

TRIDUUM + THE THREE DAYS Holy Thursday + Good Friday + Holy Saturday Mass of the Lord's Supper + Passion The Great Easter Vigil

YOU ARE INVITED

Each of these three days, known as the TRIDU-UM, is one celebration of Passion, Death & Resurrection. In the life of the Church there are no other days more important, no other time as special as the TRIDUUM. It is one celebration, one liturgy, one act of worship that is three days long celebrating the most special and most holy days of our Christian faith.

On Holy Thursday we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper with the Washing of the Feet and then procession of the Eucharist to an Altar of Repose (in Hall) where we are invited to remain in adoration till midnight. All this recalls Our Lord's Last Supper, giving us the Eucharist, washing the feet of the Disciples, and His agony in the garden. When the Blessed Sacrament is removed at midnight we are reminded of His arrest.

On Good Friday, the Passion reaches its climax in the death of Jesus on the Cross. We mourn, we ache, we enter into the pain, sadness and fear of Mary the Mother of God and that of the Disciples.

On Holy Saturday, at first we wait, still accompanying Mary and the Disciples in their pain and confusion. Then in the darkness of Holy Saturday night we celebrate the Resurrection of the Light of the World who dispels all darkness. In the light, we Baptize, we Confirm and we celebrate First Eucharist with new members of our Catholic-Christian faith.

Of these three days no one day is more important. Each day is an important part of one celebration of hope, peace and eternal life. The Eucharist of Holy Thursday gives us hope. His death on Good Friday gives Him peace and us the promise of His peace. The Resurrection of Holy Saturday night, brought to climax in the early morning darkness of Sunday, gives us eternal life. Without any one of these, there cannot be any of the others.

Good Friday is a very popular day as the sufferings of Christ have touched lives of so many people. The highpoint of Good Friday spiritually is the celebration of the Solemn Liturgical Service and within that service the Passion Gospel of John, the Veneration of the Cross and Holy Communion. Please remember

that Good Friday is more complete, more meaningful when we celebrate Holy Thursday and the Great Easter Vigil of Holy Saturday.

We invite you to celebrate with us the whole TRIDUUM. Come join us for one worship, one prayer, in the one Lord and one Church. Please accompany our parish family throughout our celebration of Holy Thursday & Good Friday & Holy Saturday.

HOLY SATURDAY EASTER VIGIL March 30, 2024 + 8:00pm

One of the most ancient traditions of the Church is the celebration of the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night. There is no Mass that morning, only this magnificent liturgy late in the evening, near to or just after nightfall (darkness). This ancient and unique Mass lasts about 3 hours and includes blessings done only once a year and only at this Mass. It is considered the most important and most holy Mass of the Church year. Come and join us for the "First Celebration of Easter, The Great Easter Vigil". And yes it counts for Sunday!

EASTER SUNDAY March 31, 2024

On Easter Sunday we will have 7 Masses in the parish church (5 in English & 1 in Spanish) plus 4 additional Masses in Cavanagh Hall (3 in English & 1 in Spanish). Masses in the Hall are most beautiful and spiritually uplifting with spectacular decorations and music, equal to any in the church, but a smaller congregation and plenty of extra seating. Cuando se retira el Santísimo Sacramento a medianoche, recordamos Su arresto.

El Viernes Santo, la Pasión alcanza su clímax con la muerte de Jesús en la Cruz. Estamos de luto, nos duele, entramos en el dolor, la tristeza y el temor de María Madre de Dios y el de los Discípulos.

El Sábado de Gloria, al principio esperamos, todavía acompañamos a María y a los Discípulos en su dolor y confusión. Luego en la oscuridad de la noche del Sábado Santo celebramos la Resurrección de la Luz del Mundo que disipa toda oscuridad. En la luz, Bautizamos, Confirmamos y celebramos la Primera Eucaristía con los nuevos miembros de nuestra fe católico-cristiana.

De estos tres días ninguno es más importante. Cada día es una parte importante de una celebración de esperanza, paz y vida eterna. La Eucaristía del Jueves Santo nos da esperanza. La Resurrección de la noche del Sábado de Gloria, llevada a su clímax en la oscuridad de la madrugada del domingo, nos da vida eterna. 



RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The Merciful Anger of Jesus

Watch your fellow churchgoers today as the priest or deacon reads the story of Jesus raising hell (or perhaps he's raising heaven?) in the temple square. Dollars to donuts, they'll be squirming.

As Catholics, we have become very uncomfortable with Angry Jesus. He makes us cringe in the same way that the Old Testament God does when He calls Himself "jealous" and talks about punishment. That level of intensity makes us recoil. If it were present in a human relationship, it would be toxic and abusive, because in humanity, fierceness and love rarely coexist in a healthy way.

But what a tragedy it would be for us to mistake our relationship with God for our relationship with our spouse, our best friend, or even our human father. Because we cannot see clearly, we would mistake His zeal for anger and His law for diktat.

The strong and sure movement of a wave against a rocky cliff will, over time, erode its surface, just as an overabundance of raindrops will flood a city. We do not call the water callous and cruel. We still luxuriate in its coolness and refreshment. Its destructive powers don't negate the life-giving properties of water. We do not demand that water apologize to us for being strong.

Fierce, uncompromising — but also, soft and merciful. How can God — and God's law — be both, at the same time? How can Christ cast a whip at someone's foot, overturn a table and scatter coins? How can the law of God be perfect, as the Psalm says, and refresh the soul — while demanding so much of it?

All I can say is, thank God for Angry Jesus. We need his fierceness and thank God it does not wane because it confuses us. Thank God his mercy does not decrease because we doubt it.

"For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." — 1 Corinthians 1:25

GOSPEL MEDITATION

I am the Lord your God ... You shall not have other gods beside me. —Ex 20:2-3

One of the greatest golfers of all time — if not the greatest — was Jack Nicklaus. Which is why it is baffling that at the beginning of each season he would return to his childhood coach and re-learn how to grip



the golf club. It's like Shakespeare re-learning the alphabet and grammar. Why would he do that? Because Jack knew that the fundamentals are always relevant. Perfecting and obsessing over his grip allowed him to do everything else in the game well. In sports and life, the best ones love the basics.

Similarly, as we begin Lent, we re-learn the spiritual basics in the Ten Commandments. Consider the first, to "have no other gods besides me." This is our "grip." Is our connection to God one of absolute fidelity and exclusive worship? Am I willing to let go of my precious idols, the things I cling to instead of God? Once we say "yes" to this fundamental question of our spiritual "grip," then we are ready to properly engage with everything else in life. Watch how beautifully the game of life unfolds in the next nine commandments (numbered in parentheses): how we speak to God and others (2 and 8), how we organize our week (3), how we relate to our family (4) and the wider community (5 and 7), how we live our sexuality (6), and how we order all the other desires of the human heart (9 and 10). But don't rush to these later Commandments too soon! Everything in life is built on the first Commandment. The more we focus on worshiping God alone, the better we navigate the complexity of life with panache, effectiveness, and love.

Lenten challenge: This week, identify what you can do to better worship God alone. If you're not sure, scan the last nine commandments to identify what you are most likely to worship instead of God. Power, pleasure, control of your time, possessions, family, health, reputation, money? Commit to concrete action to help you let go of this "idol" to better hold on to God alone in faithful worship. Remember: the best love the basics.

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
