

From Father Lijo...

The month of November is traditionally a time in which the Catholic community remembers those who have died. It is related to the fact that the end of November is the end of the Liturgical Year with a new year starting the First Sunday of Advent - the four-week period of preparation before Christmas. The Church then uses this end of the year period as a time to think of the end of life and the end of all things and the great hope that our earthly end is transitioned into a new life and the great hope that our earthly end is transitioned into a new life in God's heavenly reality. We give thanks for those who have gone before us, and we look with prayer and hope to their new life in heaven and our desire to join them there one day.

The month of November contains several Holy and Feast Days for Catholics to celebrate. Perhaps most notable are the first day of November, All Saints Day, followed by All Souls Day.

All Saints Day is a solemn Holy Day celebrated each year on the first of

November. On this Holy day of obligation, Catholics attend Mass to honor all the saints - both the known and the unknown - who have entered the kingdom of heaven. We celebrate five Masses on that day: 6 AM, 8 AM, 12noon and 7 PM at St. Ferdinand and 8AM at St. Martin de Porres church.

On All Souls Day known as "the Commemoration of all faithful departed" Catholics pray for all their fellow faithful who have died and are awaiting full sanctification and moral perfection before entering the Kingdom of heaven. Most Catholics use this day to remember and honor family members and friends who have died through prayer and reflection. On this day we celebrate five Masses, 6 AM, 8 AM and 7 PM at St. Ferdinand and 8 AM and 7 PM at St. Martin de Porres. I invite vou to join with us on Thursday, November 2nd at the 7:00 PM Mass, either at St. Ferdinand or St. Martin's as we remember those parishioners who have died over this past year. All those

faithful souls who we have laid to rest will be prayed for at Mass. We invite their grieving families to join at this special Mass of Remembrance. I ask you to please pray for the gentle repose of their souls and consolation for their family.

The month of November reminds us not to forget our beloved dead. Today, the month of November reminds us to visit the graves of our beloved dead, to gain indulgences to be applied to their souls, to have Masses offered for the repose of their souls and also to pray for the souls in purgatory.

Therefore, during this month of November, let us remember our beloved dead with appropriate religious remembrances.

"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."



27 Words That Matter

One of the quickest things you learn as a parent is how dangerous it is to explain too much, especially when your kid is teetering on the brink of a rebellion. The fewer words you use, the more power they have. A kid who is about to be carried away by their feelings needs to be brought back to earth with a tether made of short, succinct directions.

There are a lot of similarities between the Pharisees of Scripture and a toddler on the edge of a meltdown. Stay with me — this will make sense, I promise. Think about it: both toddlers and Pharisees have lots of feelings and lots of opinions. Both toddlers and Pharisees think you're out to get them. Both toddlers and Pharisees keep trying to trick you to get what they think they want.

A thorough Google search informs me that there are about 80,000 words in the Torah. Eighty-thousand words, and Jesus can boil it all down to 27: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

It doesn't make the excess words untrue; it doesn't even make them unnecessary. Sometimes I need the long explanation, the full and complete picture.

Because sometimes, as much as I hate to admit it, I act like both a toddler and a Pharisee. I am carried away by my feelings. I don't trust God. I am about to bolt.

When that happens, I need to be told in short and simple terms what my salvation means. I need a tether made of short, succinct directions.
