# TRIDUUM + THE THREE DAYS Holy Thursday + Good Friday + Holy Saturday Mass of the Lord's Supper + Passion The Great Easter Vigil YOU ARE INVITED

Each of these three days, known as the TRIDU-UM, is one celebration of Passion, Death & Resurrection. In the life of the Church there are no other days more important, no other time as special as the TRIDUUM. It is one celebration, one liturgy, one act of worship that is three days long celebrating the most special and most holy days of our Christian faith.

On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper with the Washing of the Feet and then procession of the Eucharist to an Altar of Repose (in Hall) where we are invited to remain in adoration till midnight. All this recalls Our Lord's Last Supper, giving us the Eucharist, washing the feet of the Disciples, and His agony in the garden. When the Blessed Sacrament is removed at midnight we are reminded of His arrest.

**On Good Friday**, the Passion reaches its climax in the death of Jesus on the Cross. We mourn, we ache, we enter into the pain, sadness and fear of Mary the Mother of God and that of the Disciples.

On Holy Saturday, at first we wait, still accompanying Mary and the Disciples in their pain and confusion. Then in the darkness of Holy Saturday night we celebrate the Resurrection of the Light of the World who dispels all darkness. In the light, we Baptize, we Confirm and we celebrate First Eucharist with new members of our Catholic-Christian faith.

Of these three days no one day is more important. Each day is an important part of one celebration of hope, peace and eternal life. The Eucharist of Holy Thursday gives us hope. His death on Good Friday gives Him peace and us the promise of His peace. The Resurrection of Holy Saturday night, brought to climax in the early morning darkness of Sunday, gives us eternal life. Without any one of these, there cannot be any of the others.

Good Friday is a very popular day as the sufferings of Christ have touched lives of so many people. The highpoint of Good Friday spiritually is the celebration of the Solemn Liturgical Service and within that service the Passion Gospel of John, the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. Please remember

that Good Friday is more complete, more meaningful when we celebrate Holy Thursday and the Great Easter Vigil of Holy Saturday.

We invite you to celebrate with us the whole TRIDUUM. Come join us for one worship, one prayer, in the one Lord and one Church. Please accompany our parish family throughout our celebration of Holy Thursday & Good Friday & Holy Saturday.

#### **ANOINTING OF THE SICK ON**

SATURDAY: February 3, 2024

The faithful who desire to be anointed should attend the 8:15am Mass and immediately after Mass, the sacrament will be administered by one or more of our parish priests. It will follow Mass, with a five minute break, to allow those with other commitments to leave without interrupting the prayer of the sacrament.

#### WHO CAN BE ANOINTED?

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick --- is for those with a serious or chronic illness, physical, mental or emotional. It is for the baptized and normally for those over the age of reason (age 7) but for good reason young baptized children and infants can be anointed. This is not for the ordinary common illnesses we all get once or twice a year. It is for SERIOUS or CHRONIC illnesses, such as: heart disease, cancer, arthritis, emphysema, diabetes, physical disability or limitation, etc., etc. By "chronic" we mean a disease that may not be serious at the moment but will steadily grow worse (&/or never get better), such as a child or adult with asthma.

Those about to have SURGERY should be anointed. And it is encouraged that those who have reached age 65 be anointed once a year, without regard for medical condition.

#### HOW OFTEN SHOULD ONE BE ANOINTED?

Those with any serious or chronic illness should be anointed anytime their condition changes significantly. And again the Church lovingly encourages those 65 and over to be anointed once a year. For all others, we would recommend at least quarterly, that is every three months.

#### PARISH CENTER SPECIAL HOURS Holy Thursday + Good Friday + Holy Saturday + Easter Sunday

The most holy days of the Church year is a three day period called the Triduum, and consist of: Holy Thursday + Good Friday + Holy Saturday and then by extension Easter Sunday, this period is also called the Easter Triduum. It is important that all Christians spend these days in prayer, reflection and study of the Scriptures.

To better provide for that and to better set an example to all the faithful we are going to close our parish offices early those three days (Holy Thursday + Good Friday & Holy Saturday) to allow our staff and volunteer leadership the proper time for prayer.

On Easter Sunday we will close all day, to allow our staff to spend this beautiful day with their families. We all deserve this day of Resurrection as a family day, to love and support our families. We will reopen for regular hours on Easter Monday (the day after Easter).

#### HOLY SATURDAY EASTER VIGIL March 30, 2024 + 8:00pm

One of the most ancient traditions of the Church is the celebration of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. There is no Mass that morning, only this magnificent liturgy late in the evening, near to or just after nightfall (darkness). This ancient and unique Mass lasts about 3 hours and includes blessings done only once a year and only at this Mass. It is considered the most important and most holy Mass of the Church year. Come and join us for the "First Celebration of Easter, The Great Easter Vigil". And yes it counts for Sunday!

#### EASTER SUNDAY March 31, 2024

On Easter Sunday we will have 7 Masses in the parish church (5 in English & 1 in Spanish) plus 4 additional Masses in Cavanagh Hall (3 in English & 1 in Spanish). Masses in the Hall are most beautiful and spiritually uplifting with spectacular decorations and music, equal to any in the church, but a smaller congregation and plenty of extra seating. 


#### **OBSERVANCES FOR THE WEEK**

#### 2ND SUNDAY OF LENT

As a college student, my prized possession was an after-market car stereo. It was my pride and joy: glorious audio, eye-catching display screen, and multi-disc CD changer. It drained my hard-earned dollars, but it was totally worth it. It drenched me in music everywhere I drove. On Ash Wednesday of my senior year of college, Father Tom, the Jesuit priest at my university said, "Pray for God to tell you what he wants you to sacrifice for Lent." I did. In my heart, the answer came: "Give



up listening to your car stereo for forty days." I winced. Not possible, I thought. Can't do it. I made other plans. The next morning, I was stunned to find that my car had been broken into, and my fancy stereo ripped out and stolen.

God's command to sacrifice what we love is no joke. This week in Genesis 22, God says: "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love — Isaac — and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you." Believe me, I know. We like to be in control. It chaffs us that God sets the terms of what we must sacrifice, and how. But this is no impersonal, tyrannical process. Remember that God uses their names, Abraham and Isaac. God knows each one of us and the precious gifts He commands us to offer. Finally, our sacrifices are for our own good. Do we trust this enough to do what Father Tom asked me to do?

Lenten challenge: This week, I dare you to ask God: "What do you want me to give up?" He may ask for that which you love most. It will be something precious to you: time, money, a relationship, a dream, an opportunity. What matters is we trust Him and act sacrificially in line with His command. Whatever we sacrifice will of course come back to us as surely as the Risen Jesus — but that doesn't make it easy.


