### LITURGY & PRAYER

Stations of the Cross | Fridays at 5:30pm
The Stations of the Cross, the devotion of following the footsteps of Christ to his death on Mt. Calvary, will be offered in the church every Friday in Lent shortly after the 5pm Mass. The School will also offer Stations for their students at 2pm on March 8 and March 22, and again invite senior members of the parish to join them.

#### **Abstinence & Daily Lenten Disciplines**

Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent in addition to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Each weekday of Lent (except St. Joseph's Day on March 19) is an obligatory day of penance to be marked by prayer and increased devotion to spiritual practices, such as daily Mass, Adoration, increased personal prayer time or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, works of charity, almsgiving, Stations of the Cross (see above), the Rosary, retreats, and especially the sacrament of Reconciliation. ### CHURCH HERITAGE

"Centennial Sunset" Painting by Joshua Cunningham

Last year, longtime parishioner and professional pleinair artist Joshua Cunningham was inspired to paint our historic parish church on the occasion of its 100-year anniversary. The original image, pictured below and on the front cover of this bulletin, now hangs in our Heritage Room along with the following descriptive note written by Joshua. We are deeply indebted to him for his gracious and generous sharing of his talents with all of us — and with generations to come. Thank you, Joshua!

This painting shows the low September sun shining through the world around our church, washed by the rain from passing showers. A visual expression of the experience for all who have come to our church over the years after the passing storms in their lives.

The evening rays paint the last summer leaves in rich, warm light, creating colors that suggest the coming fall, marking the beginning of another wonderful school year, the crescendo of the County Fair, and rhythms of school and sacraments to follow.



Above the wet street reflections are the last summer flowers, the front stairs for wedding photos, and funeral farewells. The stone walls soar up, framing the stained glass. Those windows tell stories from our faith and, by example, show us how we can hold up our broken pieces, inviting His light to shine through.

We see the Lord's forgiveness and mercy, like sunlight through the rain, transform us like a rainbow. "I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth" (Genesis 9:13). One of God's bows bends towards our school, in whose auditorium the parish celebrated her first Masses, and all that continues to flow from our faithful participation in the blessed Eucharist.

The dangerous End-of-Life Option Act (HF 1930/SF 1813) is advancing in our legislature and, if passed, would have serious repercussions for Minnesotans and beyond. The bill denigrates the standard of care that doctors are expected to provide and encourages a pro-death mentality both in our medical and wider community, eroding trust in our healthcare system. In particular, it disregards the mental health of patients, and has no safeguards against elder abuse or conscience protection for doctors, among other concerns.
