



Vicars's Corner



The 2nd of February, Thursday this week, is the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It commemorates when Mary and Joseph brought the Lord to the temple in Jerusalem 40 days after his birth. The 40th day marked the conclusion of a woman's ritual purification after she had given birth, and the time when the firstborn was to be redeemed from God.

When the Holy Family makes their way into the temple, they meet some unexpected worshippers of Jesus, Simeon and Anna, prophet and prophetess. And although Joseph and Mary offer the customary offering, there's no mention of Jesus' redemption. Instead, he was presented. Although he goes home with the family, Jesus wasn't redeemed from God, but rather presented to him to be fully his, like a sacrificial offering.

Interestingly, our baptism bears some resemblance to the Presentation. In baptism, each of us has died and risen again with Christ (see Romans chapter 6) having been made part of his body. We're thus wholly God's. There's no part of us that still belongs to ourselves. Our whole lives have been given to God already - we must live up to that reality by putting the Lord and His love before every merely human preoccupation.

This feast has long been called "Candlemas." Back in the day, candles were blessed on this day, because the Lord was proclaimed by Simeon to be the "light of revelation to the nations." Though we're technically no longer in the Christmas season, this is the last of the Christmas feasts in the calendar - starting with Christmas and its octave, through Epiphany, up to the Presentation, the Church celebrates the revelation of the Light of the nations, Jesus Christ.

El 2 de febrero, jueves de esta semana, es la fiesta de la Presentación del Señor. Conmemora cuando María y José llevaron al Señor al templo de Jerusalén 40 días después de su nacimiento. El día 40 marcaba la conclusión del ritual de purificación de una mujer después de haber dado a luz, y el momento en que el primogénito debía ser redimido de Dios.

Cuando la Sagrada Familia entra al templo, se encuentran con algunos adoradores inesperados de Jesús, Simeón y Ana, profeta y profetisa. Y aunque José y María ofrecen la ofrenda habitual, no se menciona la redención de Jesús. En cambio, fue presentado. Aunque va a casa con la familia, Jesús no fue redimido de Dios, sino que se le presentó para ser completamente suyo, como una ofrenda de sacrificio.

Curiosamente, nuestro bautismo tiene cierta semejanza con la Presentación. En el bautismo, cada uno de nosotros ha muerto y resucitado con Cristo (ver Romanos capítulo 6) habiendo sido hechos parte de su cuerpo. Por lo tanto, somos enteramente de Dios. No hay ninguna parte de nosotros que todavía nos pertenezca a nosotros mismos. Toda nuestra vida ya ha sido entregada a Dios; debemos vivir a la altura de esa realidad poniendo al Señor y su amor por delante de toda preocupación meramente humana.

Esta fiesta ha sido llamada durante mucho tiempo "Candelaria". En el pasado, las velas se bendecían en este día, porque Simeón proclamó que el Señor era la "luz de revelación para las naciones". Aunque técnicamente ya no estamos en la temporada navideña, esta es la última de las fiestas navideñas en el calendario: comenzando con la Navidad y su octava, pasando por la Epifanía, hasta la Presentación, la Iglesia celebra la revelación de la Luz de las naciones; Jesucristo.

The need for a serious and vital liturgical formation

43. The Liturgy gives glory to God not because we can add something to the beauty of the inaccessible light within which God dwells (see First Timothy 6:16). Nor can we add to the perfection of the angelic song which resounds eternally through the heavenly places. The Liturgy gives glory to God because it allows us—here, on earth—to see God in the celebration of the mysteries, and in seeing Him to draw life from his Passover. We who were dead through our sins and have been made alive again with Christ—we are the glory of God. By grace we have been saved (Ephesians 2:5). Irenaeus, the *doctor unitatis*, reminds us of this: “The glory of God is man alive, and the life of man consists in seeing God: if the revelation of God through creation already gives life to all living beings on earth, how much more then.



45. Entonces, la pregunta que nos hacemos es ¿cómo volver a ser capaces de símbolos? ¿Cómo volver a saber leerlos para vivirlos? Sabemos muy bien que la celebración de los sacramentos es – por la gracia de Dios – eficaz en sí misma (*ex opere operato*), pero esto no garantiza una plena implicación de las personas sin un modo adecuado de situarse frente al lenguaje de la celebración. La lectura simbólica no es una cuestión de conocimiento mental, de adquisición de conceptos, sino una experiencia vital.

46. Ante todo, debemos recuperar la confianza en la creación. Con esto quiero decir que las cosas –con las cuales “se hacen” los sacramentos– vienen de Dios, están orientadas a Él y han sido asumidas por Él, especialmente con la encarnación, para que pudieran convertirse en instrumentos de salvación, vehículos del Espíritu, canales de gracia. Aquí se advierte la distancia, tanto de la visión materialista, como espiritualista. Si las cosas creadas son parte irrenunciable de la acción sacramental que lleva a cabo nuestra salvación, debemos situarnos ante ellas con una mirada nueva, no superficial, respetuosa, agradecida. Desde el principio, contienen la semilla de la gracia santificante de los sacramentos.
