

ON THE COVER

The First Sunday in Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year in our Christian tradition. It is a time of anticipation and preparation for the birth of Jesus Christ, symbolizing hope and renewal. As the first of four Sundays leading up to Christmas, it serves as a reminder to Christians to reflect on the significance of Christ's coming and to eagerly await his return. It is a time to light the first candle on the Advent wreath, representing the hope that Christ brings into the world. This day invites believers to center their hearts and minds on the promises and blessings of the season, while also encouraging them to embrace the spirit of giving and spreading joy to others.

ALL FAITHFUL CATHOLICS TO ATTEND MASS FOR

Sunday Dec. 24th & Monday Dec. 25th

Dec. 24th The Fourth Sunday of Advent Dec. 25th The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas)

We will have the unique opportunity this year to celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent on Dec. 24th and then immediately after that, Christmas falls on Monday, Dec. 25th. All faithful Catholics are expected to attend Mass twice that weekend. We are to attend Mass once for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and once for Christmas.

Attending Mass for the Sunday obligation may be fulfilled at the Saturday evening Mass (5:30pm) as well as at any Mass on Sunday including the evening Masses.

The Christmas Eve Masses on Dec. 24th at 4:00pm & 6:00pm & 8:00pm may serve for either Sunday or our Christmas obligation, but not both. The 4pm & 6pm Mass prayers, Scripture and music will celebrate Christmas.

Yes you may attend Mass twice on Dec. 24th. Participating in one of the regular morning or early afternoon Masses, we may also participate in any of the Christmas Eve Masses and receive communion again. In this way you have attended Mass twice that weekend, once for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and once for Christmas.

Olive wood carvings from Bethlehem & Jerusalem:

Please stop by the tables on our Welcome Plaza for beautiful HOLY LAND handicrafts (nativity sets, rosaries, statues, crucifixes) after all Masses the weekend of December 16 & 17.

The products offered through the Holy Land Handicrafts Cooperative (HLHC) represent Catholic families from Bethlehem, Jerusalem and throughout the Holy Land. These families have been dependent upon sales of their hand carved religious articles to tourists to the Holy Land. Due to the conflict in the Middle East tourism has been greatly reduced.

In order to survive, they have turned to Catholic communities in the United States to purchase their artwork: carved from wood of sacred olive trees; this work has been traditional for Christian families in the Holy Land for more than 400 years. All funds made here today will go directly to these families.

We pray to accomplish more for our Catholic community in the Holy Land. Amazingly enough, the Catholic community dropped from 22% to less than 2% in the last 20 years. We hope with this mission we can make a difference. We thank you in advance for all your support. God bless!



For Immigrants and Their Families Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe December 12

Archbishop Jose Gomez has called for a day of prayer for Immigrants and Their families on December 12th, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Reflections by Father Bill

In this confusing time we have many reasons to pray, many people are in need of our prayers. On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe we celebrate that Pope St. John Paul II declared her to be "Mother of the Americas" and it is most appropriate that we pray for all her children. As every mother's heart aches most for her children on the margin, we then honor "Our Mother" more profoundly when we pray for her children who are immigrants and others in great need.

I am personally always aware that we are today Catholic-Christians because of immigrants --- immigrants without papers, without documentation; those who some call illegal immigrants.

I am reminded that after the birth of Jesus: Joseph and Mary fled with him to Egypt, without papers. They were illegals. After our Lord's passion, death, resurrection and ascension the Apostles went from country to country, all without documents; they were mocked, hated, jailed and killed.

Since the first century missionaries have gone into many different nations without permission. Some were martyred for teaching our Catholic-Christian faith.....it has happened in every century since the first, it is happening today. And the response of the Church has been to declare them SAINTS!!!

Our own nation has a sad history of persecuting Catholics, a fact that began in the English Colonies and continues till today! In colonial days Catholics were required to pay a tax to support the Church of England. In the 18th & early 19th centuries children in public schools were taught Protestant religion with strong anti-Catholic concepts; businesses refused to hire Catholics.

Without the love, devotion and courage of these un-documented immigrants you and I would not be Catholic-Christians toady. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to the centuries of undocumented immigrants who have given us the gift of our faith.



Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe December 12th

On Dec. 12th the Church celebrates the Feast of "Our Lady of Guadalupe", that is we celebrate the apparitions of Mary at the hill of Tepeyac from Dec. 9 to Dec. 12, 1531; when she appeared to Juan Diego, a convert.

Pope Pius XII declared Our Lady of Guadalupe the "Patroness of the Americas."

Pope St. John XXIII addressed her as "Mother and Teacher of the Faith to the peoples of the Americas".

Pope St. John Paul II visited the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City in 1979 and in his homily referred to her as the "Mother of the Americas" also the "Star of Evangelization."

