I remember when I was a child the adults in my family always seemed to complain about how fast time was passing by, but for me time never seemed to pass. Now that I am getting a little older, I am beginning to understand what they all complained about!

This time of year was always my favorite. The weather got colder (I love the cold!) and all the beautiful decorations would go up. I remember as a child taking longer detours with my parents as my dad drove us back home to see all the houses decorated and lit up with all the different kinds of lights.
