





Questions of the Week August 14, 2022 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Question for Children: When do you feel alone for doing what Jesus teaches?

Question for Youth: How do you struggle against sin?

Questions for Adults: How does living what Jesus teaches cause acceptance or rejection in your family? How do you turn to Jesus for answers?



Monday is the Solemnity of the Assumption, the feast day which celebrates Mary's reception into heaven in body and soul. It would be good for us to meditate for a moment on what this feast day means.

St. Paul tells us in Romans that the wages of sin is death. He is speaking of original sin, the state of enmity against God that all of us have inherited from our first parents, Adam and Eve. The sin of our first parents, as St. Paul put it, was the "sting" of death. Death could have been a beautiful gift of God, an entrance into rest. Because of sin, death became a fearful and painful ordeal.

As Catholics, we believe that Mary was preserved from both original sin and actual sin. We call her "full of grace:" from the moment of her conception, she was in perfect friendship with God, like Adam and Eve before their fall from grace. Because of this, she did not have to undergo the horrors of death which all of us have justly merited because of our sins.

Most theologians believe that Mary did in fact die. Her death, though, was her participation in the redemptive death of her Son, not a punishment for sin. Instead of rotting away like your body and mine someday will, she was assumed into heaven bodily. That may sound mythological, but as the Archangel Gabriel told Mary at the Annunciation "for God, all things are possible." There are relics of all the other saints, but no church or shrine has ever dared to claim a relic of the Mother of God. This was true even before the doctrine of the Assumption was defined. We can be pretty sure that there'd be quite the competition to possess those relics - if they existed!

Meditating on Mary's Assumption should give us great hope. We know that a woman who shares our humanity is in heaven, body and soul, praying for us. We also know that our baptism has cleansed us of original sin's guilt, so that when we die, we need not fear sin, which is the sting of death. If we learn to "die daily" in St. Paul's words, we'll meet death like a Christian when the Lord calls us to himself. That's a grace we should pray for daily, as the "Hail Mary" teaches us: "pray for us now, and at the hour of our death."

I invite you to attend Mass this Monday, August 15th, at 7:00 PM at St Joseph Church in honor of our Mother's Assumption into heaven. It's a great day!



From Jonathan Alexzander, Music Director:

What does singing in the choir mean?

Being in the choir means many things. It means having a group of people to have fun with. It means sharing in prayer with others. It means being there for the other members of the choir, and in turn, having people to be there for you, both in times of joy and in times of sorrow. It means the choir director sleeps easier because there are more people in the choir. It is much more than just practicing and singing. More than just having a place to sit at the front of the church. The choir is a community of believers-- a community that is caring supportive, fun, out-going, and just a great group of people to be around. Singing in a choir is proven to be good for our brains in many ways. "Music is awash with neurochemical rewards for working up the courage to sing. That rush, or "singer's high," comes in part through a surge of

endorphins, which at the same time alleviates pain. When the voices of the singers surrounding me hit my ear. I'm bathed in dopamine, a neurotransmitter in the brain that is associated with feelings of pleasure & alertness. Music lowers cortisol, a chemical that signals levels of stress. Studies have found that people who listened to music before surgery were more relaxed and needed less anesthesia and afterward they got by with smaller amounts of pain medication. Music also releases serotonin, a neurotransmitter associated with feelings of euphoria and contentment." 

El lunes es la Solemnidad de la Asunción, celebramos la recepción de María en el cielo en cuerpo y alma. Sería bueno que meditemos un momento en el significado de este día.

San Pablo nos dice en Romanos que la paga del pecado es la muerte. Está hablando del pecado original, el estado de enemistad contra Dios que todos hemos heredado de nuestros primeros padres, Adán y Eva. Como dijo San Pablo, fue el "aguijón" de la muerte. La muerte pudo haber sido un hermoso regalo de Dios, una entrada al descanso. A causa del pecado, la muerte se convirtió en una terrible y dolorosa prueba. Como católicos, creemos que María fue preservada tanto del pecado original como del pecado actual. La llamamos "llena eres de gracia": desde el momento de su concepción, estuvo en perfecta amistad con Dios, como Adán y Eva antes de su caída en desgracia. Por esto, ella no tuvo que sufrir los horrores de la muerte que todos nosotros hemos merecido justamente por nuestros pecados.

La mayoría de los teólogos creen que María, de hecho, murió. Sin embargo, su muerte fue su participación en la muerte redentora de su Hijo, no un castigo por el pecado. En lugar de pudrirse como tu cuerpo y el mío algún día, ella fue asumida al cielo corporalmente. Eso puede sonar mitológico, pero como el Arcángel Gabriel le dijo a María en la Anunciación "para Dios, todo es posible". Hay reliquias de todos los demás santos, pero ninguna iglesia o santuario se ha atrevido jamás a reclamar una reliquia de la Madre de Dios. Esto era cierto incluso antes de que se definiera la doctrina de la Asunción. Podemos estar bastante seguros de que habría una gran competencia para poseer esas reliquias, ¡si existieran!

Meditar la Asunción de María debe darnos una gran esperanza. Sabemos que una mujer que comparte nuestra humanidad está en el cielo, en cuerpo y alma, orando por nosotros. También sabemos que nuestro bautismo nos ha limpiado de la culpa del pecado original, de modo que cuando morimos, no debemos temer al pecado, que es el aguijón de la muerte. Si aprendemos a "morir cada día" en palabras de San Pablo, encontraremos la muerte como cristianos cuando el Señor nos llame a su lado. Esa es una gracia por la que debemos orar diariamente, como nos enseña el "Ave María": "ruega por nosotros ahora y en la hora de nuestra muerte". Los invito a asistir a Misa este lunes 15 de agosto, en honor a la Asunción de nuestra Madre al cielo. ¡Es un gran día!
