## Vicar's Corner

**Fr. Edward Hoffmann**

October is the month of the Rosary. It's probably the best-loved Catholic devotion, and for good reason. However, many don't pray the rosary because they don't know how to do it well or think it's just idle repetition.

I like G. K. Chesterton's maxim "anything worth doing is worth doing poorly." That's where we should start. Better to pray the rosary poorly than not pray it at all. Oftentimes I say the rosary while driving or going for a run. I'll admit it's far from perfect prayer. But it's better than an idle mind!

Many people have their favorite hack for praying the rosary well. Here's mine: halfway through the "Hail Mary" pause and think of something to say about the Lord Jesus relevant to the mystery that you're meditating on. Say that scripture verse in your head, and then go on with the Hail Mary. For example, when praying the first sorrowful mystery, one could pray: "Hail Mary... blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus, *who sweat blood in His agony*. Holy Mary ...etc." The next Hail Mary could include: "...blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus, *who said, not my will, but yours be done*. Holy Mary..." And so on. Praying the Rosary this way slows you down and forces you to recall the events of the mysteries. If you're praying the rosary in a group, just add the phrase in the middle mentally. Others think of people to pray for, and offer every decade, or even every Hail Mary, for a different person or intention. There's no wrong way to pray the rosary if we give it our best to honor our Lord and our Lady.

For further reading, I highly recommend *The Rosary of our Lady by Romano Guardini*, *Praying the Rosary Like Never Before* by Edward Sri, and "On the Most Holy Rosary" by St. John Paul II. ■

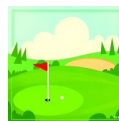

### "Mass Moments"

#### Consubstantial and Incarnate

The Nicene Creed proclaims our belief in the Trinity. Among its points is that Jesus is consubstantial and incarnate. Neither of these words is common in our vocabulary, but their appearance in the Creed shows how difficult it is for us humans to explain the mystery of God.

"Consubstantial" basically means "one in being," but the word is more technical. It proclaims our belief that there is only one God, though the Godhead is manifest in more than one way. God has one nature, but three persons. Jesus existed with the Father before all ages—before he entered the world in time and place on the first Christmas Day in Bethlehem. He already existed, and he was always truly God—consubstantial with the Father.

This belief entered the Creed after the Council of Nicaea in the fourth century because of a heresy spread by a man named Arius. He believed that Jesus had a beginning in time, and hence he could not share the same Godhead as the Father. This opinion did not fit with the evidence in the New Testament, so the early Church condemned the thought of Arius and clarified mainstream Christian belief by proclaiming that Jesus had always shared the same nature with the Father—that he was consubstantial with the Father—before and after he was born.

We also believe that Jesus became "incarnate." The word incarnate, refers "to the divine mystery of the taking of human nature by the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity," Jesus (Smolarski, A Glossary of Liturgical Terms, 72). He was actually born, though he lost nothing of the Godhead by doing so. If you had seen Jesus in the first century, you would have seen God in flesh and bone.

These two difficult words proclaim two sides of our belief. Jesus is God, and Jesus is human—he is consubstantial and incarnate.

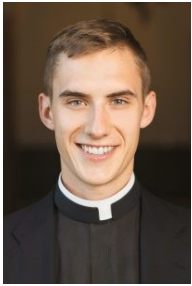

## La Esquina del Vicario

P. Edward Hoffmann

Octubre es el mes del Rosario.

Probablemente sea la devoción católica más querida, y con razón. Sin embargo, muchos no rezan el rosario porque no saben hacerlo bien o piensan que es una

mera repetición.

Me gusta la máxima de G. K. Chesterton: "cualquier cosa que valga la pena hacer vale la pena hacerlo mal". Ahí es donde deberíamos empezar. Es mejor rezar mal el rosario que no rezarlo en absoluto. A menudo rezo el rosario mientras conduzco o salgo a correr. Admito que está lejos de ser una oración perfecta. ¡Pero es mejor que una mente ociosa!

Mucha gente tiene su truco favorito para rezar bien el rosario. Aquí está el mío: a mitad de la pausa del "Ave María" y piensa en algo que decir sobre el Señor Jesús que sea relevante para el misterio en el que estás meditando. Di ese versículo de las Escrituras en tu cabeza y luego continúa con el Ave María. Por ejemplo, al rezar el primer misterio doloroso se podría rezar: "Ave María... bendito es el fruto de tu vientre Jesús, que sudas sangre en su agonía. Santa María... etc." El próximo Ave María podría incluir: "...bendito el fruto de tu vientre Jesús, que dijo: no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya. Santa María..." Y así sucesivamente. Rezar el Rosario de esta manera te frena y te obliga a recordar los acontecimientos de los misterios. Si estás rezando el rosario en grupo, simplemente agrega mentalmente la frase en el medio. Otros piensan en personas por las que orar y ofrecer cada década, o incluso cada Ave María, por una persona o intención diferente. No hay una manera incorrecta de rezar el rosario si hacemos lo mejor que podemos para honrar a nuestro Señor y a nuestra Señora.

Para lecturas adicionales, recomiendo ampliamente El Rosario de Nuestra Señora de Romano Guardini, Orar el Rosario como nunca antes de Edward Sri y "Sobre el Santísimo Rosario" de San Juan Pablo II. ■
