

Putting God to the Test

always thought of the temptations in the desert as part of Jesus' growth in "wisdom, age, and grace" (Luke 2:52). They show how Jesus was tempted to be a Messiah in a way that matched human expectations—those of Jews waiting for a messiah—instead of doing what his Father wanted. So he could have provided for all our needs (turn stones into bread,) brought peace to the world as a great leader (worship the devil,) or been a superhero (jump off the temple without harm). But I also wonder if these temptations are what we expect of God.

Do we expect God to provide for our needs by turning stones into "bread" (i.e., money)? When we ask God to help us by doing everything for us, we are tempting the Lord. God does help us with our troubles, but usually by giving us the strength to get through them with our God-given abilities. This might mean finding a better job that uses more of our talents. It might be forgiving us, if we are the cause of our own troubles, and giving us the courage to start over. It might be a friend who helps us find the right doctor for a medical problem.

Or do we expect God to bring peace to the world by instantly removing all nuclear weapons or capturing all terrorists? When we pray for peace, we could pray that God show us what we can do to bring about that peace. We could follow Jesus' command to love those around us, so that peace spreads from our actions. We could be generous in giving to the poor, especially where poverty is the cause of war.

Maybe we expect God to be a superhero for us, curing diseases, stopping hurricanes or earthquakes, and strengthening our faith with spectacular miracles. Jesus would tell us the same thing he told the devil: "Don't put the Lord your God to the test" (see Luke 4:12). Instead, as we take time to pray over the scriptures, read spiritual books, and share our faith with others, we will find our faith growing and know that the Lord has been with us all along the way.

Journey through Lent


Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) is pleased to announce that the Journey through



CONVALIDATION MARRIAGE + Bringing your Marriage into the Church +

'It is the presence of the Lord, who reveals Himself and the gift of His grace, that will render your marriage full and profoundly true." (POPE FRANCIS)

onvalidation ceremonies are specifically for married couples whose unions are not recognized by the Catholic Church and wish to have their marriage validated. This means that at least one partner must be Catholic and their marriage must meet the Church's requirements for convalidation.

There are various reasons and circumstances that might lead Catholics to marry outside the Church. Regardless of these reasons and past circumstances, the Catholic Church invites couples to bring new meaning to their lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and serving as ambassadors of God's love through the celebration of convalidation of marriage. Convalidation comes from a Latin word meaning "to firm up" or "to strengthen." It is not a blessing of an existing union or a renewal of promises – it requires a new act of consent by each spouse and it is a celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage, sanctifying the union within the Church.

The Church is committed to supporting couples who wish to enter into a valid Catholic marriage, offering them pastoral



and spiritual support as needed. Convalidation of marriage may be celebrated within Mass or outside of Mass, depending on each couple's particular situation.

When couples seek to validate their marriage in the Church after having attempted marriage outside the Church, they are demonstrating that God is present and actively working in their lives. God wants to lead couples closer to Him and to each other, and sanctifying their union within the Church allows them to fully participate in its sacramental life.



Couples wishing to plan a convalidation ceremony are required to contact the Parish Office at 905-436-2126 to schedule an appointment with a Priest to begin the process.

God, not just food.


Almsgiving means giving to those who are in need. It helps us to be generous like God. Maybe you have a bit of money you can give to the poor or to the Church.





Episode 20: The Meaning of Incense

SUMMARY

The Church herself tells us that incense is an expression of reverence and prayer. She prays along with Psalm 141: "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering." The Book of Revelation also gives an understanding of the use of incense, even in heaven: the incense is joined to the prayer of the saints around the throne of God. St. Paul goes even further to suggest that not only does incense represent prayer, it signifies also the Christian: "we are the aroma of Christ." (2 Corinthians 2:15) Incense is a sacramental sign that can be seen, smelled, and even heard.

The different levels of reverence indicate the way the incense is used at Mass. Three swings of the censor or thurible may be given to the Blessed Sacrament at the consecration and also to anything in the Mass that represents Christ: the priest, the people, the Book of Gospels, the Paschal Candle, the Cross. Two swings are reserved for images and relics of saints. A single swing is used when incensing around the altar. Incense may be used at five different times during Mass: the Entrance Procession, at the

beginning of Mass to incense the cross and altar, at the Gospel, the Offertory, and during the Eucharistic Prayer at the elevation of the consecrated host and chalice.

When we see the incense, let us think of our prayers rising to heaven, up to the throne of God. When we inhale its fragrance, let us remind ourselves that in this world we are to be the sweet odor of Christ. When incense is used at Mass, let us recall our participation in the heavenly liturgy described in the Book of Revelation.

The Roman Pontifical

Incense is burned on the altar to signify that the Sacrifice of Christ, which is there perpetuated in mystery, ascends to God as an odor of sweetness; this is also a sign that the pleasing and acceptable prayers of the faithful rise up to the throne of God.

Moreover, the incensation of the main body of the church indicates that the dedication makes it a house of prayer; but the People of God are incensed first, for they are the living temple in which each faithful member is a spiritual altar.



LITURGY LESSONS

Liturgy Notes . Source and Summit . Part Two

arlier, we noted that when we come to church on Sunday (or any weekday Mass), we are entering into worship which is taking place already in heaven, and which we will join for a time, then leave and return to our homes, while the celebration in heaven carries on. But we will have been touched in a unique way by our encounter with God, and having had this brush with holiness, we are returning to the world to change it just a little bit more into the Kingdom of God. And so the life of every baptized person is this very rhythm: back and forth from encountering God in worship, to being his presence in the world, and to bring that encounter back again in offering, thanksgiving and worship. It is the rhythm of Source and Summit (which we also explored in an earlier bulletin). When we cross the threshold of the church building, we are entering into a microcosm of the Kingdom of God, so that by spending a little time here, we will be sent forth into the world to transform it bit by bit, person by person, into the Kingdom of God as much as it can be realized on earth. You and I are to be agents of that transformation. This is our mission as Christians, a mission of every baptized person, to change the world by the divine love of God shown forth in all that we say and do. And so when we come to church, we should desire to be changed. We should hold our



lives up to God, and say, "Not my will, but yours, be done. Forgive us our trespasses so that we can be seen to be holy as you are holy. And give us our daily bread, your precious Body and Blood to transform us into the Body of Christ". Consider how the Lord's Prayer is such a perfect prayer to open yourself to being drawn into the holiness of God and say it and say it with every fibre of desire that you can summon up within your heart. 
