

From Father Lijo...

On the third Sunday of Lent our Holy Mother Church gives us the scripture passage of the Ten Commandments for pondering and practicing the meaning of it in our daily lives, and John's gospel passage about Jesus casting the money changers out of the temple, cleansing of the temple.

The Ten commandments call us to a way of life that is out of tune with much of society. Honesty, respect for parents, fidelity, respect for others' property, putting God before all else, giving Him a day of the week, are all ways that we are distinct from others. To be distinct, to be separate for the Lord, is what we mean when we say, "we are called to be holy." We live these commandments in response to God's preference of us as His chosen people.

Ten Commandments are the basis of our religious and spiritual life as Christians. Instead of restricting our freedom, as some people wrongly assume, the Commandments really help us to love and respect our God and our neighbors. It traces the path for us to live our lives according to God's will. Ten Commandments are so to say the mind of God.

Often, we Catholics focus on giving up things we enjoy during Lent – favorite food, sweets, meat, coffee, cigarettes, television, other forms of entertainment. Of course, Christ challenges us to do this and much more: "repent of your sins and believe in the gospel." Today we are called not so much to "give up" but to "give in" to The Ten Commandments and Jesus Christ who invites us to give up pride, anger, jealousy, greed, prejudice, indifference to the needs of others, rash judgment and spiritual laziness. This is more challenging than simply giving up dessert.

Jesus who understands our human nature well, understands the difficulties we sometimes have living by the Ten Commandments. It is because He understands human nature well that He invites us into the desert with Him on our Lenten journey to renew and deepen our baptismal commitments, to confess our sorrow for our sins and to pray for our catechumens who are preparing for the Easter sacraments. He is encouraging us in our fasting, prayer and almsgiving, so we can live our lives of sincere faith, living hope and effective works of charity. Jesus also invites us to the mountain top experiences where we are strengthened and encouraged to live the Ten Commandments in our daily lives amidst little support from our culture.

Are you too busy to embrace the deeper meaning of the Ten Commandments and Lent and its call to conversion? Do not ignore these Lenten days. Lent is the ideal time to clean out the Temple of our own hearts and to offer to God proper Divine worship by obeying the Ten Commandments.

St. Ferdinand is added a **Wednesday Night Service**, just for you!

We will come together for a time of praise and worship, and after that, our priests and deacons will help us dig into the bible in a way we just don't have time for on Sundays.

What is it, though? Well, it's <u>not</u> a bible study. There's no homework, no book (except the Good Book), no table discussion, and no one will ask you to say anything! It is a prayer service, with music, led by the priests and deacons. We will take time to praise God in song. We will hear the scripture proclaimed. And then the deacon or priest will lead us through the reading, both carefully and prayerfully. It runs year 'round. This is not a Lenten program, but a new weekly event. You can make this part of your routine. In fact, we hope people will begin to say, "It's Wednesday – time for church!"

During Lent, we will be reading from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew, chapters 5-7). **The reading for March 6 is Matt 6:1-24**

Bring a bible, a notebook (if you like to take notes), and yourself!

The Wednesday Night Service will be held at St. Ferdinand Church, every Wednesday night at 6:30 PM. On weeks when Holy Hour is already scheduled for that time, Holy Hour will take the place of the Wednesday Night Service.



The Merciful Anger of Jesus

Watch your fellow churchgoers today as the priest or deacon reads the story of Jesus raising hell (or perhaps he's raising heaven?) in the temple square. Dollars to donuts, they'll be squirming.

As Catholics, we have become very uncomfortable with Angry Jesus. He makes us cringe in the same way that the Old Testament God does when He calls Himself "jealous" and talks about punishment. That level of intensity makes us recoil. If it were present in a human relationship, it would be toxic and abusive, because in humanity, fierceness and love rarely coexist in a healthy way.

But what a tragedy it would be for us to mistake our relationship with God for our relationship with our spouse, our best friend, or even our human father. Because we cannot see clearly, we would mistake His zeal for anger and His law for diktat.

The strong and sure movement of a wave against a rocky cliff will, over time, erode its surface, just as an overabundance of raindrops will flood a city. We do not call the water callous and cruel. We still luxuriate in its coolness and refreshment. Its destructive powers don't negate the life-giving properties of water. We do not demand that water apologize to us for being strong.

Fierce, uncompromising — but also, soft and merciful. How can God — and God's law — be both, at the same time? How can Christ cast a whip at someone's foot, overturn a table and scatter coins? How can the law of God be perfect, as the Psalm says, and refresh the soul — while demanding so much of it?

All I can say is, thank God for Angry Jesus. We need his fierceness and thank God it does not wane because it confuses us. Thank God his mercy does not decrease because we doubt it.

"For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." — 1 Corinthians 1:25



Our 2024 Beneficiary: Erika Bailey



This year's beneficiary is Erika Bailey. She is a single mom and sole provider to seven kids, five of which are still living at home along with her aged mother, who is suffering from early

stages of dementia. She has spent so much of her life in service to others volunteering endless hours in Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts—generating positive impact experiences for so many youth in the North County area for well over 10 years. Erika also does community outreach to gather donations in clothing for those that are in need. In early 2020, she was given a terminal cancer diagnosis and 6 months to live. Although she has beat that initial prognosis, her cancer is still Stage 4 and her treatment journey has been a long one. Erika's cancer, Chordoma, is a rare type of bone cancer. It is located at the base of her skull. For the past three years, she has undergone radiation treatments 3-4 times a week, and then surgery every other week to try to remove tiny portions from the mass that were more accessible. Through this entire time of uncertainty, she has been a constant source of inspiration, generosity, kindness and joy — all while living with a terminal diagnosis and raising her family on her own.
