RESPECT LIFE

Dr. Doran draws from his vast experience as a neurosurgeon, bioethicist, and permanent deacon to provide a detailed, yet readily understandable guide to the Catholic perspective on the art of dying well. He includes stories "helping us



to understand the spiritual and moral issues related to death and the process of dying, along with the rites that accompany the death of a Catholic. *To Die Well* will help readers contemplate, pray about, and prepare for the end of their earthly lives," according to Ignatius Press.

Assisted suicide is neither compassionate nor about real choice. Protecting the choices of a few by legalizing assisted suicide will endanger the health care choices of all. H.F. 1930 / S.F. 1813 is one of the most aggressive physician-assisted suicide bills in the country because it lacks meaningful safeguards for older adults and people with disabilities. It has no family notification or witness requirement and no way to predict an accurate prognosis. 




