"What was my first word? Who was there when I was born? When did I start to walk? Which toys did I play with? What made me cry when I was a baby?"

My oldest has reached the age where she has started to ask questions like this. As she grows up, she is realizing that, in order to understand the world around her, she must first understand herself. This makes her insatiably curious about her own identity, her history — her "origin story," as they say in the movies.

In the way that I can tell my daughter everything there is to know about the part of her life she cannot recall, Mary can tell us everything we need to know about Christ. All we have to do is ask.

Soy la mamá. He guardado todas estas cosas en mi corazón.





ANOINTING OF THE SICK ON

SATURDAY: January 6, 2024

The faithful who desire to be anointed should attend the 8:15am Mass and immediately after Mass, the sacrament will be administered by one or more of our parish priests. It will follow Mass, with a five minute break, to allow those with other commitments to leave without interrupting the prayer of the sacrament.

WHO CAN BE ANOINTED?

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick --- is for those with a serious or chronic illness, physical, mental or emotional. It is for the baptized and normally for those over the age of reason (age 7) but for good reason young baptized children and infants can be anointed. This is not for the ordinary common illnesses we all get once or twice a year. It is for SERIOUS or CHRONIC illnesses, such as: heart disease, cancer, arthritis, emphysema, diabetes, physical disability or limitation, etc., etc. By "chronic" we mean a disease that may not be serious at the moment but will steadily grow worse (&/or never get better), such as a child or adult with asthma.

Those about to have SURGERY should be anointed. And it is encouraged that those who have reached age 65 be anointed once a year, without regard for medical condition.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD ONE BE ANOINTED?

Those with any serious or chronic illness should be anointed anytime their condition changes significantly. And again the Church lovingly encourages those 65 and over to be anointed once a year. For all others, we would recommend at least quarterly, that is every three months. We are delighted to share with you the names of the Adult who received Sacraments on November 26, on the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.





MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO La Sagrada Familia de Jesús, María y José

Como familias de fe, siempre debemos de estar abriendo caminos de esperanza, amor y paz entre nuestros miembros de la familia. Vivimos nuestra realidad con gran confianza en Dios. Luchamos cada día por ser mejores, por mantener viva la fe que nuestros padres nos han heredado. La liturgia de hoy nos dice que la Sagrada Familia de Nazaret vivió de manera sencilla, cumpliendo con sus deberes religiosos y civiles, pero siempre confiando en Dios. "Una vez que cumplieron todo lo que ordenaba la Ley del Señor, volvieron a Galilea, a su ciudad de Nazaret. El niño crecía y se desarrollaba lleno de sabiduría, y la gracia de Dios permanecía con él (Lucas 2,39-40). Si el amor, el respeto y la comprensión están presente en la familia, los niños crecen en sabiduría y gracia. ¿Cómo está mi familia en términos de escucha y acompañamiento?

"En cada familia hay problemas, y a veces también se discute. Padre me he peleado...; somos humanos, somos débiles, y todos tenemos a veces este hecho de que peleamos en la familia. Os diré una cosa: si nos peleamos en familia, que no termine el día sin hacer las paces. Si, he discutido, pero antes que termine el día, haz las paces. Y sabes ¿por qué? Porque la guerra fría del día siguiente es muy peligrosa. No ayuda. Y luego, en la familia hay tres palabras, tres palabras que hay que custodiar siempre: Permiso, gracias, perdón (Papa Francisco 12/27/2020). ¿Qué debo trabajar en mi familia para vivir en armonía?



GOSPEL MEDITATION

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph


I remember the first time my older sister asked me if I wanted to hold her newborn son. Terrified, I told her I didn't think it was a good idea. My résumé had nothing to suggest I would be a qualified baby holder. But she warmly told me, "I'll help you hold him." It struck me that she is baby's mother. She is the one who decides who is qualified to hold him. I took him in my arms and soon I began to feel comfortable with that tiny little warm cooing creature in my arms, and soon I no longer feared holding him. Now, twenty-seven nieces and nephews later, holding a newborn child is one of the great joys of my life.

Do we sometimes think that Jesus is given only to the highly qualified, special religious people? In the Gospel of Luke today we hear about the presentation of the Lord in the temple. The newborn son of God is passed around like a baton in a relay race, not guarded like a precious jewel or a breakable china dish. We can see him going from the arms of Mary to Joseph, then to the priest performing the ceremony, then to Simeon the old man, then to Anna the old widow. Each one receiving him and then handing him to the next. A tidal wave of joy and thanksgiving follows wherever he is placed.

Believe me, you are qualified to hold Jesus in your arms. How can I say that with such confidence? Because the mother decides who is qualified. The Blessed Virgin, embodied in the Church, holds him out to you and me. She rejoices to place him in our arms to hold, and to hand him on, too.


