theme of today's readings is that the gift of the Holy Spirit is something to be shared with others. Paul lists the fruits of the Spirit in his Letter to the Galatians: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (5:22-23). He insists that these spiritual gifts are to be used in the present time for the benefit of others, for the common good, and for the building up of the Body of Christ.

On the day of Pentecost, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send the Advocate or Paraclete. The gift of the Spirit would enable the Apostles to fulfill Jesus' commission to preach the Gospel to all nations. Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life. Without the Spirit, the Church is a field of dry, dead bones. The Venerable Fulton J. Sheen once said about the Church, "Even though we are God's chosen people, we often behave more like God's frozen people—frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our Faith." Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love.

Come Holy Spirit, Fill the Hearts of the Faithful !!!

THE JUBILEE YEAR 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration

From the Sunday of Pentecost to the day of the Corpus Christi Procession in Lansing on June 21st, each parish of the Diocese of Lansing, will turn host 40 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration for the intention of bringing the Gospel of Hope to the world.

Q. What is the 40 Hours Devotion?

It is 40 Hours of uninterrupted adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. This devotion originated in Milan in the 1500s and is associated with many graces and miracles. Rooted in deep Eucharistic reverence, this devotion provides a powerful opportunity for spiritual renewal, prayer, and evangelization.

Q. Why is it 40 hours long?

The number 40 is very important Biblically: Christ spend 40 hours in the tomb before rising on Easter Morning; the Israelites wandered for 40 years in the desert; in the time of Noah, it rained for 40 days and nights; Moses fasted for 40 days before he received the law on Mt. Sinai; and, there are 40 days between Jesus' Resurrection and his Ascension.

Q. Why are we doing this?

The 40 Hours devotion has long been associated with deep spiritual renewal, conversion, and even miracles. The extended period of Eucharistic Adoration foster intense prayer, repentance, and intercession, creating an environment where God's grace can work powerfully in individuals and communities.



DIOCESAN CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION:

The Diocese of Lansing is planning a diocesan-wide observance of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, on **Saturday June 21**st with an outdoor **Mass at 10:30am in Lansing's Jackson Field** where the Lugnuts play. Following Mass, there will be a Eucharistic procession from the ballpark to the Cathedral, followed by food trucks and an outdoor party. There will be limited seating on Lumen Christi buses for those who would rather ride than drive. Queens will pay for the buses. We ask you to tip your driver.

If you would like to reserve a spot on the bus, seats are first come, first serve. Call the Queens Parish Office (517.783.2748) and leave your name and number. The buses will depart the west lot of St. Johns Church at 8:30am. You will be dropped off at the ballpark for Mass. Pick up will be near the Cathedral at the end of the procession. The procession is just over a half mile in length. Keep that in mind if you have mobility issues. Learn more about the Mass and Procession at www.eucharisticjourney.org.




