Father Bill Health Issues

My overall health is great. Heart, lungs, blood work are all outstanding. However I have had several serious orthopedic issues that have left me temporarily disabled and in a great deal of pain because of pinched nerves; unable to walk without assistance of a walker and at times a wheelchair.

On March 3, 2022 I had spine surgery that was very successful. I have spinal stenosis and the recovery went very well, like clockwork, except that a new and entirely different orthopedic issue arose in July 2022.

After extensive studies the doctors have determined that my birth defect is haunting me these many years later. The good news is that there is a solution: I will have right hip replacement surgery on July 3rd of this year. It is expected that I will spend 1 to 2 nights in the hospital and be walking on it the same day following a 2 hour surgery performed by 2 doctors.

The current issue of pinched nerves is painful even when sitting but much worse when walking or standing. It takes a great deal of energy out of me daily resulting in my not being very available to others. I look forward to the healing the surgery will provide.

At birth my parents were told I would never walk. Beginning at the age of 6 months I wore braces on my legs and took my first step just before my 5th birthday. Ever since I have had to wear some form of corrective shoes or devices, but I walk. And most of all I thank God!

Unfortunately, however, this birth defect will also mean that in the years to come I will possibly need to also replace my left hip and both knees. Thankfully modern medicine is ready for me!

Following the July 3rd surgery I will have to be especially careful the first 8 weeks. During that time and after I will have physical therapy. Thankfully the Archdiocese provides us with excellent insurance. I will be unavailable for all of July and possibly longer.

Naturally I am excited yet afraid, happy yet nervous. Most of all I trust in the Lord Jesus Christ and believe in the power of prayer.

Thank you for your prayers for my recovery the past year and in advance I thank you for your prayers for my next surgery. You and all our parish families are in my prayers.

PARISH ANNOUNCEMENT

Starting May 28: Communion Changes After Covid

On May 11th the US government lifted the public health emergency regarding Covid. The World Health Organization (WHO) had done so the week before. Therefore there will be some changes in the administration of Holy Communion starting Sunday, May 28th (starting at the 5:30pm Mass on Sat., May 27th).

Expectations are that from now on the effect of Covid on the US population annually will be 70,000 Covid cases a year and 11,000 Covid deaths a year; equal to an exceptionally bad flu attack.

The reason we are delaying the changes till the May 28th weekend, is to give you this information a week ahead of the changes so that you will be better informed of the changes and of the personal decisions you wish to make.

GENERAL CHANGES

1. The hand sanitizer stands at all the doors will continue to be available, use is optional and encouraged.
2. There is no longer any need to wear masks, but you are free to do so if you wish.

COMMUNION CHANGES

3. All communion stations will continue to have sanitizer gel available in case the communion minister (priest, deacon or lay) feels a need to use it. Currently all communion ministers are required to use the gel every time a person receives by mouth. Starting May 28th the minister will no longer be so required, but is free to use the gel if they think it is needed after any individual communicant may have invaded their personal space.
4. Communion ministers are currently required to wear a face mask. Starting May 28th this will no longer be required, it will be optional only.

NO CHANGE

5. All communion ministers including our clergy are now and will continue to be required to use sanitizer gel when they come up to the altar just before communion. For years now we have kept a gel dispenser on each credence table for communion minister to use when they come up and that will continue. Gel is also available at the altar for the clergy. It is a onetime use before we administer communion to the faithful. This practice will continue.

We pray these changes will benefit us all moving forward. We thank you for your kind and loving cooperation through the Covid years and for your understanding of these changes.

Residence restriction laws

Residence restriction laws are state and local laws that prevent convicted sexual offenders from living within a specific range of a school, park, daycare, bus stop, or other known area for children. Many states have adopted some form of residence restriction to prevent sexual offenders from committing repeat crimes. These laws exist and have an impact, but they are only one layer of protection and are not a guarantee that a park, bus stop or other space is safe. ANNOUCEMENTS

A partir del 28 de mayo: Cambios en la Comunión Después de Covid

El 11 de mayo el gobierno de los Estados Unidos levantó la emergencia de salud pública por el Covid. La Organización Mundial de la Salud (OMS) lo había hecho la semana anterior. Por lo tanto, habrá algunos cambios en la administración de la Sagrada Comunión a partir del domingo 28 de mayo (comenzando con la Misa de las 5:30 pm del sábado 27 de mayo).

La expectativa es que a partir hoy el efecto de Covid en la población de USA será anualmente de 70,000 casos de Covid al año y 11,000 muertes de Covid al año; igual al de un ataque de gripe excepcionalmente grave.

