

This 10-15 minute survey will only be available until April 4 and will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and enable you to provide feedback on our parish's efforts to help you grow. All responses will be confidential and the parish will only receive information about the community as whole.

- All who are high school age and older are encouraged to take the survey. We ask everyone to take the survey separately and independently, rather than taking one survey together.
- You do not need to be registered in the parish or Catholic to take the survey; all who participate in the life of St. Ferdinand in some way are encouraged to take the survey.

We are trying to get the highest response rate possible. This survey is an extremely effective way of making your voice heard at this important moment in the history of the Church in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. This information will be invaluable to Fr. Mike Murphy, Fr. Nick Muenks, and our various ministries as we plan for the future and strive to be the best disciples we can be. We will receive the results this spring/summer at which time we will share what we have learned with the entire parish.

FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH On Saturday, March 19 at 8AM MASS AND AT ALL THE

UN Saturday, March 19 at 8AM MASS AND AT ALL THE WEEKEND MASSES ON MARCH 19 & 20, PLEASE BRING BREAD THAT IS BAGGED TO THE MASS YOU ATTEND AND PLACE ON THE HOLY FAMILY ALTAR TO BE BLESSED IN HONOR OF ST. JOSEPH. YOU CAN PICK UP YOUR BREAD AFTER THE MASS YOU ATTEND TO TAKE HOME.

At least two traditions are celebrated this day. The St. Joseph table was started in the Middle Ages in Sicily when a tremendous drought happened. The people prayed to St. Joseph and soon their prayers were answered. To this day, people continue to celebrate on March 19, with rich food and blessed breads glazed with sesame seeds symbolizing St. Joseph, the carpenter's sawdust and the drought that was relieved by prayer.

You will also notice on our Holy Family altar a bouquet of lilies for this special day. Legend has it that when Temple virgins were of a certain age, they were sent back to their parents who arranged a marriage for them. Mary, who had been a Temple virgin since the age of 3, said that she could not do that, because her parents had dedicated her to a life of service to the Lord and she herself had made a vow of virginity to God. Eligible men (Joseph being among them) were then assembled at the Temple and each given a branch to lay down on the altar. When Joseph laid his down, lilies burst forth from it (a sign of integrity) and a dove descended and landed on his branch and so he was chosen to be the spouse of Mary.

THE 2022 BENEFICIARY IS THE BILL MCMILLIN FAMILY

Bill and is wife Holly have been involved in St. Ferdinand Parish since 1988. They, along with their 5 kids, have been a part of the Ferdinand family for over 30 year. Bill and Holly have both coached many sports, were involved in picnic committees, were on several other boards and committees throughout that time. In January of 2020 they moved to Wentzville MO to downsize their home.

In May 2020, Bill McMillin was diagnosed with Stage 4 prostate cancer and was not given a good prognosis. He and wis wife Holly traveled to Houston, TX for a second opinion at MD Anderson. On June 11 the doctors found a spot close to his spine. On June 12, 2022, Bill had his first radiation treatment. A few days later, he and Holly were on their way back home to St. Louis with optimism and relief.

Over the next 12 months, Bill participated in a clinical study, continued treatments and took time to enjoy friends and family.

July 2021, Bill started having pain in his back and abdomen, Bill and Holly traveled back to Texas and unfortunately, doctors found as tumor on Bill's spine. Spinal surgery was scheduled and successful. Bill started recovering and started back at work. Next Houston visit was a follow up in November 2021.

Since November 2021, Bill has been in and out of the hospital for treatments and surgeries. He had an infection and fluid in the surgery area. They have found cancer growth in his liver and spine, along with a fracture in his back. Bill continues to fight and battle this cancer.

Bill came home from the hospital on February 2, 2022. Although he has a tough battle ahead, he is taking it one day at a time.

Bill still has his humor through all of the adversity and remains strong in his faith. He is thankful for each day he can spend with is family and friends.

PARISH REGISTRATION

OUESTION:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

ANSWER:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish.

Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.




Happy Lent!

REGISTRATION FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

By now, many may have failed in Lenten discipline to some measure or another: the daily doughnut is simply too alluring, or a furtive puff on a cigarette irresistible. There is meaning even in the failure, though, a kind of reminder that we cannot save ourselves. Part of the power of Lent is that we do it together, and although individuals decide on different ways to keep it, it is fundamentally the same journey. We fall, we get up, we keep moving. The desire to "give something up" for Lent is an age old impulse in the Christian heart. We get better at it over the years, and move more deeply into the meaning and message of acts of sacrifice; so there is no shame in stumbling, as long as we are not discouraged by the failure and give up. We are clearing space in our lives, after all, and some of the things we desire to give up are worth rooting out completely anyway.

What do we do with the space we have cleared out by our sacrifice? The Lenten question of giving up is balanced by the Easter question of our response to Christ's embrace of us in love: "What are you taking on for Easter?"


