THE SACRAMENTS: **ENCOUNTERS WITH CHRIST**



The sacraments are sacred encounters with God, instituted by Christ, that nourish our faith and restore or strengthen our relationship with Him. Through these visible signs of grace, we experience His presence in profound ways. At Our Lady of the Gulf, we are blessed to celebrate all seven sacraments of the Catholic Church:

Baptism: The gateway to the Christian life, Baptism cleanses us from sin and welcomes us into God's family. A Baptismal Preparation Class is scheduled for Thursday, October 2 at 6:00 p.m. Contact Deacon Danny Rodgers to register: baptism@olgal.org.

Eucharist: The source and summit of our faith, where at every Mass, we receive the true Body and Blood of Christ. To prepare for First Holy Communion, contact Danielle Lee: CReEd@ olgal.org.

Reconciliation (Confession): A sacrament of healing, offering God's mercy and forgiveness. Confessions are scheduled for Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday 7:30 a.m., Wednesday 4:30 p.m., Saturday 4:00 p.m.

Confirmation: This sacrament strengthens us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and deepens our commitment to Christ. For youth (Grades 9-12), contact Phil Gazzo: teen@olgal.org. For adults, contact Mike O'Neil: ybcatholic@olgal.org.

Marriage: A sacred covenant between a man and a woman, mirroring Christ's love for His Church. For marriage preparation or information on getting married at OLG, visit: olgal.org/marriage.

Holy Orders: Through ordination, men are called to serve as deacons, priests, or bishops in the Church. Please continue to pray for vocations. If you think you might be called to Holy Orders, please reach out to Fr. Carucci as soon as possible.

Anointing of the Sick: A sacrament of healing and strength for those facing serious illness or advanced age. Anointing is available before or after Mass, or can be arranged at home or in the hospital. Contact our Caring Ministry Coordinator, Sara Pharmann: olgcares@olgal.org.

WORSHIP ON WEDNESDAY

FIRST FRIDAY EUCHARISTIC ADORATION: SEPTEMBER 5



On the First Friday of each month, we celebrate Daily Mass at 8:00 a.m., followed by Eucharistic Adoration from 8:30 a.m.-6:00 p.m.

Guardians Needed: To ensure the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone, we ask to have at least two adorers signed up every hour in advance.

How to Help:

- Choose the earliest hour you're available if a slot shows "All Slots Full," that means the two-person minimum is met, but extra adorers are always welcome.
- If you can't make your scheduled hour, please arrange a substitute so we won't have to repose early.
- Scan the QR code to sign up or visit: You're welcome to drop in any time during Adoration – even outside your committed hour – to spend time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Thank you for your devotion!

CARE MINISTRY: A PARISH FAMILY IN ACTION:

The Care Ministry is committed to extending the care and compassion of Our Lady of the Gulf beyond parish boundaries. In alignment with Christ's directive to love and serve others, our ministry seeks to bring peace and spiritual presence to individuals who are homebound, hospitalized, or otherwise unable to participate in Mass.

WHAT WE DO

Visits & Fellowship: Trained volunteers conduct regular visits to residences, hospitals, and nursing facilities, offering conversation, encouragement, and empathetic support.

Prayer Support: We provide spiritual assistance through prayer with and for those in need, distribute personalized prayer cards, and include intentions in the parish prayer chain.

Communion & Sacraments: Upon request, we deliver the Eucharist to those unable to attend Mass and facilitate arrangements for the Anointing of the Sick.

WHO WE SERVE

- Individuals who are elderly, ill, recovering from surgery, or otherwise unable to attend Mass.
- Families and caregivers seeking spiritual support for loved ones.
- Community members facing loneliness or adversity who would benefit from a supportive visit.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

- Refer a Neighbor: Please notify us regarding any parishioners absent from Mass or individuals in need so we may offer outreach.
- Join Our Team: No specialized training is required; orientation and ongoing support are provided to all compassionate volunteers.
- Pray with Us: Register to participate in prayers for the homebound and hospitalized; weekly intention lists are distributed.



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY




Valuing the dignity of every human life. You are invited to join a new parish ministry focused on supporting and recognizing the importance of life at all stages – from conception to natural death.

