





Respect Life Ministry:

The constant teaching of the Catholic Church from her very begin ning, the repeated exhortations of every Pope in recent times up to and including Pope Francis, the frequent statements by the bishops of the United States, all make it clear what the teaching of the Catholic Church is in regard to abortion. When public figures identify themselves as Catholics and yet actively oppose one of the most fundamental doctrines of the Church—the inherent dignity of each and every human being and therefore the absolute prohibition of taking innocent human life—we pastors have a responsibility both to them and to the rest of our people. Our responsibility to them is to call them to conversion and to warn them that if they do not amend their lives they must answer before the tribunal of God for the innocent blood that has been shed. Our responsibility to the rest of the Catholic community is to assure them that the Church of Jesus Christ does take most seriously her mission to care for "the least of these," as Our Lord has commanded us, and to correct Catholics who erroneously, and sometimes stubbornly, promote abortion.

Faith Formation Corner:

Signs? –Is anyone confused by what is going on before our very eyes? What is going on?

Sign 1? I would be remiss if I did not comment on the current status of our nation. I am no politician, but I am seriously concerned about how our President, the Commander-in-Chief could be okay with what has just happened regarding Afghanistan. I have not personally served in the US Military either, but, my paternal grandfather died in WWII serving the United States; my father served in the US Air Force for 20 years which included a wonderful tour in the Vietnam War for over a year – he did not return the same; my husband served for four years in the US Air Force placing us right smack dab in the middle of Desert Storm; and finally, my youngest daughter currently serves in the US Navy as a physician, and has just spent over a year in an unknown area of the Pacific Ocean, keeping peace and providing protection for other countries. So, when I hear of 13 of our nation's service members dying – needlessly, it hits home. and it hits deep. I am sure I am not alone. In addition, while I feel strongly about always praying for our leaders, especially our President, his response to the Afghan situation and the deaths therein leave me feeling shocked. And confused. What is okay about leaving Americans, much less American allies to die at the hands of known terrorists? Nothing is.

Sign 2? The Caldor and Dixie fires are not as contained as hoped, thrusting more of our firefighters into harm's way, not to mention the immense damage to our land – literally. Plus, the amount of people who have been left homeless, or displaced, add to the amount of people still recovering from the Paradise and Santa Rosa fires.

Sign 3? We are currently experiencing a drought, not a good thing anywhere, but truly in the "food bowl" of the nation, the Central Valley, a profound problem.

Sign 4? Covid-19 – a serious health concern that has been the reason the Human Race has become de-stabilized. It has affected the way we live in ways no one in the past 50 years could have ever imagined.

Sign 5? Haiti Earthquake? Wait, first, their President was assassinated, then the earthquake hit. And as though that wasn't enough, they get hit with a hurricane that causes more damage; more loss, more grief, etc.

Sign 6? Louisiana was just recently hit with a Level 5 hurricane.

Sign 7? According to the Pew Research Center, the Catholic faith is the fastest loosing religion. Overall, other denominations are also losing members, but we, as Catholics, are out in front. I don't know about you, but I haven't met very many "newbies" in the last few years. Have you?

Sign 8? Have you noticed the Cannabis dispensaries? The lines are out the door? Please I mean no disrespect to those who legitimately hold a medicinal card, but the people who are in those lines are predominantly between 20-35 years of age!

There are more, but I can't think of them all, plus I know that won't help this writing. So why did I place a question mark after the eight "Signs?" Because I believe that God uses signs to speak to us, and I do not believe in coincidences. Nor do I believe that God "makes bad things happen to us." So, again, what is happening? Anybody else wondering about all these "signs?" I wonder if we are being allowed to see what happens when sin and evil join together.