La razón por la que retrasamos los cambios hasta el fin de semana del 28 de mayo es para brindarles esta información una semana antes de los cambios para que estén mejor informados de los cambios y pare que tomen decisiones personales que deseen tomar.

CAMBIOS GENERALES

1. Los desinfectantes de manos en todas las puertas seguirán estando disponibles, su uso es opcional pero recomendado.
2. Ya no es necesario usar máscaras, pero pueden hacerlo si lo desean.

CAMBIOS DE COMUNIÓN

3. Todos los lugares en donde se da la comunión seguirán teniendo gel desinfectante disponible en caso de que el ministro de la comunión (sacerdote, diácono o laico) sienta la necesidad de usarlo. Actualmente, todos los ministros de comunión son requeridos en usar el gel cada vez que una persona la reciba por vía oral. A partir del 28 de mayo, al ministro no se le requiere, pero puede usar el gel si cree que es necesario después de que cualquier comulgante haya invadido su espacio personal.
4. Actualmente, los ministros de la Eucaristía deben usar una máscara facial. A partir del 28 de mayo ésto ya no será obligatorio, será solo opcional.

NINGÚN CAMBIO

5. Todos los ministros de la Eucaristía, incluyendo a nuestro clero, deben y seguirán usando el gel desinfectante cuando se acercan al altar justo antes de la comunión. Durante años hemos mantenido un dispensador de gel en cada mesita para que el ministro de comunión lo use cuando se presenten y eso continuará. Gel también está disponible en el altar para el clero. Es un uso único antes de administrar la comunión a los fieles. Esta práctica continuará.

Oramos para que estos cambios nos beneficien a todos en el futuro. Le agradecemos su amable y amorosa cooperación durante los años de Covid y su comprensión de estos cambios.

SEEKING CHRIST IN ONE ANOTHER

The funeral luncheon, the Irish wake, the vigil at an ailing loved one's bedside: in times of crisis, people gather. In moments of sadness, fear, and confusion, we gravitate toward one another. For some reason, the feelings are so much more bearable when we are not alone.

I'm sure that the disciples and their companions, gathered in the upper room after the Lord's Ascension, did all of the things we typically do at these functions. I'm sure they hugged and talked and shared food, processing together the remarkable events they had witnessed.

But we don't hear about any of that. We hear only that they prayed — fervently, and together.

Saint John Paul II famously said that "it is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you." And I think that, whenever we gather, in good times or in bad, we think we are seeking companionship — but we are actually seeking God.

As I think back on the last few crisis-gatherings my family has had, I try to remember when we have stopped everything to pray together. I can think of a few times, but to be honest, they are *too* few. We are usually occupied with more practical tasks: planning the funeral, talking to the doctor, making the decisions, ordering the food. Just trying to survive through it.

But this is the busywork of sorrow, and it is a waste of our time. We would do better to follow the example of the disciples and remember that, in these dire moments, God is waiting for us.

"Of you my heart speaks; you my glance seeks." — Psalm 27

WHY ARE THERE LITURGICAL CYCLES?

While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g. Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the Lectionary that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in Sacrosanctum Concilium, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI. 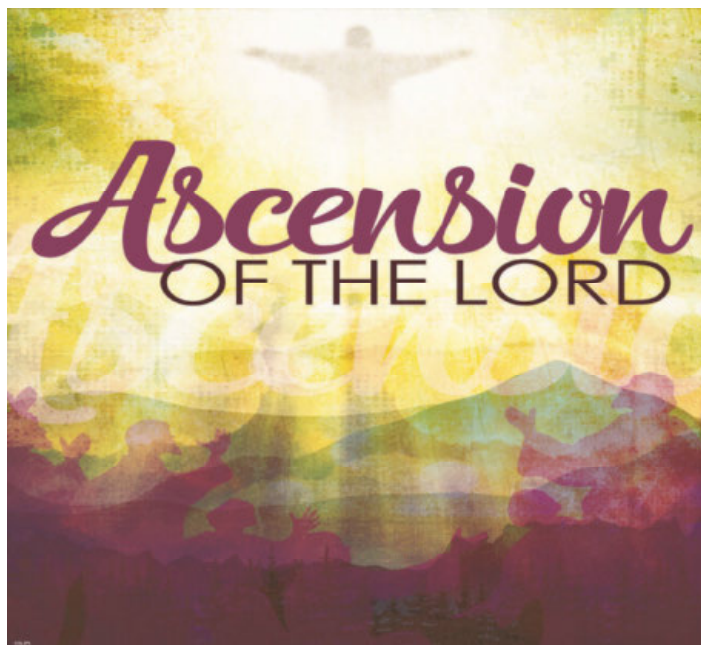

7º DOMINGO DE PASCUA

El Evangelio de hoy contiene un mensaje importante para todos nosotros. Jesús pide por el nuevo pueblo santo de Dios. Pide al Padre que nos guarde en su nombre: “*Yo ya no estoy más en el mundo, mientras yo vuelvo a ti. Padre Santo, guárdalos en ese nombre tuyo que a mí me diste, para que sean uno como nosotros*” (Juan 17,11). El Papa Francisco nos dice en su homilía del 16 de agosto del 2014 lo siguiente: “*Es significativo, ante todo, que Jesús pida al Padre que nos consagre y proteja, pero que no nos aparte del mundo. Sabemos que él envía a sus discípulos para que sean fermento de santidad y verdad en el mundo. En esto, los mártires nos muestran el camino*”.

