Abstinence & Daily Lenten Disciplines

Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent, in addition to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Each weekday of Lent (except St. Joseph's Day this Tuesday, March 19) is an obligatory day of penance to be marked by prayer and increased devotion to spiritual practices, such as daily Mass, Adoration, increased personal prayer time or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, works of charity, almsgiving, the Stations of the Cross (see above), the Rosary, retreats, and especially the sacrament of Reconciliation (see above).
