From Father Lijo...

It has been three months since I came to St. Ferdinand as part of the All-things New Strategic pastoral planning for the diocese. It seems to me I have been here for a lot longer than that. I have mixed feelings about my experience here. On one hand I feel we are moving towards the plan for our parish to be one united parish family embracing the communities of both St. Sabina and St. Martin de Porres and on the other I feel we need to go a little further forward in regards to being fully integrated as one family.

I am so happy to see some of you make it a point to attend Masses at the different locations which helps you to meet and get to know people and the clergy. We have a few more weeks to do that and for people from Sabina and Martin's to try and familiarize themselves with the Ferdinand parish church where we will have Masses beginning the first week of advent, which is in December. Towards this goal, we had the festival of ministries which had a huge response. My expectation with this was that all those who wish to contribute to the ministry of the parish liturgy have an opportunity to do so, and those who are already ministers at other two parishes now can continue to do so, when we start having it all at St. Ferdinand. Hope all of you had the opportunity to sign up for the ministries you want to serve on and be a part of the parish family.


We had the same envelopes for St. Sabina from October onwards and St. Martins are getting the same envelopes beginning this month. Please remember to make checks payable to St. Ferdinand. Although we still have our bank accounts for Sabina and Martin open, and even if you write checks to them, we can still process them for now. But it would be helpful if you start making the check payable to St. Ferdinand.

Beginning the first week of Advent, i.e., December 2/3 we will have Masses only at the St. Ferdinand location. And Mass times will be Monday to Friday 6 and 8 AM. Saturday morning 8 AM.

And on weekends: 7 AM, 9 AM, 11 AM and 5 PM on Sunday and on Saturday 4:30 PM. The confessions will be Saturday 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM.

I will be installed as pastor on November 11 during the 5 PM Mass. I invite all of you to attend the ceremony and pray for me. Let us continue to pray and work together towards our goal.



A Heavy Burden, Hard to Carry

"Mommy, you haven't been making any sacrifices."

My daughter was peering through the little opening in the plastic cover of the "sacrifice jar" we made for Lent this year. The repurposed oatmeal container, jazzed up with glitter glue and pictures of St. Therese of Lisieux, was more than half-filled with little slips of paper bearing descriptions of the various sacrifices family members had made for one another.

But she was right: every piece of paper bore the childlike scrawl of herself and her brother. I had not added anything to the sacrifice jar.

"If I wrote down every sacrifice I made for you in just a single day, the jar would explode," I retorted, and even though my daughter giggled, I instantly regretted the comment, sighing as I realized I did it again. I let a snide, self-pitying thought form on my lips and make its way into the world because for a brief moment I thought someone didn't appreciate my (imagine me sniffing injuredly here) hard work.

We sneer at the scribes and the Pharisees as Jesus describes them in the Gospel, lengthening their phylacteries and coveting the places of honor. But then I remember: nobody starts out *meaning* to be a jerk.

We want to do good things. We try to be holy. But it's hard, that burden weighs heavy on our back.

So, we murmur about it here and there. We stop to catch our breath. We glimpse other people looking at our burden with approval and admiration, and we breathe a little harder, groan a little deeper. And somewhere along the way the burden becomes an idol and our labor a performance. We dare not ask for help bearing it, for we prize too greatly the sweat of our own brow.





From the Principals Desk

Wrapping up first quarter, we are looking forward to having parent-teacher conferences with our families. We are grateful for the support of our families so far this year. In addition, we want to recognize the amazing support through prayer, treasure, and talent, that we receive from our parish community! The All Saints Academy-St. Ferdinand community is ever grateful for the partnership we have with the parish! We look forward to maintaining that partnership with our newest parishioners that have been joining us through the former St. Sabina and St. Martin de Porres parishes. Our dismissal procedure is for families to pull into the back parking lot via the drive between the primary building and the Rectory. PK only families park along the primary field to pick up their children at the 2:35 dismissal, and all other families park in rows behind church to wait for their children to be dismissed. Parking in the front lot is NOT part of the dismissal procedure, due to safety concerns that we have experienced in previous years. The front parking lot is to be used for parish business, and there have been several accidents or close calls with children being hit due to not being seen, or moving while parishioners are driving; students getting lost and parents not being able to find them because they are running late or wandered off; and major disruptions when there are funerals or other parish events where the school families parking in the front lot cause disruptions in the parish function. 