Ahora, también, en la actualidad Jesús, nos sigue invitando a ser testigos de su Evangelio en el ámbito que nos rodea; sea la familia, el trabajo y la sociedad. “*Jesús reza, pide para que la tristeza y el aislamiento no nos gane el corazón. Nosotros queremos hacer lo mismo, queremos unirnos a la oración de Jesús, a sus palabras para decir juntos: “Padre santo, cuídalos con el poder de tu nombre... para que estén completamente unidos, como tú y yo, y su gozo sea completo”. Jesús nos invita a rezar porque sabe que hay cosas que solo las podemos recibir como don, hay cosas que solo podemos vivir como regalo (Homilía Papa Francisco, 20 de septiembre de 2015). ¡Unidos en tu nombre, todos venceremos!*”

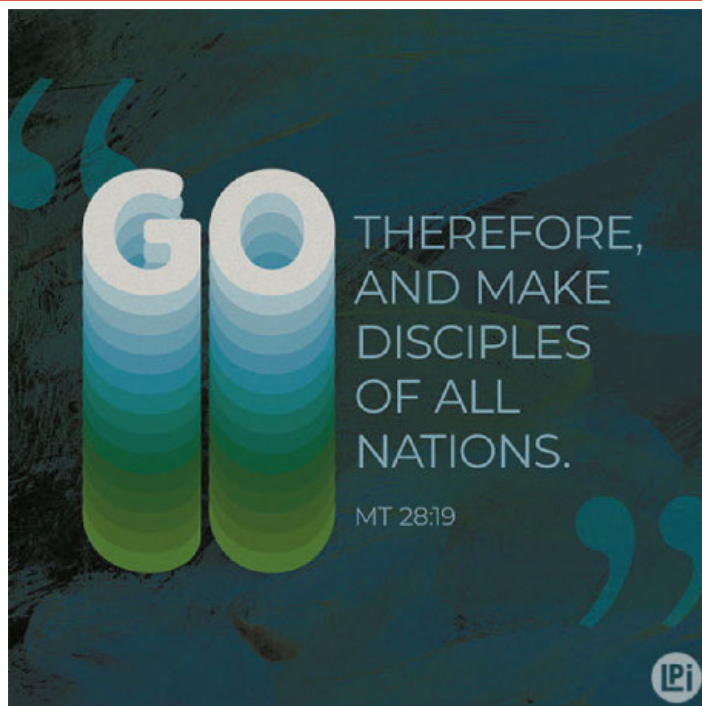

When the world sees us, do they see to whom we belong? In what ways are we most manifestly Christian? In prayer, in service, in sacrifice? Whatever it is, let us devote ourselves to it with one accord, so that Jesus Christ may be glorified in all that we do.

7TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Traditionally, the four writers of the Gospels are symbolized by four creatures that make their way into Church art and architecture: Matthew, an angel; Mark, a lion; Luke, an ox; and John, an eagle. These images can be found in churches across the world, a nod to those who recorded the stories of Jesus for us, thousands of years ago.

Today's Gospel was written by John. There are a few reasons why John is symbolized by an eagle, but my favorite explanation is that his writings soar like an eagle into the sky with their beautiful, poetic language. The prayer we hear today is no different — Jesus invokes God in a long discourse that might seem mystifying at times, the same way that a poem can be perplexing to understand when we are unfamiliar with the pacing or format.

Consider holding onto the shortest sentence in this prayer: "I pray for them."

Jesus prays for us. For me. For you.

Let that sink deep into your being.

Jesus is on your side. He is aware of what you are holding at this moment. He is aware of your pain, your faith, your mission. And He's rooting for you. This prayer was recorded thousands of years ago, far before you were born. Since before you were born, you were held in prayer. With that certainty, we live.

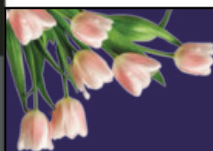

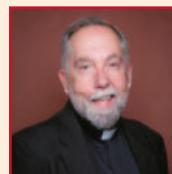
