ND March For Life....You are invited to partake in the second annual North Dakota March for Life, taking place at the North Dakota State Capitol on January 21, 2022. On January 22, 1973, the United States Supreme Court handed down the Roe v. Wade decision that made abortion legal, allowing many to choose to have an abortion without government intervention. Since then, well over 62 million lives have been lost due to abortion. To begin the event on January 21, Bishop Kagan will celebrate Mass at 10:30 AM at Cathedral of the Holy Spirit. Following Mass, groups are welcome to march (or drive) to the Capitol grounds for a program beginning at 12:30 PM to include a keynote speaker and a period of silence for the 62+ million lives who have been silenced by abortion in the United States since 1973. "Open Your Hearts to Mary"

"In the revised ordering of the Christmas period it seems to us that the attention of all should be directed towards the restored Solemnity of Mary the holy Mother of God. This celebration, placed on January 1 in conformity with the ancient indication of the liturgy of the City of Rome, is meant to commemorate the part played by Mary in this mystery of salvation. It is meant also to exalt the singular dignity which this mystery brings to the holy Mother...through whom we were found worth to receive the Author of life.

It is likewise a fitting occasion for renewing adoration of the newborn Prince of Peace, for listening once more to the glad tidings of the angels (cf. Lk. 2:14), and for imploring from God, through the Queen of Peace, the supreme gift of peace. It is for this reason that, in the happy concurrence of the Octave of Christmas and the first day of the year, we have instituted the World Day of Peace, an occasion that is gaining increasing support and already bringing forth fruits of peace in the hearts of many." (Pope Paul VI, Apostolic Exhortation, Marialis Cultus: For the Right Ordering and Development of Devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, February 2, 1974)
