

COVID-19 Vaccination

With the inevitability of the QLD borders opening again soon to interstate and overseas visitors, the wardens feel that it is reasonable at this time to highlight to everyone Bishop Keith's Statement on Vaccines. This can be found on the diocesan website, here, and also on the noticeboard at the entrance of the church. However, there is also an extract below:

"It has been widely reported that many Christians in North Queensland are hesitant to receive vaccinations, especially against COVID-19. There is much misinformation and misuse of the Bible. However the proper understanding of scripture should encourage you to receive the vaccines, for your own benefit and to protect your families and neighbours.

In scripture God encourages us to make use of medicine as a cure for our ills. ... Coronavirus kills people; the vaccine is a protection against it. Like all good medicines, vaccines are ultimately a gift to protect us.

However some people spread false news about the vaccine. They especially use the Internet to spread fake news and conspiracy theories that are known to be false. Do not listen to such falsehoods;...

Some other people will tell you just to trust in prayer and miracles. As Christians we believe fervently in prayer and know that God intervenes in many unexpected ways. However as Christians we are also told to use our brains and reasoning (Luke 14.28-32). Miracles are not everyday occurrences; when they happen they occur to demonstrate God's power (John 9.1-3), not just to give us what we want... Likewise with sickness. We do not usually rely on miracles. We also have to work for it ourselves by living healthy lives. We rely on others – doctors, nurses, pharmacists, medical scientists – to help treat us and look after us and supply us with medicine. And we live healthy lives and take vaccines not just to help ourselves, but also our family and neighbours. The more people who are vaccinated, then it is harder for the virus to find someone to infect....

If you are a Christian, you above all are commanded to love God and love your neighbour (Matthew 22. 37-40). So get vaccinated, if not for yourself, then for your neighbour. Look after yourself and your community. This we commend to you, in the name of our loving and Holy Trinity, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen."
