The sacrament is also offered immediately after the 8:15am Mass in the church on the first Saturday of each month, unless otherwise noted — including next month, when it will be moved to April 11 to accommodate the Sacred Triduum.

Stations of the Cross | Friday, March 6, 7pm

The Stations of the Cross, the devotion of following the footsteps of Christ to his death on Mt. Calvary, will be offered in the church every Friday in Lent at 7pm.

Abstinence | Friday, March 6

Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent, plus Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, April 4.

Daily Lenten Disciplines

Each weekday of Lent (with the exception of St. Joseph Day on March 19 and the Annunciation on March 25) is an obligatory day of penance to be marked by prayer and increased devotion to spiritual practices.

Some recommendations are daily Mass, Adoration, increased personal prayer time or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, works of charity, almsgiving, Stations of the Cross (*see above*), the Rosary, retreats, and especially the sacrament of Reconciliation.
