

CHURCH PEW RESTORATION

Thank you to so many who have already reserved their pews for restoration and there are many more to go! The pews are 58 years old and original to the church. There are 125 pews in the main church; many of the kneelers are in bad shape as well as the pews. The cost, as I announced, is \$2,500.00 per completed pew and kneeler. There is an option for a payment plan through the Parish Giving program to pay over a twelve month period but, with fees incurred, it would bump the price up to \$2,600.00 or \$217.00 per month.



We will have a memorial plaque installed with simple wording "Restored in Memory of John Smith or Restoration Gift of the Smith Family. Since there are pews with plaques already on them from families who donated them at the time when the church was built, please know that those plaques will remain. If the same family would like to restore the pew, a restoration plaque will be added.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Sound of Freedom film looks to fill 2 million theater seats for the world's 2 million trafficked children

<u>Sound of Freedom</u> filmmakers are hoping to sell at least 2 million tickets for its <u>theatrical premiere</u> in order to bring awareness to the 2 million <u>trafficked children</u> across the world.

The new film, which is set to be released in theaters on July 4, details the true story of how a federal agent quits his job and risks his life to journey into the jungles of Colombia in an effort to save a girl, the sister of a recently rescued 7-year-old boy, from sex slavery.



Angel Studios, the film's distributor, told the *Washington Examiner* that the film's goal is to bring greater awareness to the crisis. "We want to answer the prayers of children as soon as possible," Angel Studios CEO and co-founder Neal Harmon said. "What we need is for *Sound of Freedom* to be the No. 1 movie in the world on July 4 because the world will not be able to ignore that message — that's what those children need."

Jim Caviezel, perhaps best known for his role as Jesus in *The Passion of the Christ*, plays *Sound of Freedom's* lead role of federal agent Tim Ballard. In the trailer, Caviezel's character is heard saying, "God's children are not for sale."

The film also features Academy Award-winner Mira Sorvino from *Mighty Aphrodite* and Bill Camp from *12 Years a Slave*. The film is directed by Alejandro Monteverde and produced by Eduardo Verastegui.

Tickets for the film may be purchased or paid forward using Angel Studios' "Pay It Forward" software, which allows people to purchase tickets on behalf of others. *Sound of Freedom* follows the box-office shocker biblical film *His Only Son* as Angel Studios' next theatrical release and project to gift tickets in "Pay It Forward" fashion.