A NOTE ABOUT OUR SATURDAY EVENING MASS

For many years, we've lovingly referred to our Saturday 4:00 p.m. Mass as the "Vigil Mass." Like many parishes, this name has been used out of tradition and familiarity. However, beginning this month, we will begin referring to it as the "Anticipated Mass." Why the change? While "Vigil Mass" is commonly used, the Church technically reserves that title for special liturgies with unique prayers and readings – such as the Easter Vigil. The regular Saturday evening Mass that fulfills our Sunday obligation is more accurately called an Anticipated Mass. Please know: nothing about the Mass itself is changing – just the way we refer to it in our bulletin and communications. We're simply aligning our language more closely with the Church's liturgical terms, out of love for the beauty and clarity of our faith. Thank you for embracing this small change as we continue to grow in understanding and faith together.

MASS AD ORIENTEM

Occasionally at Our Lady of the Gulf, we celebrate Mass Ad Orientem – Latin for "toward the East." Rather than the priest "turning his back" to the people, this ancient posture reflects the deeper meaning of the liturgy: a procession into eternity, led by Christ through His priest, with the people journeying together as one.



Facing liturgical East – either the geographic direction or symbolically toward the altar and cross – reminds us that we're part of something cosmic and eternal. It shifts focus from the celebrant's personality to the mystery of the sacrifice taking place on the altar.

This posture, common throughout Church history, was never abolished by Vatican II. In fact, the Roman Missal still presumes it. While Mass versus populum (facing the people) is permitted, it can unintentionally emphasize the congregation itself, rather than opening our hearts to God who is "ahead and above."

In Ad Orientem, the priest calls the people to prayer, then leads them in offering it to God. He turns to proclaim the Word and give Communion, but he faces the Lord during the sacrifice.

Our hope is that this liturgical expression will draw all of us into a deeper reverence for the mystery of the Mass. – Fr. Carucci

CONTINUING THE JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE



With the recent passing of Pope Francis, many of us might have forgotten that we are still in a Jubilee Year of Hope. We are still called to be Pilgrims of Hope and are invited to pass through the Holy Door, originally located in Rome, but also present in every diocese. In the Archdiocese of Mobile, we have a number of designated Holy Doors, including the Cathedral-Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Mobile, and closer to home, St. Margaret of Scotland Parish in Foley. The opening of the Holy Door for pilgrims calls to mind the passage from John 10, "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and find pasture." Passing through the Holy Door expresses the decision to follow and be guided by Jesus, who is the Good Shepherd.

Joe Quattrocchi, our Director of Parish Advocacy, was recently at Franciscan University of Steubenville in Ohio for their summer conference series called, "Defending the Faith." It was also an opportunity for him to participate as a Pilgrim of Hope, as the university's small chapel, The Portiuncula, has been designated as an official site to visit during this Jubilee Year. This was the 30th anniversary year of the Defending the Faith Conference series, hosted by Dr. Scott Han, a noted scripture scholar and professor at the university.

Joe had an opportunity to meet and chat with Dr. Hahn August 2 during the conference as well as to taking plenty of notes during his multiple presentations. The following are some excerpts:

This is a great time to be alive and to be in the Church. As Americans, we should be filled with hope. One thing that all pilgrims need to have when they are journeying is a song in their heart. Songs that remind you how much God loves you. It's very easy to feel cut off and alone. Keep an inspirational song in your heart and you will never feel alone.

Throughout Church history, God has always been reaching out to us, His children, and wanting us to be close to Him. In the Old Testament there are 17 references as God being called Father and when we get to the New Testament, specifically during Jesus' Last Supper sermon, we read 51 references of God as our Father. This shows a God who wants to be part of our daily life and wants to give us hope. This year is also special because we celebrate the 1,700-year anniversary of the Nicene Creed. We say this creed every Sunday in order to transition from the Word and its teaching, to the celebration of the Eucharist. At the time it was being put together, there were Arians who wanted nothing to do with the belief that the Father and Jesus were One and they opposed the Nicene Creed, but over the many years of the Church we have seen that our creed is filled with hope. It is a creed that unites us from generation to generation.

During this age when some struggle with their identity and are confused with who they are, the creed helps us identify to whom we truly belong. The Nicene Creed helps us know and understand that we are beloved children of God, the Father. When we believe this truth and embrace our relationship with the Father, we will find great hope. Hope dissipates fear and helps us through our sufferings. Lean into hope. Lean into God's hope with your head and your heart. The more you lean into hope, the greater progress you will make in your spiritual journey. One final reason for us here to have hope is our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. Like most of you, I was astonished that an American was named as the head of the Church. He has already created quite a stir among those on the fringes of their faith or who have stopped practicing. He is reaching people with hope who were disconnected or disenfranchised and they are beginning to return to practicing their faith. Brothers and sisters, St. Augustine told us that the soul is three-fold. Our soul has memory, intellect and it has a will. Let us combine all three of these elements with hope.
