The Pastoral Council is a consultative body to the pastor. In an arrangement of parishes such as a cluster, it is permitted to operate with a joint pastoral council with at least some members of each parish represented.

### The specific purposes of the Pastoral Council are:

- To develop a common vision and purpose, actively advocate for the poor and the powerless, and to extend Christian commitment to the surrounding neighborhoods and communities;
- 2. To orchestrate a statement of mission for the parish community and become the reference point for activity in the parish;

- 3. To provide recommendations for parish priorities, directions and policies through pastoral planning for worship, evangelization, outreach, stewardship, etc.;
- 4. To promote communication, understanding, and collaboration among parish organizations and between the parish, the bishop, the diocese and the universal Church.

### 7 Norms of Collaboration

### 1. Promoting a spirit of inquiry

"I would like to know more about your idea/ position." "Tell me more about..." (Seek first to understand before advocating for your own idea.)

#### 2. Pausing . . .

"I am waiting a minute to allow time to think first."

(Pausing before responding and/or asking a question allows for think time for yourself and others.)

### 3. Paraphrasing

"So." "As you are..." "You're thinking..." "Fau're wondering..." "The internior seams to be..."
(I "finish paraghrous belp all marriage has and understand the ideas haing presented.)

### 4. Probing for specificity

"Phrase say more..."

"I'm carious about..."

"I'd like to hear more about..."
"Specifically what..."

"Then, you are saying..."

"Do you mean everyone?"

(Asking questions to increase clarity and understanding as well as the precision of the group's thinking.)

### 5. Putting ideas on the table

tabel the intention of your comments: "Here is one idea..." "One thought I have is..." "Here is a possible approach..." "Here is one idea..." "Another consideration might be..."

### 6. Paying attention to self & others

How am I reacting to what is being said? How am I feeling? How are others reacting to what I am saying? Have I used possible charged language unintentionally? (Watch for body language and check perceptions by paraphrasing and probing for specificity.)

### 7. Presuming positive intentions

"I know we are trying to learn more about all angles so let me share..." "Knowing that we would like to make a decision that works for all of us, let's..."

(Thinking in your head thoughts like: "I am sure she didn't mean to sound charged when she said that.")





- Personal Encounters: Bring your people to Jesus.
- •Reinvigorating Devotion: Receive Jesus. Worship Jesus.
- Deepening Formation: Learn and preach the truth about Jesus.
- •Missionary Sending: Go out and bring Jesus to the world.

All the initiatives are focused on reaching those who have some connection to the Church but have not yet encountered Christ in the Eucharist. An encounter with Jesus, our Eucharistic Lord, is powerful because it changes us. It gives us our very character.
