**Roof updates:**

The church roof tiles have been removed and it was discovered that all of the tectum needs to be replaced due to water damage and bird destruction. In changing the sound and insulation tectum we will also be changing the 6x8 cross-trusses to new glulam's which will provide additional strength to the new roof.

This additional work will cost approximately \$140,000 more than the original bid of \$211,000.

Therefore our new goal will be to raise the additional \$140,000 through generous donations and fundraising this year.

**Faith Formation Corner:**

**Faith and Obedience-** My husband Kevin and I were conversing the other day, particularly about the apparitions of Mary. He asked me why does Mary appear to children and the poor? I answered perhaps it is because these children are innocent, trusting, poor, and humble. I have occasionally considered Kevin's question, prior to his asking me, and I have a sense that children, in their innocence have more faith than adults. I also be-

lieve there is an immense amount of humility in the faith of little ones; because of their humility and innocence, they are the perfect people for our Christ, and Mother to appear to. In contrast, when you consider what Saul had to experience in order to be converted to the truth, I would prefer to have the innocence of a child. Saul truly believed he was right in the condemnation and killing of Christians; it took literal blindness, a message from Jesus himself, and the experience of forced vulnerability to believe in Christ!!

Saul, although misdirected and very wrong, had great faith in his own belief system of Pharisaic law, but Jesus saw something of Saul's great faith and made use of this because later we see how Saul's conversion directed his path to be Paul who spread the message of our salvation worldwide. Jesus himself took something so terrible and used it for our good.

With the age of the children Mary has appeared to, they are typically, although not always, young, and they blindly trust "this beautiful lady." If you follow any of the reports of their experiences, we see the fruit of their obedience and trust is the increased healing and faith of so many people, within their communities and globally. With Paul, we continue to be the recipients of Paul's messages from his letters, and the fruit of his works are what we study today in our Catholic faith. Notice while these occurrences of Paul's messages and Mary's apparitions are in different time periods, there seems to be timelessness in how they are brought to us, the Church. And we are shown how to live the faith and live in obedience with Truth itself.

After reading about the many apparitions of our Mother, and the conversion of Saul, it seems obvious that both obedience and faith are required for our spiritual well-being and balance. Jesus says, several times during his ministry, while healing, that **Faith** has healed, or saved, or freed the victim from their illness, disorders, etc. In addition, our Lord himself models, to the very end, his **obedience** to the Father. It is **his obedience** to the Father which makes him so "well-pleased" with his Son.

Sometimes, in my deepest longings, I wish to see our Lord or our Mama Mary, but I know I am too much of the world. I am too difficult to work with, so I know my faith journey requires on-going, consistent interior work. I have to struggle. It's not a pity party, it's a fact. I have a lot to learn with obedience. There is much to break down in my person, so Thank God for his patience! I can tell you with full conviction that thankfully God has been working on me for as long as I can remember!

So onward, and upward, always upward, toward the Cross, toward the Father. I pray my journey continues to deepen my faith and increase my obedience toward God. How about you? Where are you? We have so many options at St. Michael's to do both. Give me a call and let's journey together. Blessings, Roz

### Gospel Reflection:

*Mark 4:26–34*

The reign of God is like a mustard seed.

After Lent, the Easter season, and three Sundays of feast days— Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity, and Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—the Church returns to Ordinary Time. This Sunday’s Gospel from Mark carries a significant message regarding faith and the Kingdom of God.

In Mark’s Gospel, Jesus appears reluctant to reveal his identity as the Son of God. After performing miracles of healing, he warns those cured to tell no one (see Mark 1:44, 3:12, 5:43, 7:36, and 8:26). Also, when preaching, Jesus chooses to speak to the crowds in parables, leaving them to discern his message. Only to his disciples does he explain the parable’s meaning, and he does this in private at a later time.

Today’s Gospel Reading consists of two parables about seeds. In the first, Jesus tells those gathered that this is “how it is with the kingdom of God.” A man scatters seed which over time sprouts and develops. Then when the grain is ripe, the man harvests his crop. The emphasis in the parable is on the seed, which seemingly has the power to grow on its own. In this it is like the Kingdom of God. While on earth, Jesus planted the seeds of the kingdom by his life, miracles, teaching, and suffering. However, the kingdom is not yet fully established.

Although already present in Jesus and his group of twelve, it has yet to come to fruition; just as the seed in the parable needs time to grow, so does God’s kingdom.

The second parable focuses on the tiny mustard seed. Though not the smallest of all seeds, it is most likely the smallest that a first-century farmer in Jesus’ part of the world would have sown. Small as the mustard seed is, it develops into a tree. Though the mustard tree generally averages only nine to twelve feet in height, it has a wide expanse and provides a nesting place for birds. Just as the tree welcomes the birds, so is God’s kingdom welcoming and open to many.

These parables help us discern something about the kingdom of God and our own faith. In God we live and move and have our being, but God is a mystery and his kingdom, though present, has not yet come into its fullness. Today, the Kingdom of God is present in the Church. The mission of proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom given to the Apostles is now given to us. But just as seeds need time to come to fruition, so does the Kingdom of God. That is why in the Lord’s Prayer, we pray, “thy kingdom come.” We know that it will come in its fullness at the end of time. All we need is faith.

### Family Connection

Church documents call the Christian family the “domestic church.” This is

both a compliment and a call to commitment. Because the family is a community formed in love and dedicated to the physical and spiritual growth of its members, it is a miniature version of the Kingdom of God on earth. This Sunday’s Gospel Reading, Mark 4:26–34, consists of two parables that Jesus used to help us discern the mystery of the Kingdom of God. The beginning of the kingdom is compared to a tiny seed that over time matures and ripens. Many of the things we do within the family seem insignificant. They are part of our daily activity and attract little attention. Yet they show our love and concern for one another. According to the Gospel, it’s these small things that yield big results, acting as significant contributions to the growth of God’s kingdom on earth. The growth of the seed illustrates the nature and the results of a strong faith.

Read aloud together the Gospel of Mark 4:26–34. Consider how your family’s concerns reflect the Church’s concerns for those members who are poor, forgotten, hungry, ill, shunned, or lonely. Together think of a specific action that you can do to assist a person in your extended family, neighborhood, or parish. Now pray together the Lord’s Prayer, pausing briefly to consider the import of the words “thy kingdom come.” Each evening this week as you gather for supper, share with one another the simple acts of love you witnessed within the family that day.
