




Questions of the Week September 11, 2022

Questions for Children: Have you ever found something that was lost? How did you tell the story about your big find?

Questions for Youth: Have you ever watched a brother or sister or a friend get something that you would like to have? How did you turn your feelings into holiness?

Question for Adults: Can you talk about a time when you reconciled with God the father or the father of your family?





This weekend marks the 21st year since the terrorist attacks on September 11th, 2001. We're about a month past the 1-year anniversary of our military's withdrawal from Afghanistan and the disastrous events that swiftly followed. These events resonate with profound significance for all of us as Americans. They also carry meaning - and some duties, I believe - for us as Catholics.

Of course, this weekend is a good occasion to recall the debt of gratitude we owe to the servicemen of our military. No matter what our opinions are about the way the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq were begun, waged, and ended, the soldiers who fought them represented us as a nation. For bearing that burden on our behalf, we owe our nation's servicemen heartfelt thanks. As Catholics, we can begin to repay that debt by praying for our nation's warriors - the living and especially the fallen.

Our Catholic faith is of universal scope, so we should also remember that Christians of Afghanistan and Iraq suffered very deeply over the last two decades. Only a very few persecuted Christians live in Afghanistan, but Iraq has long been home to the Chaldean Catholic Church, a Church with its own hierarchy and liturgy in full communion with us Roman Catholics. The Christians of Iraq were decimated by the sectarian violence throughout our occupation, and suffered even more during the mayhem caused by ISIS that followed. Let's remember these persecuted Christians in our prayers as well. Despite their distance from us, we share a deep bond with them through our union in the Body of the Lord. Their steadfastness in suffering has borne witness to the truth that genuine peace is found in Christ alone.

4. No one had earned a place at that Supper. All had been invited. Or better said: all had been drawn there by the burning desire that Jesus had to eat that Passover with them. He knows that he is the Lamb of that Passover meal; he knows that he is the Passover. This is the absolute newness, the absolute originality of that Supper, the only truly new thing in history, which renders that Supper unique and for this reason “the Last Supper,” unrepeatable. Nonetheless, his infinite desire to re-establish that communion with us that was and remains his original design, will not be satisfied until every man and woman, from every tribe, tongue, people and nation (Revelation 5:9), shall have eaten his Body and drunk his Blood. And for this reason that same Supper will be made present in the celebration of the Eucharist until he returns again.

5. The world still does not know it, but everyone is invited to the supper of the wedding of the Lamb (Revelation 19:9). To be admitted to the feast all that is required is the wedding garment of faith which comes from the hearing of his Word (see Romans 10:17). The Church tailors such a garment to fit each one with the whiteness of a garment bathed in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7:14). We must not allow ourselves even a moment of rest, knowing that still not everyone has received an invitation to the Supper or knowing that others have forgotten it or have got lost along the way in the twists and turns of human living. This is what I spoke of when I said, “I dream of a ‘missionary option’, that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church’s customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today’s world rather than for her self-preservation.” (“The Joy of the Gospel,” n. 27). I want this so that all can be seated at the Supper of the sacrifice of the Lamb and live from Him.



5. El mundo todavía no lo sabe, pero todos están invitados al banquete de bodas del Cordero (Ap 19,9). Lo único que se necesita para acceder es el vestido nupcial de la fe que viene por medio de la escucha de su Palabra (cfr. Rom 10,17): la Iglesia lo confecciona a medida, con la blancura de una vestidura lavada en la Sangre del Cordero (cfr. Ap 7,14). No debemos tener ni un momento de descanso, sabiendo que no todos han recibido aún la invitación a la Cena, o que otros la han olvidado o perdido en los tortuosos caminos de la vida de los hombres. Por eso, he dicho que "sueño con una opción misionera capaz de transformarlo todo, para que las costumbres, los estilos, los horarios, el lenguaje y toda estructura eclesial se convierta en un cauce adecuado para la evangelización del mundo actual más que para la autopreservación" (Evangelii gaudium, n. 27): para que todos pueden sentarse a la Cena del sacrificio del Cordero y vivir de Él.

El Rincón del Vicario

Este fin de semana es el aniversario 21 desde los ataques terroristas del 11 de septiembre de 2001. Hace aproximadamente un mes que pasó el primer aniversario de la retirada de nuestras fuerzas armadas de Afganistán y los desastrosos acontecimientos que siguieron rápidamente. Estos eventos resuenan con un profundo significado para todos nosotros como estadounidenses. También tienen significado, y algunos deberes, para nosotros como católicos.

Por supuesto, este fin de semana es una buena ocasión para recordar la deuda de gratitud que tenemos con los militares de nuestras fuerzas armadas. Independientemente de nuestras opiniones sobre la forma en que iniciaron, libraron y terminaron las guerras en Afganistán e Irak, los soldados que las combatieron nos representaron como nación. Por llevar esa carga en nuestro nombre, debemos nuestro más sincero agradecimiento a los militares de nuestra nación. Como católicos, podemos comenzar a pagar esa deuda orando por los guerreros de nuestra nación: los vivos y especialmente los caídos.

Nuestra fe católica es de alcance universal, por lo que también debemos recordar que los cristianos de Afganistán e Irak sufrieron muy profundamente durante las últimas dos décadas. Solo unos pocos cristianos perseguidos viven en Afganistán, pero Irak ha sido durante mucho tiempo el hogar de la Iglesia Católica Caldea, una Iglesia con su propia jerarquía y liturgia en plena comunión con nosotros, los católicos romanos. Los cristianos de Irak fueron diezmados por la violencia sectaria a lo largo de nuestra ocupación, y sufrieron aún más durante el caos causado por ISIS que siguió. Recordemos también a estos cristianos perseguidos en nuestras oraciones. A pesar de la distancia entre nosotros, compartimos un vínculo profundo con ellos a través de nuestra unión en el Cuerpo del Señor. Su perseverancia en el sufrimiento ha dado testimonio de la verdad de que la paz genuina se encuentra solo en Cristo.
