



Respect Life Ministry:

"Because an embryo is a unique and developing human organism, it follows that she or he possesses an inherent right to life from the moment of conception. Thus, the violent invasion of the act of abortion ends a human life. Likewise, those contraceptives which prevent the implantation of the embryo are in fact abortifacients that kill an innocent, growing human being." *Before I Formed You in the Womb I Knew You*, by Most Reverent Salvatore Cortileone, Archbishop of San Francisco.

Ministerio Respeto a la Vida:

Faith Formation Corner:

Obedience – What does this mean in the context of our Catholic faith? I am sure there are different aspects of obedience in our faith, such as our Pastors shepherding their parish flocks in "obedience" to the Bishop. The obedience I choose to consider here, is "obedience" to the Lord. This type of life-altering response can bring different reactions from our brothers and sisters in Christ.

I often have wondered about the emphasis of having a personal relationship with Christ. Make no mistake, I am not in anyway saying that we shouldn't have a personal relationship with our Christ. In fact, we should. . . . absolutely. Why? We need to have a personal relationship with Jesus because our very lives depend on it. The term "obedience" reminds me of the Wedding at Cana. If you remember what happened, Mary spoke of obedience. After she saw that the hosts of the wedding ran out of wine, she informed her son about the problem. If you recall his response, he responded to his mother that it was not his time (to perform his 1st miracle). Mother Mary did what any good Jewish mother would do, and she listened to her son and then told the servants to "do what he tells you to do." That sounds like a statement of obedience to me. Those words are the last words Mary speaks throughout the entire New

Testament. Those words are heavy words. I believe that statement was meant for us too.

I wonder, did Mary know that the Christ would leave her to us, the world? Either way, the direction is clear: "We are to do what He tells us to do." What does Jesus tell us to do? Well, the 10 Commandments are a good start. Then we have the Beatitudes, and the new commandment: "Love the Lord with your whole heart, mind, and strength, *and* your brother *as* you love yourself." These are pretty clear. I said "clear," not simple. Being a Catholic is extremely hard; but because of our Church Doctors, the saints that have preceded us, the Marian apparitions from all the various locations, the private revelations, and our strong Catholic doctrine and theology, we can continue to stand strong. . . if we obey Him, the Christ.

So, how does having a personal relationship with Jesus connect to obedience? It is only in having a personal relationship with Jesus that we can truly hear his voice; his direction for us. In having this relationship, we can more easily discern what it is that Jesus wants us to do, especially in the midst of the loud, demanding, and insistent voices in this world. If we don't maintain a personal relationship with the Christ, we cannot possibly obey Him!! We then become vulnerable to the aforementioned voices that definitely can lead us astray. In fact, I would contend that it is only "in Christ" that we can follow the "narrow road" of faith, which ultimately leads us to eternal Heaven.

Recently, I have had to get myself straight again. The world as I know it to be seems to be crumbling, both externally and in the world of my domestic church. Anyone else experiencing this in their lives? Our only recourse? Obey Jesus. He is the only answer ever. He is the only one who I know loves me more than life itself, I need only look at the crucifix to see exactly that. He is the only one who cares more for my soul, than for anything else. He is the only perfection that calls kindly and lovingly. He is Life itself. Any obedience to this Christ=Life, only increases my life in eternity, if I should be so fortunate. If the path with him leads me toward something hard, difficult, sorrowful, it is only to draw me closer to him so that we can be united. In being united with Christ is the only way to get through this thing on earth we call Life. So yes, obedience; but only to Him. Mary said so, and if Mama says so, we better do it. Blessings, Roz

Forming the Faith by Kennedy:

As a young kid, faith was hard to understand even though I went to church, went to catechism every Wednesday etc. Not until after I got my Confirmation in 8th grade did I really discover my connection with God. It was something about the Bishop's homily/ words and ceremony that brought me closer with the church. I felt in that hour and a half I had matured so quickly and took the responsibility of my faith instantly. After that special milestone, it encouraged me every day to pray, read daily reflections and attentively listen to church. I learned faith isn't something to be forced, it's a connection that takes time to discover, it's a choice to accept God.

Gospel Reflection:

Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48
Jesus teaches that whoever is not against him is for him.

Today we continue to read from the Gospel of Mark. Recall that last week we heard Jesus chastise his disciples for their argument about who among them was the greatest. Jesus taught them that the greatest among them will be those who serve the least ones. In today’s Gospel, the disciple John questions Jesus about an unknown exorcist who was driving out demons in Jesus’ name. John’s question might have been motivated by jealousy. Previously in Mark’s Gospel, Jesus healed a boy whom the disciples had been unable to heal. John’s question is further evidence that the disciples have not yet grasped Jesus’ words to them. They continue to compare themselves to others who seem to have greater healing powers, and they do not want to share the power of Jesus’ name with others.

Today the demon possession described in the Gospels might be seen as a form of mental illness, but the need for healing these syndromes was as real then as it is now. Exorcism was a common practice in first-century Palestine. Some people had the power to heal the symptoms of

possession. One of the strategies used was to invoke the name of a person or figure who was believed to have the power to heal.

The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus’ name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognized the power of Jesus’ name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus. In his reply to his disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus’ healing powers with others.

Later in this Gospel, Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith. The Greek word used here for sin also connotes “stumbling” or “causing scandal.” In vivid terms Jesus teaches his disciples the consequences to those who would put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith.

Family Connection

The second part of today’s Gospel contains a strong message for those who share the responsibility of fostering faith. It is indeed an awesome responsibility. Today’s Gospel reminds us that faith is a lifelong journey toward God. We don’t always

get it all or even get it right. But we pray for the grace to acknowledge and build upon even the smallest signs of faith, in ourselves and in others. There are plenty of obstacles that might prevent the growth of faith. Let us pray that we are not contributing to the obstacles that might hinder another person’s faith in Jesus.

As you gather as a family, observe that there are things in our lives that nurture our faith and things that can hinder it. Talk about some of the things that nurture our faith—healthy family relationships, healthy friendships, good literature, and so on. Name some of the things that might be an obstacle to faith—unhealthy relationships, scandals, and so on. Observe that Jesus teaches us in today’s Gospel that we are to do everything we can to help one another have faith in Jesus and do all that we can to avoid creating obstacles that might hinder another person’s faith. Read together today’s Gospel, Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48. Conclude by praying together that we will be a family that helps each other grow in faith. Pray together today’s psalm, Psalm 19, or the Lord’s Prayer.

Let them be filled with patience and joy in your presence as they wait for your healing touch. Please restore your servants to full health, dear Father. Remove all fear and doubt from their hearts by the power of your Holy Spirit, and may you, Lord, be glorified through their life, Amen.” *Deja que se llenen de paciencia y alegría en tu presencia mientras esperan tu toque sanador.