First, we live in a fallen world, thanks to Adam and Eve. And Man's passions have run rampant, with fallout in every aspect of life, our children, our extended families, our environment, our food sources, our educational systems, our finances, our jobs, and that list goes on. People may call it change, that this is normal to the movement of time. I don't believe that. I think we can no longer outrun the effect of sin, our selfishness, our self-centeredness, our entitlement; we are at the end of "leaning on our own understanding, and not turning to God for our direction." These "signs" should be alerting us, we should be paying attention so that we turn ourselves back to God. Maybe then, and only then, might we be able to curtail ourselves and our brothers and sisters from becoming trapped in this path of self- destruction. What do we need to do? I believe we get back to basics; like serious basics; the Ten Commandments, attend weekly, if not daily Mass, read our Bibles, learn the depth of your faith, and finally, Love. Love always. Love when it's hard, love when it hurts, love when you don't want to. Just love. So, my brothers and sisters in Christ, let's get LOVING. Blessings, Roz

Gospel Reflection:

Mark 7:31-37

Jesus restores a man's hearing and speech.

Today we continue to hear the Gospel of Mark proclaimed. In today's reading, Jesus heals a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment. This is a story about Jesus' healing power, and in it we find clues about our understanding of sacrament. We are struck by the physical means used to heal the man, the use of spittle and touch. The Church continues to celebrate the sacraments using physical means. In the Sacrament of Baptism, water and oil are used to show the power of the Holy Spirit. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, we are anointed with holy oil on the forehead and the hands. In the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. We are a sacramental people who believe that God's grace is given to us through these physical signs.

Some, however, see in this Gospel ar image of the proclamation of the good news of Jesus to the Gentiles. The geographic references tell us that Jesus is journeying through Gentile territory. Jesus had previously visited this region and healed a person possessed by a demon. Jesus was already famous there, which explains

why people brought the deaf man to him. The story that precedes this reading in Mark's Gospel sets the stage. Jesus encounters a Gentile, a Syrophoenician woman who asks him to heal her demon-possessed daughter. Jesus engages her in a dialogue about not feeding to dogs the food intended for children. Jesus is struck by the woman's great faith when she replies that even dogs eat the food that falls from the table, and he heals her daughter immediately. The faith of this Greek woman compels Jesus to respond to her plea.

Mark shows that Jesus' own mission the Gentiles. This was a significant issue to the early Christian community, which found that the good news of Jesus took root and spread quickly feels to be the sick person being among the Gentiles. Yet there is an irony in the story of healing that Mark tells. Jesus gives the man the gift of speech, but then tells him not to use it. Jesus asks that the news of his healing power, which is evidence friends could not honor Jesus' reof his identity as the Messiah, not be spread. This is a recurring motif in Mark's Gospel and is sometimes called the "messianic secret."

Family Connection

Today's Gospel invites us to consider how we witness the healing presence of Christ in our care for and ministry to those who are sick. We

notice that the deaf man is brought to Jesus for healing by his friends. These people beg Jesus to lay his hands on this deaf man so that he might be healed. Jesus' healing power is shown in his opening of the man's ears and the restoring of his speech. When family members care for one another when they are sick, they bring Christ's healing presence. When we pray for those who are ill, we ask God to show his healing power. When health is restored, we share that good news with others.

As you gather as a family, recall a time when a family member was ill. affirms the early Church's mission to What steps were taken to help restore this family member to health? Talk about what it feels like to care for a person who is ill, and about how it cared for. In today's Gospel, we hear about a time when Jesus healed a man who was deaf. Read today's Gospel, Mark 7:31-37. Notice how the man who was cured and his quest to keep quiet about Jesus' power to heal. We continue to celebrate Jesus' healing presence in our lives by giving thanks to God for the gift of healing and health. Conclude in prayer, thanking Jesus for the gifts of health and healing. Pray together for those who are sick. After each person is named, pray, "Jesus, heal us."

Let them be filled with patience and joy in your presence as they wait for your healing touch. Please restore your servants to full health, dear Father. Remove all fear and doubt from their hearts by the power of your Holy Spirit, and may you, Lord, be glorified through their life, Amen."
