

From Father Lijo...

Since we have combined Masses at only one location, I heard many questions about what we are going to do with the buildings and the properties of St. Sabina and St. Martin. Many have asked about the things in the church and other items in the building. Some of them wanted to take things home. What I want to say at this time is, we are keeping all the property and buildings, and maintaining them. Both St. Sabina and St. Martin de Porres church and all the properties belong to our parish. It is our responsibility to maintain them, and we use them as needed. We try to bring and use the things from both locations at Ferdinand.

We continue to use both the churches. We are still doing funerals and other sacraments, if need be, at the churches. The school building at Sabina is used by the PSR on Tuesdays of the week. The rest of the place is available for rent if anyone wants to use it. At Martin's, the school building is used by many groups at different times. The Archdiocesan Shared Accounting is leasing four classrooms, homeschool co-op is using the rest of the classrooms on Fridays of the week, on Sundays Syro-Malabar Catholic Church (one of the Eastern Catholic churches) is using the classrooms for their PSR and they use the church for their celebration of Holy Eucharist. Our athletic association is using the gym at Martin's and there are occasional renters for the gym and other facilities. Our youth group is holding their gathering there. The Bommarito Auto Group is using our parking lot for their employees' parking. Thus, our facilities are being well used and we need to maintain and keep those properties in good condition until we make a decision on those properties.

Our offices are combined at the St. Ferdinand location. So please direct all your inquiries and phone calls to that office and approach us anytime you need anything. You will find the phone numbers and email addresses of the staff and clergy on the front page of the bulletin. If you need us to do anything more, let me know.

The third Sunday of Advent is also called *Gaudete* Sunday. Graduate, a Latin word which means "rejoice", is taken from the entrance antiphon for Sunday's Mass. This theme is echoed in today's second reading from the first Letter to the Thessalonians. It is a reminder that Advent is a season of joy because our salvation is already at hand. This Sunday, too, the gospel invites us to continue our reflection on the person and mission of John the Baptist.

Advent season is an invitation to set your mind off the stresses of the year. We can take our focus off the crazy hustle of the season and the sadness that could accompany the different ways some of us may be choosing to observe the holiday season this year. Even when things feel chaotic, we can and should find peace in Jesus. Advent is a chance to focus our thoughts on the gift God has given us in His son Jesus who stepped down from heaven and took the form of a man so that we might believe.

So, there are multiple reasons for joy. There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but there is also joy in recalling the birth of Jesus on the first Christmas. The joy is heightened because he was born to save us from our sins. The joy also extends to anticipation of the second Coming, either at the end of physical life or of the end of the world, the time when believers will be given the crown of righteousness and a place in the Fathers house to dwell with God and His angels and saints for all eternity. Let us therefore, without wasting time, prepare for the great feast of the remembrance of our Lord's coming to be with us as one of us.



Testimony

When my grandmother heard the news that my cousin had fallen from a second-story window, she immediately went and washed her hair

Grandma had been sitting alone in her house, listening to the morning radio when the announcer shared a news bulletin stating that the previous night, a little boy with the same name as her grandson, living in the same community and of the same age, had fallen onto the pavement from a window on the second floor of his house. He had been rushed to the hospital but miraculously survived his injuries.

She thought she was hallucinating and wanted to look pretty when the "men in white coats" came to take her away. Thus, the hair-washing.

As it happens, the whole story was true — it was her grandson, but this was before the age of mobile phones and had happened so late at night that his parents had been unable to notify any family members before the whole thing showed up on the news.

It wasn't until my grandmother received a phone call from another relative corroborating the story that she realized it hadn't been a figment of her imagination. What a waste of styled hair, no hospital committal for her that day.

There are certain truths that we cannot accept unless they are supported by the testimony of others. We find them to be unbelievable without the reassurance of another person whispering, "It's okay. I see it, too."

This is the value of testimony, and the purpose of John the Baptist and every saint who ever died with the name of Jesus Christ on their lips. And this is the sacred duty of all the baptized, to give testimony with our words and our actions.





bush trimming and gutter cleaning. Very minor plumbing. Tightening screws on hinges. Cleaning out a basement, shed, or garage. Installing the spare tire. Car battery replacement. Following the Festival of Ministries, we now have an IT (information technology) person to assist with computer questions.

DECEMBER 17—ELEMENT 3/22—THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

When asked, Jesus identified the greatest commandment of the Law as the Shema, "Hear [Shema in Hebrew], O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mk 12:29-30; Deut 6:4-5). It was the creed with which all faithful Jews, even today, begin and end every day.

In time, Jesus completed the Shema's confession of God's oneness, with the revelation that the one God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We profess this in our Creed here at Mass. But we also profess this truth, in miniature, when we make the Sign of the Cross. This simple gesture is the entire Gospel, in miniature; and that is why we use it to begin and end all of our times of prayer: It is through Jesus' death upon the Cross that we enter the life of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and that recall the Shema—we have been empowered to do so with all our mind (touch forehead), all our heart, and all our strength (touch both shoulders).

We ask that you wear your name tag every time you attend Mass or other St. Ferdinand activity. We want to be a place where everybody knows our names!




