# Taking Care of Business

hen we were kids, my brothers and sisters and I thought that you were not supposed to say the blessing before meals in a restaurant. You were not supposed to flaunt your faith in public. It probably had more to do with fear of being embarrassed if non-believers saw us praying. I think of that when I hear St. Paul telling Timothy, "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 1:7). All three readings mention the difficulties that people of faith will encounter, and each reading has its own way of facing those hardships.

Jesus gives the practical advice: Look at the difficulties of being a disciple as just part of your job. No servant expects to be praised by his master for doing his job. So if the Lord says I must forgive those who hurt me, or be patient with customers, or share what I have with the poor—no problem; it's part of the job of a disciple. If someone I know is in pain, I'm there to support them. Too tired to go to church after work on a holy day? Just taking care of business.

So how do we get the strength and self-control to roll with the punches? Paul reminds us in the second reading to stir the gifts of the Spirit into flame. If you take time to pray every day, if you look for God in other people, if you see difficulties as your share of the cross—you'll find those gifts of faith, power, love, and self-control beginning to grow stronger inside.

We can trust that this is more than just wishful thinking by going to the first reading. When the prophet cries out for help with the misery and violence in the world, he hears God's promise that the vision (of hope for deliverance) will be fulfilled even if it seems to be delayed. We too hear that promise when we start to get discouraged, for God's promise "will not disappoint" (Habakkuk 2:3). Tom Schmidt



The Church has a process called the

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u> (RCIA),

where one can learn more about the Catholic faith and how
to become a Catholic Christian. The program commences at
the beginning of October and ends at Easter 2026.

The objective of the RCIA program is to provide a welcoming environment of learning and discernment that leads unbaptized adults to baptism and Confirmation, and enables those who have been baptized in another Christian tradition to join the Catholic faith. The process also prepares the way for someone who was baptized in the Catholic Church to receive First Holy Communion and Confirmation.







#### Red Wednesday - November 19, 2025

# CONVALIDATION MARRIAGE + Bringing your Marriage into the Church +

"It is the presence of the Lord, who reveals Himself and the gift of His grace, that will render your marriage full and profoundly true." (POPE FRANCIS)

onvalidation ceremonies are specifically for married couples whose unions are not recognized by the Catholic Church and wish to have their marriage validated. This means that at least one partner must be Catholic and their marriage must meet the Church's requirements for convalidation.

There are various reasons and circumstances that might lead Catholics to marry outside the Church. Regardless of these reasons and past circumstances, the Catholic Church invites couples to bring new meaning to their lives by embracing the vocation of marriage and serving as ambassadors of God's love through the celebration of convalidation of marriage. Convalidation comes from a Latin word meaning "to firm up" or "to strengthen." It is not a blessing of an existing union or a renewal of promises – it requires a new act of consent by each spouse and it is a celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage, sanctifying the union within the Church.

The Church is committed to supporting couples who wish to enter into a valid Catholic marriage, offering them pastoral



and spiritual support as needed. Convalidation of marriage may be celebrated within Mass or outside of Mass, depending on each couple's particular situation.

When couples seek to validate their marriage in the Church after having attempted marriage outside the Church, they are demonstrating that God is present and actively working in their lives. God wants to lead couples closer to Him and to each other, and sanctifying their union within the Church allows them to fully participate in its sacramental life.




Couples wishing to plan a convalidation ceremony are required to contact the Parish Office at 905-436-2126 to schedule an appointment with a Priest to begin the process.

# LITURGY LESSON

Liturgy Notes - Eternal, Cosmic, Glorious Beyond Imagining: What is the Liturgy?

ou would think that this would be the first question in the Catechism's section on the Mass. You would expect an orderly definition, and a point-by-point

description. But this is not how the Catechism begins its section on our worship. It does begin with questions, but rather different ones, such as: Who celebrates the liturgy? (1135) Why start here? It starts with "who", not "why", because the Mass does not begin with us. It begins in God himself, wherein the eternal worship of the Father by the Son in the Holy Spirit is the primordial act of worship that is eternal, cosmic, and glorious beyond imagining. It does not begin when we make the Sign of the Cross; it has been going on in the heart of God before creation ever was, and this cosmic worship has been attended to by all the angels and saints since creation began. We glimpse this divine worship briefly when we come to Mass; but we are entering into something heavenly that was begun long before we arrived and will continue long after we are gone. So, the Catechism does not begin with dry definitions, but with a realization that worship of God is a mystery greater than our understanding; yet God invites us to enter into the mys-



tery. Next time you look at the windows of all the saints around the church, remember that they are not simply reminders of people who lived in the past. They are signs of those who are worshipping in heaven with us, praising God with cries of joy, and we echo their voices on earth, giving voice to every creature under heaven through our human voices, when we pray and sing at the Mass. We might leave at the end of Mass, but their worship carries on unceasingly.







We pray for aid workers and journalists