Pope St. John Paul II visiting the Basilica again in 1999 named Our Lady of Guadalupe the "Protectress of the Unborn" and "placed under her motherly care the innocent lives of children, especially those in danger of not being born." At the same mass Pope St. John Paul II also declared Our Lady of Guadalupe the "Mother and Evangelizer of America" (that is North America, Central America & South America).

His Holiness St. John Paul II visited her Sanctuary four times: in 1979, plus in 1990, 1999 & 2002.

El Papa San Juan XXIII se dirigió a ella como "Madre y Maestra de la fe para los pueblos de América".

El Papa San Juan Pablo II visitó la Basílica de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe en la Ciudad de México en 1979 y en su homilía se refirió a ella como la "Madre de las Américas" y también la "Estrella de la Evangelización".

El Papa San Juan Pablo II, que visitó nuevamente la Basílica en 1999, nombró a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe "Protectora de los no nacidos" y "puso bajo su cuidado maternal las vidas inocentes de los niños, especialmente aquellos en peligro de no nacer". En la misma misa, el Papa San Juan Pablo II también declaró a Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe "Madre y Evangelizadora de América" (es decir, América del Norte, América Central y América del Sur).

Su Santidad San Juan Pablo II visitó su Santuario en cuatro ocasiones: en 1979, además de en 1990, 1999 y 2002.

Achieving Peace in the Middle East

Peace is rooted in respect for all peoples, all nations, ideas, religious beliefs, races, languages and customs. For the followers Jesus Christ living his teaching of love for everyone without conditions, we realize that antisemitism and islamophobia are acts of violence, acts of terrorism against others.

We Must Condemn All

Antisemitism and Islamophobia

As Jesus himself criticized the Roman government (but not the Roman people – who he forgave and loved), we are welcomed to be critical of governments, including our own and of that of Israel and Palestine. At the same time loving all the citizens and offering our support where needed.

Our Lord never attacked people for their faith. He respected the Roman soldiers who asked for his help, he cared for the Samaritan woman at the well. There is no place in the Christian life for hating or condemning others based on their religion.

Terrorism Is a Terrible Sin

Hamas is Not a Government - Hamas is Terrorism

It is our duty to oppose terrorism. The people of the Gaza Strip have suffered greatly since Hamas took control in the last election held in 2007. Since that election they have killed opposition political leaders; they are a terrorist military organization. Hamas hides behind the innocent like cowards and uses them as human shields. Their October 7th attack on Israel was brutal, horrific beyond imagination and betrays all human decency.

FUTURE

Personally I support a two state solution, as has the Holy See (Vatican) for decades. I support Israel as well Palestine. I support a homeland for both peoples. Immediately I support more humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip. My soul rejoices in the release of hostages. I am equally thrilled at humanitarian aid reaching the people in Gaza. I daily pray for peace.

There are aspects of the Israeli government that I am very critical of, but I love and respect the people of Israel, those Jewish, Muslim and Christian. I have serious questions about the government of Palestine (West Bank and Gaza) but love and respect the people, no matter their faith. Being critical of Israel is not being anti-Jewish

and questioning the government of Palestine is not anti-Islamic.

Advent Calls Us To: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love

Advent prepares us for Christmas by calling us to live in a spirit of hope, a presence of peace, an attitude of Joy with a heart and soul of love. The message of the first Sunday of Advent is HOPE and the second Sunday that of PEACE followed by JOY on the third Sunday and of course LOVE on the fourth.

For peace in the world, we must live the life of the Prince of Peace whose birth we celebrate at Christmas. Thus we prepare in Advent to be men and women of: HOPE + PEACE + JOY + LOVE.

La confianza, la vigilancia, la hospitalidad y la esperanza. ¿Y tú, cuál otra actitud agregarías?

GOSPEL MEDITATION


Lately I've been listening to a science-based podcast on healthy daily living. The host frequently discusses the wide range of health benefits of sleep. So, each night I'm trying to get more, and better, slumber, and it's helping me feel energized. So, why in the world should we follow Christ's advice this week? "Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house will come ... lest he find you asleep." Isn't sleep, especially at midnight and cockcrow, a good thing?

Of course, it is. But the wakefulness the Lord calls us to is a deep, personal orientation to Him. A nightly vigil is therefore a metaphor for this, but it's not just that. We should give up real sleep in order to pray, too. This difficult practice is a time-tested way to foster wakefulness of heart. When we give up sleep to pray, it focuses us. We learn that life is not an endless series of days. You and I belong to the Lord — awake or asleep, in life and in death. Sooner or later, even our need for our physical sleep will pass away. And our attentiveness to God — that is, whether we are awaiting Him to meet us — will be all that matters.

May I challenge us this week and this Advent to intentionally give up at least one hour of sleep each week for prayer? Stay up later, wake up in the middle of the night, or an hour earlier, and pray. Will we be a bit more tired the next day? Yes. But we'll be amazed at the spiritual wakefulness that results, too.


