

Archbishop's Response to New Vatican Document

The recent Declaration regarding pastoral blessings issued by the Vatican was intended to offer nuance to the Church's teaching on blessings (which can vary in form and purpose) without in any way changing the Church's perennial teaching on marriage or on sexual morality.

Nevertheless, the hope is that these blessings can assist those who request them to "open their lives to God, to ask for his help to live better, and also to invoke the Holy Spirit so that the values of the Gospel may be lived with greater faithfulness." Visit
