



#### MASS CHANGE SATURDAY ONLY

Canceling 8:15am Saturday Mass

With the declining number of priests and the raising demands on Saturday it has become painfully necessary to permanently cancel our Saturday morning 8:15am Mass. We deeply regret this necessary change.

The ministry of a parish priest involves so much more than the joy and privilege of celebrating Mass. Parish priests with love and faith celebrate other sacraments, help prepare people for the sacraments. Fathers counsel people, comfort them through tragedies and share in the joys of the faithful. They visit classrooms of the young meet with parents and visit the elderly.

To understand the shortage of priests as it affects us here at Sacred Heart, given the number of families registered, the difference between now and 1959 when this parish plant was dedicated is like you going to work tomorrow and your boss assigning you eight times the responsibility and work load. That is too much for the physical, emotional and spiritual health of our priests.

<u>First Saturday Anointing of Sick</u>: For now we are planning to continue our beautiful custom of a First Saturday 8:15am Mass with Anointing of the Sick. Yes we will have Mass and Anointing on Sat., Oct. 7th at 8:15am.

# POSSIBLE CHANGES TO BOTH SUNDAY AND WEEKDAY MASSES

Our parish Pastoral Team and Pastoral Council will discuss other possible changes. For now there is NO CHANGE in our Sunday Mass nor weekday Mass schedule. Yes, we have returned to celebrating the 6:30am Mass on Sundays now that we have two priests once more.

The clergy and lay leadership of our parish are looking at new ideas for schedules. Securing visiting priests is just as difficult as finding parish priests. It can also be costly as in addition to a most appropriate stipend we need to cover their transportation costs, fuel for their car if they live nearby. Some parishes fly in a visitor, paying for his plane ticket and renting him a car to cover for summer vacations.....but not all priests want to take their vacations in the summer. Also what happens when a parish priest falls ill, goes on retreat, or has an away conference during the school year?

### Yes we have our normal weekday Mass schedule Monday through Friday Mass at 8:15am and 5:30pm

We need your prayers more than anything. Please ask the Holy Spirit to guide us in the painful and difficult decisions that lie ahead for our parish family.

For the next months and possibly forever, we will occasionally use a "Priest Absence Schedule" (PAS), when one priest is away for a brief period leaving us with only one parish priest.

### DEACONS MINISTERS OF THE CUP

#### **Deacons Now Serving Blood of Christ**

You may have noticed that our two deacons are now always administering the cup that is the Blood of Christ to the faithful at Mass. When the Archdiocese gave permission to return to the cup after the Covid pandemic, our Archbishop emphasized that deacons are and always have been "Ministers of the Cup" as instructed in the Roman Missal.

The teaching and tradition behind the diaconate (yes the proper spelling is diaconate) is that deacons are ministers of service. First and foremost they serve the poor, prisoners, sick and Christian formation (teaching religion, preparing people for sacraments); most especially the poor, the widow and orphan.

Because of their service to those in need the priest invites a deacon to serve the table of the Lord at Mass. The priest acts "in persona Christi" (in the person of Christ) as an "alter-Christus" (another Christ) and thus offers and administers the Body of Christ. The deacon then assists the priest or serves the priest by administering the Blood of Christ to the people on behalf of the priest.

In our culture today we often associate blood with service in phrases like – he helped the victims of the auto accident, he worked so hard he was sweating blood – she is so dedicated to the food bank, she sweats blood volunteering there.

At Mass the deacon does not serve the people rather he serves or assists the priest as needed by the priest. Over the centuries several distinct functions within the Mass have become traditional ways the deacon assists the priest, the ways he serves the table of the Lord. One is in proclaiming the Gospel as the ultimate preparation (formation) for the Eucharist, assisting in certain prayers and helping at the altar itself.

When time for Holy Communion then the most proper and spiritually powerful sign of service is for the deacon to administer the cup, the Blood of Christ.

LAY MINISTERS: We welcome and thank our lay Communion Ministers. They serve either administering the Body of Christ or the Blood of Christ as needed. They serve in the capacity of "extra – ordinary" ministers. That is they serve "out of office" it is not their office to serve communion. It is the office of the priest and deacon; all others do so "extra" (Latin = out of) "ordinary" (Latin = office).

"Y con esta respuesta, Jesús se sitúa por encima de la polémica. Jesús siempre más allá. Por una parte, reconoce que se debe pagar el tributo al César --- también nosotros: hay que pagar los impuestos---, porque la imagen sobre la moneda es la suya; pero, sobre todo, recuerda que cada persona lleva en sí otra imagen --- la llevamos en el corazón, en el alma---, la de Dios, y por tanto es a Él, y solo a Él, a quien cada uno debe la propia existencia, la propia vida" (Papa Francisco 10/18/2020). 

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

With little more than a year until the United States' national elections, I find myself feeling, like many Catholics, both dread and energized. Dread, because our democratic republic can be a messy endeavor and campaigns a long, nasty, and unedifying slog; energized, because hope for positive societal change can be enticing and engaging. As a pastor, I see similar conflicting attitudes in those whom I serve. How can Catholics best



engage our political arena in a way which is truly helpful and worthwhile?

This weeks' gospel reading offers wisdom in this regard. Jesus says, "Render therefore to Caesar the things are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."

This riddle forces us to answer for ourselves a hidden question: what is the relationship between political and divine authority? Two common but false answers lead to mischief. If we answer that the two are equivalent, politics becomes our absolute authority. This happens whenever religion is slave to the state, as in the travesty of the pro-Nazi German Christian movement in the 1930s and 40s. It also usually occurs when there is an official state religion. If we answer that the two are totally unrelated, we end up with an unchecked aggressive secularist state as we often experience now. Thus, religion becomes a weak and private pastime.

What's a better alternative? At our best, Christians hold that political authority does indeed have its own legitimate autonomy but is nested within God's all-encompassing authority. Think, for example, of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s respect for politics while also being able to criticize unjust human laws because he recognized a higher heavenly law. In other words, Caesar owns politics — and God owns Caesar. So, we should allow Jesus' words to lead us to have a deep respect and willingness to peacefully engage in politics without making that engagement our religion. We bring our faith to bear on our politics knowing confidently that Caesar isn't God — but he is indeed God's.

He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?"






